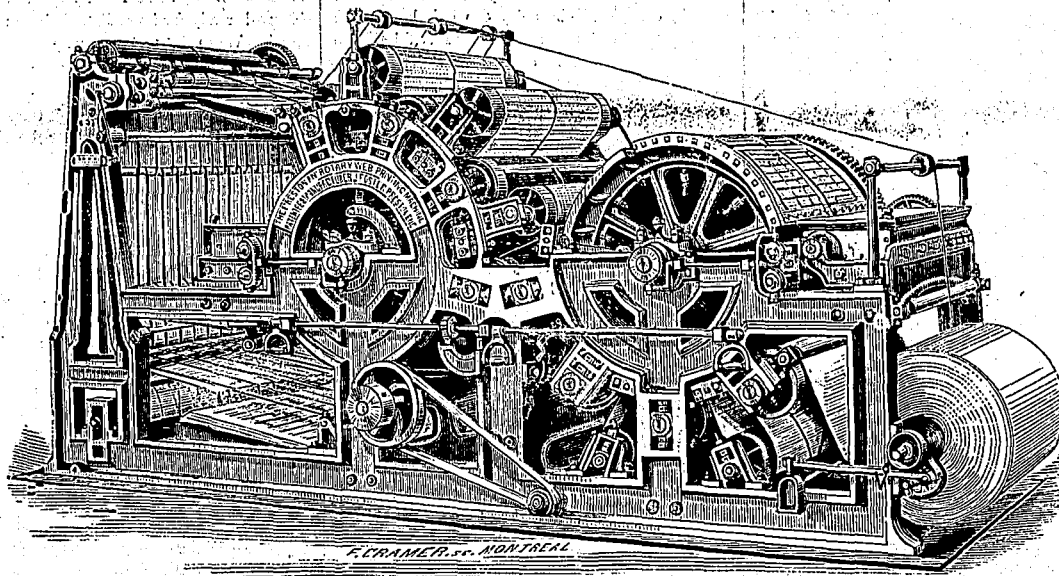

The Prestonian Web Printing and Perfecting Press.



ONE of these celebrated Printing Presses has recently been set up in the office of the Montreal "STAR." It is a massive and compact machine, seventeen tons in weight—18 feet long, 6 feet wide and 8 feet high; the movements are all on the rotary principle, and the type beds present a curved surface; this system is universally allowed to be the only means of printing rapidly, and was first successfully used in the Hoe Rotary Press, which, however, employed a number of lads as feeders or deliverers of the sheets, and only allowed of the printing off one side at a time.

The Web Perfecting Machine principle was since developed, and of this the most successful employment is found in the Prestonian, which, among other merits, has that of being the only Web Press capable of printing from moveable types as well as from stereotypes. The appearance in action of the machine may not easily be explained without the aid of diagrams; but we submit the following particulars of the *modus operandi*. The most prominent features of the machine are two large cylinders supported horizontally by strong bearings and a massive framework. Curved on the exterior of these cylinders are the type forms of the four pages of matter composing the STAR—two on each—held in position by screws and other apparatus familiar to the trade, the type bed of each page forming a section of the cylinder, technically termed a "turtle." In contact with the first type cylinder and immediately below it is the

first impression cylinder, clad with thin blanketing, with the roll of paper to be printed fixed in close proximity. The almost endless sheet of paper, extending $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles in length, is carried round this impression cylinder, and as the machine rotates, the type, standing a little higher than the rest of the cylinder, imparts its first impression here. The sheet then passes round an adjacent cylinder called a carrier cylinder, and returns to the second impression cylinder, and is printed a second time on that part of the sheet immediately preceding the first impression. The same process follows with the third and fourth cylinders. It will thus be seen that in one revolution of the first type cylinder four impressions of one long, continuous sheet have been produced, and so long as this cylinder revolved an undivided length of paper printed on one side only would be produced; but it will at once occur to the reader that the same mechanical arrangement of cylinder and type that produced a succession of impressions on one side of the paper, will be capable of doing it on the other. The sheet is now conducted to the second type cylinder, where, revolving over a succession of impression cylinders and carrier cylinders, identical with the arrangements already described in the first half of the machine, each page is "backed" with the one necessary to its completion, and an endless stream of newspapers in one unbroken length is evolved. The ink necessary for the work is contained in two ducts, one at each end of the machine, is distributed upon the smooth surface of

those parts of the type cylinders not occupied by the "forms," and is imparted to the type by a couple of rollers inserted between each impression cylinder. Thus far, we have only seen the paper printed; but it remains still to be cut into separate sheets, and piled on to the receiving table. For the separating process, the sheet is carried by means of tapes from the last impression cylinder through several small cylinders to the larger ones, in one of which is a perforating knife, which separates the paper across the entire breadth. Passing them through another series of tapes, the newspaper is delivered. To those initiated in trade mysteries it will not be necessary to say that no one "flyer" could deliver papers printed with the rapidity achieved by this machine; but an ingenious arrangement has been perfected by which the flyer lays down two sheets with one stroke, thereby gaining time for its return and the interval necessary for the preceding sheets to rush beneath it. An indicator being attached to the perforating cylinder, an accurate record of the number of papers printed is preserved during the entire period the machine is in motion, the indicator registering in single numbers up to 99,999.

This machine is produced by the celebrated establishment of JOSEPH FOSTER, Esq., Preston, England, and is the first of the kind on this continent.

We are prepared to take orders for the Prestonian, and have no doubt every newspaper of extensive circulation will find it to its advantage to purchase one.

Friendly Criticism.

In a former number we had occasion to notice the systematic misrepresentation practised towards us by the members of a certain type-dealing concern in Toronto. We had hoped that this sort of thing would in time die out, but we are repeatedly told by printers that the young person who does the out-door work of the concern still makes it a speciality in his peregrinations to introduce the name of our Company, coupled with injurious mis-statements not only regarding our type, but our business position. Active and honorable competition is good, and business men must always be prepared for it; but the limit of fairness appears to have been long lost sight of by our assailants.

This door to door slander has now been succeeded by an attack in print, which to us is a good full-page advertisement. A kind of patent inside publication, got up in Philadelphia, but headed "Toronto, April 1st, 1875," devotes nearly a page to our notice.

It is gratifying that native industry should attract attention so soon. We have only been in business some two years and a half, but our success has been such as to make our critic adopt a very trenchant style. He tries to hit hard. Such phrases as "impudent pretenders," "bogus," "worthless wares," and "tricksters," abound; but the printers of Ontario, who are most likely to be acquainted with the representatives of M. & R., the courtesy of the senior and the veracity of both senior and junior, will agree that we are more honored than hurt by such attacks. One thing, however, appears certain—the success of native Type Manufacture is being felt.

A word now about "Scotch Faces." What our friends say on this subject in the hermaphrodite *brochure* just mentioned, shows the extent of their knowledge of the business. Firstly, we say that our faces are not "feeble and worthless imitations" of those vended by Palmer & Co. Excellent faces of Scotch cut were cast in the old Montreal Type Foundry before our friends had a habitation and a name in Toronto, and may possibly so continue after Toronto is no longer honored with their presence. After speaking of us as "impudent tricksters," &c., (for care has been taken to show that these epithets are directed against us), they go on to say that "just as the coiner impresses upon his base metal the image and superscription borne by the genuine gold," we have "dubbed our worthless wares" Scotch Faces. The merest beginner in a printing office would tell our friends that the term "Scotch Face" refers not

to any local circumstance of manufacture, but to the particular style or cut of the letter. We are willing to admit, and are proud of it, that our type is British American in its make, and this it is which has roused the indignation of Messrs. Palmer & Co.; but as regards cut and design, our numerous series of Scotch faces in News and Book letter are fully equal to theirs in any respect, and hitherto have not needed the ill-judged abuse of other makers to find a sale.

The Johnson Type-Foundry.

We beg to inform our customers and printers generally that the statement contained in the "Trade Circular" to the effect that the Job and Fancy Fonts issued by the Johnson Foundry can only be obtained from the agents of Miller & Richard is false. We repeat the notice that we can and have supplied constantly, since the commencement of our business, the type of Mackellar, Smiths & Jordan, and that we can do so just as promptly as any dealer in Canada. We can afford to smile at the wretched insinuations about diminishing the size of fonts, &c., and to those who best know our Toronto friends, a simple denial of such a fraud will be sufficient. Hundreds of printers in the Dominion can testify that we are in the habit of supplying them with the Johnson type, perfect in every respect as it leaves their foundry, and at the list price.

The trick referred to could suggest itself only to such minds as those of "Her Majesty's Type-Pecklers for Canada."

"Emolli Mores."

The only article not directed against us in the "Trade Circular" already referred to, is extracted from an essay by Sir John Herschel. It contains some remarks upon "good breeding," and the way in which "men have conducted themselves in their intercourse with one another," ending prettily with a Latin verse. We take the liberty of commending the extract to the study of Palmer & Son.

Government Printing.

As some guide to the magnitude and importance of the Parliamentary Printing for the last Session, it may be interesting to know that we supplied during the Winter and Spring no less than 33,200 pounds, or over 10½ tons, of new type to the Government Printers—Messrs. MacLean, Roger & Co., Ottawa. 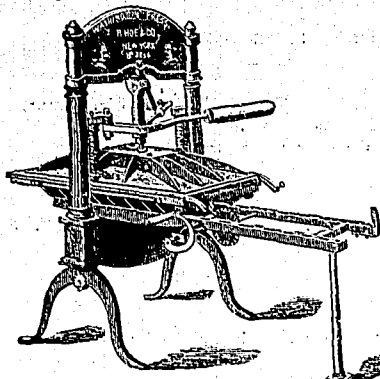
