

COUNCIL CHAMBER,

Tuesday, January 3, 1832.

In pursuance of the aforegoing Proclamation, His Majesty's Council met:

The Hon. Chief Justice Jarvis, President;
The Honorables { George Wright,
T. H. Haviland,
The Attorney General.

Chamber, and being seated, the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod received His Excellency's commands to desire the immediate attendance of the House of Assembly, in the Council Chamber:

The House of Assembly having attended accordingly—His Excellency

was pleased to open the Session with the following Speech:—

Mr. President, and Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council; Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly;

You have been convened in General Assembly at a period somewhat earlier than has been usual, in order that the administration of Justice in the Supreme Court of Judicature at the time fixed by Law may not interrupt your Session, to your own inconvenience, and the public detriment.

As the Representative of a Sovereign whose every thought is directed to the welfare of his people, and whose beneficence is too shining to fail in being an example to all his Subjects, however remote, it becomes alike my duty and my inclination to proffer to you, at this the earliest opportunity, the sincere assurances of my unaffected desire to promote, in all its branches, the prosperity of this fertile Island, and, if possible, the individual happiness of every Member of the community.

Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly;

The Accounts of the past year shall be laid before you without delay.

In the execution of the portion of public duty, that, according to the Constitution under which it is our high privilege to live, devolves exclusively on you, due provision has hitherto been made for the good order and respectability of Government. The wisdom which has dictated this course, will, I doubt not, still continue to influence your deliberations; thus, gradually, but surely, attracting an influx of capital to your shores, by affording, under Providence, security to the progress of industry, and to the accumulation of its fruits.

Mr. President, and Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council;

Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly;

Conscious that without your co-operation, any exertions of mine cannot but be imperfect, I frankly claim from you an unreserved communication on such subjects as to your local experience may seem useful to the Public Service—and believe me, Gentlemen, this confidence shall on my part be reciprocal:

Enter then on your Legislative functions—With concord and disinterested unity of purpose, provide for the public good, and draw down on yourselves and on your fellow Colonists, the blessings that have ever attended labours so directed.

The Speech being ended, His Excellency was pleased to retire, and the House of Assembly having withdrawn, the President reported His Excellency's Speech, which being read by the Clerk—

Resolved, that an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, to return His Excellency the thanks of this House for his Speech delivered this day:

Ordered, that the Honorables Thomas Heath Haviland and the Attorney General be appointed a Committee to prepare a draught, pursuant to the

above Resolution.

On motion, ordered, that the Honorables Ambrose Lane and T. H. Haviland be appointed a Committee to revise the Journal of this House each day.

On motion, ordered, that the Honorables George Wright and the Attorney General be appointed a Committee to examine into and report upon such

Laws as are near expiring.

On motion, ordered, that the Rev. L. C. Jenkins be appointed Chaplain, and that he be requested to attend His Majesty's Council to-morrow, at one o'clock, and each succeeding day during the Session, for the purpose of read-

ing Pravers.

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor requiring the personal attendance of J. P. Collins, Esq. the Clerk of the Council—Mr. John Ogle Nantes was appointed to act as Clerk, and having taken the Oath of Allegiance and also the Oath of Office, took his seat accordingly.

The humble Address of His Majesty's Council:

May it please your Excellency,

We His Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Members of His Majesty's Council, in our Legislative capacity convened, beg leave to thank your Excellency for your Speech at the opening of the present Session.

The motives which have actuated your Excellency in convoking the General Assembly thus early in the season, bear testimony to the interest which you take in the Public Welfare, and at the same time manifest your anxious desire to consult individual convenience, when not incompatible with public advantage.

In no portion of His Majesty's widely extended dominions, are the blessings enjoyed under His mild and paternal Government more fully appreciated, than by the Inhabitants of this distant Colony; and the appointment of your Excellency, whose services have already obtained for you marked and honourable distinction, to fill the important situation of His Majesty's Representative, proves the anxious solicitude which he continues to evince for the welfare of his people.

We feel grateful to your Excellency for the lively interest which you are pleased to express in the prosperity of this fertile Island, as it affords a happy presage of the advan-

tages which we may confidently anticipate from your Excellency's Administration.

It will at all times afford us the highest gratification, freely to communicate with your Excellency upon every subject, which we may deem advantageous to the public service; and in promoting that mutual confidence so ingenuously proffered by your Excellency, it will be our earnest endeavour to render your administration prosperous and happy.

In entering upon our Legislative duties, your Excellency may rest assured that our exertions shall be exclusively directed to those objects which have for their tendency the real welfare of the Colony;—and we have reason to hope, that our efforts, aided by the cordial cooperation of the other Branch of the Legislature will not fail to be productive of public good.

Presented to Colonel JOHN READY, late Lieutenant Governor of Prince Edward Island, in North America, by the Inhabitants of the Colony, as a mark of the high sense which they entertain of his eminent public services, whilst in the administration of the Government, the important duties of which he ably, impartially, and zealously fulfilled, from the 21st day of October, 1824, to the 27th day of September, 1831, a period of nearly seven years, with no less honour to himself, than advantage to the people.

And that they had transmitted the same to the Colony Agent, with Instructions to consult the opinion and wishes of Colonel Ready, on the nature and description of the Plate to be presented.

The Lieutenant Governor lays before His Majesty's Council, the Copy of a Despatch from the Right Honorable Viscount Goderich, transmitting an Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the 22d November, 1830; confirming a Bill passed by the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in the Month of March, 1829—intituled "An Act to "regulate the laying out and altering of the Highways, and to provide a mode of obtaining compensation for those who may thereby be injured, and to cause those who are benefited thereby, to contribute towards their formation."

Which was read by the Clerk, and is as follows, viz:

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

We your Majesty's most faithful subjects the Council and Assembly of Prince Edward Island, in Colonial Parliament convened, humbly approach the Throne with sentiments of loyalty and affection to your Majesty's Royal person and Government. Fully sensible of the paternal solicitude with which your Majesty continues to watch over the welfare of all your subjects, however distant their residence may be from the seat of your Majesty's Government, we humbly presume to address your Majesty upon a subject which deeply involves the growing prosperity of this infant Colony.

Various Laws enacted by the Legislature of this Colony, tending to promote its internal improvement, and to afford the means of meeting the exigencies of the Colonial Government, have from time to time been transmitted through your Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State for the Colonies, to be submitted for your Majesty's Royal pleasure thereon; but from causes over which your Majesty's faithful subjects here have no controul, the benefits which they were calculated to confer have been hitherto with held from the Inhabitants of this Colony.

Cases have occurred, and with great and respectful submission we represent them, where Bills of Supply have been granted for the support of this your Majesty's Colonial Government, and duly forwarded for your Majesty's approval, which have been allowed to remain for the space of two and three years without your Majesty's pleasure thereon having been signified, during which time the Colony has been debarred from appropriating those supplies so necessary to its present and future welfare.

The following Acts, which passed the Legislature of this Colony during the Sessions of 1829 and 1830, and which were reserved for the expression of your Majesty's Royal pleasure, were duly transmitted for that purpose, viz.—

- "An Act to enable Tenants in Tail to execute Leases, and grant terms of years of a long endurance:"
- "An Act for the security of Navigation, and for preserving all Ships, Vessels, and Goods, which may be found on Shore, wrecked or stranded, upon the Coasts of this Island, and for punishing Persons who shall steal Shipwrecked Goods, and for the Relief of Persons suffering loss thereby:"
 - " An Act to confirm certain Marriages heretofore solemnized in this Island:"
- "An Act to require Clergymen, and others authorised to solemnize Marriages, to return Certificates thereof to the Surrogate of the Island, and to require Clergymen to keep a Record of Baptisms:"
- "An Act to alter, amend and suspend certain parts of an Act made and passed in the Forty-seventh year of his late Majesty's reign, intituled An Act to repeal an Act made and passed in the Forty-first year of his present Majesty's reign, intituled An Act for the better Regulation of Elections, and to regulate Elections for Members to serve in General Assembly in future:"
- "An Act to ascertain and establish the Boundary Lines of the several Counties and Townships of this Island—and to regulate the Duty of Surveyors:"
- "An Act for raising a Fund, by an Assessment on Land, for erecting a Government House, and other Public Buildings within this Island:"
- —and notwithstanding the reiterated applications of our Colony Agent at the Colonial Office, we lament to state, that no official information has as yet been received regarding them.

These Acts are for the most part of the greatest importance to the well being of the Colony, particularly the Act to ascertain and establish the Boundary Lines of the several Counties and Townships of this Island, and to regulate the Duty of Surveyors:—the Act to alter, amend and sus-

pend certain parts of an Act made and passed in the Forty-seventh year of his late Majesty's reign, intituled an Act to repeal an Act made and passed in the Forty-first year of his present Majesty's reign, intituled An Act for the better Regulation of Elections, and to regulate Elections for Members to serve in General Assembly in future:—the Act for raising a Fund, by an Assessment on Land, for erecting a Government House, and other Public Buildings within this Island—and the serious inconveniences which have already been experienced from the uncertainty that prevails concerning them, have proved extremely prejudicial to the public welfare.

In anticipation of the Revenue expected to be derived from the Assessment on Land, and to meet the present emergency of the Colony, a Paper Currency has been unavoidably resorted to; and unless means be speedily adopted to enable the Colonial Government to redeem that issue, the most serious embarrassment may be dreaded.

We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to give such directions as may cause the said Acts to be brought under your Royal consideration, in order that, should they meet your Majesty's approval, your faithful subjects the Inhabitants of this Colony, may not be longer deprived of the advantages which the operation of these Acts were intended to afford them.

Your Majesty, in your Royal beneficence, as expressed in a Despatch from the Right Honorable Lord Goderich, one of your Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State for the Colonies, bearing date 7th July last, having, as we conceive, conceded to your faithful subjects of Lower Canada "the exclusive enactment of every Law which may be required respecting real property within that Province," we, therefore presume, humbly to hope, that the same gracious boon may be extended to this Colony; and that your Majesty will be pleased to authorize your Representative to assent, in your Majesty's name, without the intervention of a suspending clause, to such Bills as shall in future pass the Legislature of this Colony, having for their object its internal improvement, whether the said Bills may affect real or personal estate within the same.

XXVI. An Act to provide for the conveyance of the Mails between Charlotte-Town and Pictou,

by a Steam Vessel.

XXVII. An Act for Appropriating certain Monies therein mentioned, for the service of the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty-two.

XXVIII. An Act to provide for the Contingent Expences of the present Session.

His Excellency was then pleased to close the Session with the following Speech, viz:

Mr. President, and Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council: Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly:

As you have now brought to a close the business of the present Session, it only remains for me, before relieving you from further attendance, to express my fervent hope, that in the accomplishment of your measures for the advancement of the Public Good, you may reap your own most honorable reward.

Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly:

I thank you for the Supplies which you have voted for the service of the current yearto their due appropriation my best exertions shall be devoted.

You have been already apprized, by Message, of my reasons for refusing to accept the temporary vote contained in your Appropriation Bill; and as this refusal proceeds from a sense of what I still conceive to be my duty, it can scarcely be necessary for me to repeat, that I will not avail myself of a pecuniary allowance, unless made permanent during my administration.

Mr. President, and Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council:

Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly:

However inconsiderable is at present your Commerce, you have the pleasing satisfaction of reflecting, that its sources flow from the inexhaustible bounty of nature-unlike the manufactured products of human art, they are independent of caprice or taste, and can be shared only by the few whose soil is equally fertile with your own.

To maintain so enviable a position, and to prepare betimes for profiting by that increase of numbers which usually ensues from natural or adventitious causes, where the means of subsistence are abundant, it must be obvious to you, Gentlemen, that your services should be extended beyond the performance of your official duty, by inducing among those over whom your influence may prevail, the practice of moral and industrious habits, which will fit our population for those agricultural pursuits, to the encouragement of which your attention was so judiciously directed by my Predecessor.

The President of His Majesty's Council by command of His Excellency, then said-

"Gentlemen,
