

JOHN MOLSON, Esquire, whom it had pleased His Royal Highest The DUKE of SUSSEX, our most Worshipful Grand Master, to appoint to the Chair of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Montreal and William-Heary, vacated by the death of R. W. the Honorable William McGillivray.

The patent under the hand of the M. W. Grand Master, and Seal of the United Grand Lodge, appointing R. W. JOHN MOLSON, P. G. M. for the District of Montreal and William-Henry, dated the 15th day of May, 1826, was then read.

The R. W. The Provincial Grand Master for Quebec and Three-Rivers, then retired to the Iustalistion Chamber, where R. W. Br. JOHN MOLSON was afterwards introduced by Past D. P. G. M. The Rev. John Bethune. He was then duly Iostalied Provincial Grand Master for the District of Montreal and William-Henry.

The exemony being ended, the R. W. Provincial Grand Masters and Brethren returned into the body of the Lodge, and the newly Installed P. G. M., being seated on the Throne, was preclaimed and saluted according to ancient custom.

The R. W. Br. Denechau delivered an address to the newly Installed Provincial Grand Master, who was afterwards pleased to return his sincere thanks to the R. W. Prov. G. Master and Brethren from Quebec, for their kind and frand translattendance at his Installation.
