Heavy Work on the Canadian Pacific.

Mr. Edward G. Tilton, Chief Engineer and General Superintendent of the Canadian Pacific Railway, when in Portland, Oregon, in the forepart of May, gave to the Oregon some interesting facts relative to the progress and prospects of that road.

The work from Emory to Thompson's River, a distance of sixty miles, is probably the most difficult and expensive on the North American Continent.

Fraser River is bordered with steep and rugged mountains of solid granite, from 6,000 to 8,000 feet high.

At the eastern approach to tunnel No. 7, for over 100 feet the bluff is galloped, and overhangs the roadway.
