C A P. XLI.

An Act for the further Support and Encouragement of the Fisheries carried on in the Greenland Seas and Davis's Streights.

hereas the sitheries carried on Preamble, in the Greenland Seas and Davis's Streights have been raised, by the Bounties and Encouragements ale ready given, to a very flourishing Condition: And whereas the said Bounties will cease and expire on

the Twenty-lifth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-sit, and it will be proper further to encourage and support the said Fisheries, by granting, to Ships employed therein, such other Bounties as the present State of the Publick Revenue may justify, and the Bature and Condition of the said Fisheries appear now to require: Be it therefore enasted by the King's most Excellent Wajesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Autho-

from Dec. 25, 2786, British Ships going on the Whale Fishery must be visited by an Officer of the Customs, who shall certify the Admeasurement, etc. to the Commillioners.

And be it further enacted by the Authority afore: General Issue. said, That if any Action or Suit wall be commenced against any Person or Persons sor any Thing done in pursuance of this At, the Defendant or Defendants in fuch Action of Suit, map plead the General Juue, and give this Ad, and the special Watter, in Evidence at any Trial to be had thereupon, and that the same was done in pursuance of, and by Authority of this Act: And if it hall appear so to have been done, then the Jury hall find for the Defendant or Defendants; and if the Plaintiff hall be nonsuited, or discontinue his Asion after the Defendant or Defendants Chall have anyeared, or if Judgement

Judgement thall be given upon any Uerdict of Demurrer against the Plaintist, the Defendant of Defendants shall treble Costs. and may recover Treble Costs, and have the like Remedy for the same as Defendants have in other Cases by Law.
