The Quadrangular Conference, the general assembly of the Methodist Episcopal Church, opened at 10 o'clock yesterday morning, through the Bond and Church-Street entrance to the grand edifice a stream of dignified gentlemen proceeded. These were the delegates to the annual conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Canada, which now performs its annual session in the Metropolitan Church in Toronto.

The beautiful square in which the Metropolitan Church is situated was an unimpaired appearance as early as 10 o'clock yesterday morning. Through the Bond and Church-Street entrance to the grand edifice a stream of dignified gentlemen proceeded. These were the delegates to the annual conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Canada, which now performs its annual session in the Metropolitan Church in Toronto.

Rev. Dr. Carman of Belleville, General Superintendent of the Conference, was the presiding chair, ready to begin business when 222 of the 286 eligible delegates had arrived. The delegates were exchanged between laymen and clergymen. Many of them were delegates that had met three years ago this very month at Belleville, when the first General Conference assembled after the amalgamation of the general Methodist churches into one solid, cohesive body. But as there were many there who had never met before, and these gradually and systematically became acquainted with each other, beside Superintendent Carman and Rev. Dr. John A. Williams, who had on Dec. 18, 1884, been appointed by the General Conference Special Committee to succeed the lamented Rev. Dr. Samuel Dwight Rice, when the Belleville Conference had chosen as its next president.

Rev. Dr. Rice did not live long after the high distinction which his church had placed upon his shoulders.

Rev. J. C. Maffitt of the Dominion-square Methodist Church, Montreal, secretary of the last conference, sat on the right side of Dr. Carman.

The bright, sparkling eye of the presiding officer was calmly leveled over the delegates. The proceedings were opened with the reading of the 104th Psalm and announcing the year.
