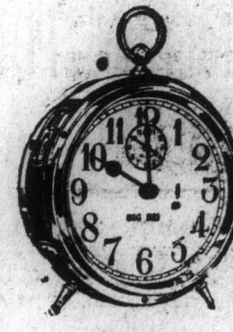

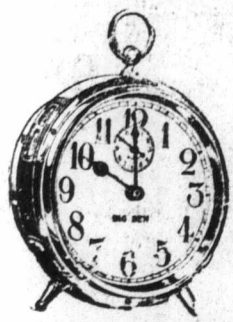

## BLOOD TRANSFUSED BY SMALL SYRINGE

New Method of Performing  
Operation at Philadelphia  
Appears Successful.

PHILADELPHIA July 26—Physicians believe that the life of Mrs. Rose Roehnd, 23 years of age, has been saved by a transfusion operation performed yesterday, when six ounces of her young husband's blood were transferred to her depleted veins.

The operation was performed by a new method. Instead of the veins of the recipient and giver of the blood being lanced directly by the tube, the blood was transfused by means of a new invented syringe. This method is said to obviate the possibility of blood clots or air bubbles during the operation, and has the advantage of measuring the exact amount of blood taken from the donor.
