THE MAJESTY'S QUICK TRIP. New York, June 4.—The White Star steamer *Majesty* completed its round trip to this port to-day in 6 days, 4 hours, 8 minutes. This beats by five minutes the best record ever made by any steamer on the route, and is much better than the *Titanic's* best run here. The *Majesty* sailed right through the heart of the iceberg region, and last night passed 18 bergs, some of which were very large and picturesque. She went at half-speed, and a part of the day moving because of fog. Her best day's run was 242 miles.
