



Any person who is the sole head of a family, or-any male over 18 years old may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The appricant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or SubAgency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least \$0 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother states.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his apmestead.

Price \$3.00 per acre. Dutles.—Must reside its months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (induding the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

PUBLIC CHARITIES

To the Town Council of the Town of Campbellton:-

Gentlemen:—During the past year the Public Charities Committee have been kept busy, having had to handle work which they had not the slightest ide, they would ever have to undertake. The public having got it into their heads that consumption is a terrifily contagious disease, it was almost impossible to find homes in which to place two out of the three cases they had to look after; one of these was turned out of place after place, until when neither he nor the Commissioner could get anyone to take him in the only thing left for him to do was to live in a barn. By chance a place was found for him for two weeks, after which he was taken in by Mrs. Coffin, where he is at present. One consumptive died and the third is being helped to the amount of \$3.00 per week.

A suggestion was made to open the old school house in Ward Three as a temporary place in which to house these and other unfortunates, but, objections having been made by some of the people in that district, the project was abandoned, and the Commissioner and the Chairman of the Committee ordered to look for a piece of land on which a Poorhouse could be built. After looking over every site that they had any idea of, they recommended the purchase of a piece containing about six acres from Mr. A. F. Chamberlin, price \$1000, and located on the Tobique road. This piece of land, being alongside a road that is always open, and near the town water pipe, the Council decided to purchase.

The liquor business is accountable for a great deal of the poverty, crime, trouble and misery of our. town. One of its victims, an Englishman, having got drunk, fell down a stair, and so injured himself that he lost all control of his body. He was sent for some days to the hospital, but we had to take him from there; the parties who took charge of him, on finding him such a nuisance, refused to keep him. Mrs. Coffin then took charge of him at \$9.00 a week, and there he was well cared for until it was decided that it would cost the town much less in the long run to ship him to his home in England. This was recommended to the Council, who authorized the Committee to ship him as soon as possible. The last we heard of this man was that he was safely on board the S. S. Grampian at Quebec.

Mr. Angus McKenzie, the Commissioner appointed at the start of the year, a very faithful and efficient officer, owing to severe illness, had to give up the work, his place being filled by Mr. W. H. Marquis, who, though not acquainted with the work, takes great interest in it, and is now filling the position in a faithful and satisfactory manner.

One of the great nuisances with which your committee has to contend is the bringing to town of cripples and paupers by the I. C. R. Some of them come in on regular tickets, and others steal a ride to get in. In some cases we had to buy tickets and send these persons to some other town along the line; in others our energetic Chief of Police would take them back to the I. C. R. station and let the officials there do as they pleased with them. The Chairman of this Committee has repeatedly told the I. C. R. officials that Campbellton would not be responsible, in any way, for the care and transportation of such a class, as it was not a dumping ground for Canada's cripples and lunatics, and our jail is not an asylum in which to place such persons.

Now that the town has about secured a suitable lot of land, a Poorhouse should be built as soon as possible. It will save the town money; it will give the Charities Committee of the future a place in which they may promptly place the needy; and such a place should be arranged so the consumptive poor could be well cared for, and not have to be placed in homes where they would be liable to communicate this dread-disease to others.

WILL BUILD ALMS HOUSE.

ELECTRIC LIGHT

To the Town Council of the Town of Campbellton. Gentlemen :- I beg leave to submit the following synoptical report of the operation of the Electric Light Department, for the fiscal year ending March 31st. 1909.

During the year the commercial and street lighting circuits were extended as follows: 600 feet on Ritchie St., 400 feet on Pleasant St., 700 feet on Adams St. 300 feet on Albert St. The primary circuit was also extended 800 feet on Sugar Loaf St. These extensions required 8 poles, 1600 feet of primary wiring and 4000 feet of secondary wiring.

Ten 100-light transformers were purchased. These were put in service as follows: 4 to replace those of the air type which had burned out, 2 on new line extensions and 4 spare.

One new arc lamp was placed on Ritchie St. and one at the junction of Prince William St. and King Also one 32 candle power incandescent lamp on McMillan Avenue. There are now 47 are lamps and 9 incandescent lamps on the street lighting service.

Twenty-five new meters were purchased and installed in service, and fifteen which have been in service the full period of five years allowed by law were reverified. Twenty-five new services were added during the year, making upwards of 475 separate services now installed in town to date.

We find that our generators are becoming taxed to their full capacity during the winter months. The load has increased to within 10 per cent, of the rated capacity of both generators. We think it is advisable o look forward to an increase in capacity at an early date, for with our present rate of increase two years will have scarcely elapsed before the full capacity will have been reached.

About 1400 tons of coal were purchased during the year. There is now on hand for current conmption 500 tons of coal, 500 pounds of line wire 100 pounds of guy wire, 200 glass insulators, 50 cross-arms, 4 100-light transformers and 15 meters.

In conclusion, we have every reason to believe that the electric light system is giving general satisfaction. The jitmost precautions are exercised to prevent any interruption of the service to the conumers. Very few accidents have occurred during the year to the machinery and transmission apparatus Respectfully submitted,

CONCRETE SIDEWALKS-In pursuance of the policy previously laid down by this department, considerable concrete sidewalk was built last year, in addition to the general street improvements. The walk on the south side of Water. Street was extended 575 feet westward from the corner of Prince William Street to the Post Office. In addition to this about 180 feet of sidewalk in front of John Cameron's residence was rebuilt in order to preserve the proper grade as agreed upon between Mr. Cameron and a former committee of the Council. The concrete work this year was done at a cost of 21 cents per square foot, as against 29 cents in 1906 and 22 and 24 1-2

NEW DEAL SIDEWALK-In addition to a large amount of general repairs to sidewalks, about 1858 feet of new deal sidewalk was laid, 1122 feet on the north side of Water Street and 736 feet on Rose-




