



inabilities, so that the Ophir Company has nothing to do but to stamp out the gold, market the gold bricks and the concentrates and pay dividends.

The mill of 20 stamps, with room for more, is a model plant, equipped with the best machinery, largely automatic, and stamps from 40 to 50 tons per day. There are thousands of tons of rock upon the dumps, and no difficulty is anticipated in keeping the mill continuously at work throughout the winter, while in the spring it is proposed to add an electric plant for running drills and pumps and lighting the premises. The engine was unit by Doty of this city, 80 horse, I think, with two boilers for 100 h.p. and the whole plant, when set to work, ran like a clock, without so much as a single hot box from the rock-breaker to the last of the concentrators, a surprising result due to the perfection of the whole construction, especially to the solidity of the foundations. In the World Now Heing Worked Near Bruce Mines, Algoma-The Ophir Mine—A Canadian Mias.

Editor World: I had the pleasure, a forthight ago, to be at the Ophir mine, when the stamp mill was set to work, and I have been asked by a friend in this city to give you a short account of the place and the enterprise.

The vein, which is some 30 feet in width, and is fairly well proved for a depth of 200 feet and a length of 350, is situated 16 miles inland from the Bruce mines, on the north shore of Lake Huron. 


