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
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
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The Form of Confecrating a Church.

The Bifhop is to be received at the west door, or at some other part of the Church, or Churchyard, which is most convenient for his entrance, by some of the principal inhabitants.

At the place where the Bifhop is received, a petition is to be delivered to him by fome one of the perfons who receive him, praying that he will confecrate the Church.

The Retition is to be read by the Secretary.

The Bifbop, his Chaplains, the Preacher, and the Minifler who is to read Divine Service, together with the reft of the Clergy, if any other be prefent, enter the Church, and repair to the Vestry, where, as many as are to officiate put on their several habits; during which time, the Parishioners are to repair to their seats, and the middle ile is to be kept clear.

As foon as the Church is quiet, the Bifhop and his Chaplains, with the Preacher and the Minister who is to officiate, and the rest of the Clergy, if any other be present, return to the west door, and go up the middle ile to the Communion Table, repeating the 24th Pfalm alternately, as they go up, the Bifhop one werfe, and they another.

PSALM XXIV.

1. THE earth is the Lord's, and all that therein is: the compass of the world, and they that dwell therein.

2. For he hath founded it upon the feas: and prepared it upon the floods.

3. Who shall ascend into the hill of the Lord, or who shall rife up in his hely place?

4. Even he that hath clean hands, and a pure heart: and that hath not lift up his mind unto vanity, nor fworn to deceive his neighbour.

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5. He RED RE 74 (2)

6. This is the generation of them that feek him : even of them that feek thy face, O Jacob.

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7. Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlafting doors: and the King of Glory shall come in.

8. Who is the King of Glory? it is the Lord, ftrong and mighty, even the Lord mighty in battle.

9. Lift up your heads, O ye gates; and be ye lift up, ye everlafting doors: and the King of Glory shall come in.

10. Who is the King of Glory? even the Lord of Hofts; he is the King of Glory:

The Bifbop and his Chaplains go within the rails; the Bifbop to the north fide of the Communion Table, and the Chaplains to the fouth fide: The minifter officiating goes to the reading desk, and the Preacher to fome convenient feat near the Pulpit:

The Bifbop, fitting in his chair, is to have the inftrument or inftruments of donation and endowment prefented to him by the founder, or fime proper fubfitute; which he lays upon the Communion Table, and then ftanding up, and turning to the congregation, Jays:

DEARLY beloved in the Lord; forafmuch as devout and holy men, as well under the Law as under the Gospel, moved either by the fecret infpiration of the bleffed fpirit, or by the express command of God, or by their own reafon and fenfe of the natural decency of things, have erected houses for the publick worfhip of God, and feparated them from all profane and common uses, in order to fill men's minds with greater reverence for his Glorious Majesty, and affect their hearts with more devotion and humility in his fervice; which pious works have been approved and graciously accepted by our Heavenly Father: Let us not doubt but he will also favourably approve our godly purpose, of fetting apart this place in folemn manner, to the performance of the feveral offices of religious worfhip, and let us faithfully and devoutly beg his bleffing on this our undertaking.

Then the Bishop kneeling, fays the following prayer.

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ETERNAL God, mighty in power, and of majefty incomprehenfible, whom the heaven of heavens cannot contain, much lefs the walls of temples made with hands, and who yet haft been graciously pleafed to promife thy efpecial prefence in whatever place even two or three of thy faithful fervants shall affemble in thy name, to offer up their praifes and fupplications unto thee; vouchfafe, O Lord, to be prefent with us, who are here gathered together, with all humility and readinefs of heart, to confectate this place to the honour of thy great name; feparating it from henceforth from all unhallowed, ordinary, and common ufes, and dedicating it to thy fervice, for reading thy holy word, for celebrating thy holy facraments, for offering to thy Glorious Majesty the facrifices of prayer and thanksgiving, for bleffing thy people in thy name, and for the performance of all other holy ordinances: Accept, O Lord, this fervice at our hands, and blefs it with fuch fuccefs, as may tend most to thy glory, and the furtherance of our happiness both temporal and spiritual, thro' Jesus Christ our bleffed Lord and Saviour. Amen.

After this, let the Biflop fland up, and turning his face toward the Congregation, fay :

REGARD, O Lord, the fupplications of thy fervants; and grant, that whofoever fhall be dedicated to thee in this houfe by baptilm, may be fanctified with the holy ghoft, delivered from thy wrath and eternal death, and received as a living member of Chrift's church, and may ever remain in the number of thy faithful and elect children. Amen.

Grant, O Lord, that they who at this place fhall in their own perfons renew the promifes and vows made by their furcties for them at their baptifm, and thereupon fhall be confirmed by the Bifhop, may receive fuch a meafure of thy holy fpirit, that they may be enabled faithfully to fulfil the fame, and grow in grace unto their lives end. Amen.

Grant, O Lord, that whofoever shall receive in this place the bleffed facrament of the body and blood of Christ, may come to that holy ordi(4)

Grant, O Lord, that by thy holy word which shall be read and preached in this place, and by thy holy spirit, grassing it inwardly in the heart, the hearers thereof may both perceive and know what things they ought to do, and may have power and strength to fulfil the fame. Amen.

Grant, O Lord, that whofoever shall be joined together in this place in the holy estate of matrimony, may faithfully perform and keep the vow and covenant betwixt them made, and may remain in perfect love together unto their lives end. Ainen.

Grant, we befeech thee, bleffed Lord, that whofoever shall draw near unto thee in this place, to give thee thanks for the benefits which they have received at thy hands, to fet forth thy most worthy praife, to confess their fins unto thee, and to ask such things as are requisite and necessary, as well for the body as the foul; may do it with such stedfastness of faith, and with such feriousness, affection and devotion of mind, that thou mayest accept their bounden duty and fervice, and vouchfase to give whatever in thy infinite wildom thou shalt fee to be most expedient for them: All which we beg for Jesus Christ his fake, our bleffed Lord and Saviour. Amen.

Then the featence of confectation is to be read by the Official, and figned by the Biflop, and by him ordered to be registered, and then laid upon the Communion Table.

After this, the perfon appointed is to read the Service for the Day; except where it is otherwife directed.

Proper Pfalms, 84, 122.

First Lesson, 1 Kings 8. from v. 22. incl. to v. 62. Second Lesson, Hebr. 10. from v. 19. incl. to v. 26.

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After the Collect for the Day the Minister who reads the Service Steps till the Bishop bath faid the following Prayer.

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Moft Bleffed Saviour, who by thy gracious prefence at the feaft of dedication, didit approve and honour fuch Religious Services, as this which we are now performing unto thee, be prefent at this time with us alfo by thy holy fpirit and becaufe holinefs becometh thine house for ever, fanctify us we pray thee, that we may be living temples, holy and acceptable unto thee; and fo dwell in our hearts by faith, and poffels our fouls by thy grace, that nothing which defileth may enter into us; but that being cleanfed from all carnal and corrupt affections, we may ever be devoutly given to ferve thee in all good works, who art Our Saviour, Lord, and God, bleffed for evermore. Amen.

Then the Minifler proceeds in the Service of the Day, to the end of the General Thank fgiving, after which, the Biflop fays the following Prayer.

BLESSED be thy Name, O Lord God, that it hath pleafed thee by thy good fpirit, to difpofe our Gracious Sovereign, to fupply the fpiritual wants of thy people, by appointing this Church to be erected and endowed for thy worfhip and fervice; multiply thy bleffings upon him, for his pious regard to thy honour, and to the good of fouls; remember him concerning this, and wipe not out the kindnefs he has fhewed to thy Church, and to the offices thereof; and grant that he may fee and long enjoy the fruits of his godly zeal, in the edification of the Members of our Church, and in the reduction of those, in the spirit of meekness, who diffent from it; that we may all live together in the unity of the spirit, and in the bond of peace, thro' Jefus Chrift Our Lord. Amen

Then the Minister who officiates, is to go on the Prayer of St. Chryfoltom, and the Grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Then a Pfalm is to be fung, viz. 26. 6, 7, 8. with Gloria Patri.

Communion Service.

The Bifhop, flanding on the north fide of the Communion Table, as before, reads the Communion Service.

After the Collect for the King, he fays the following Prayer.

Moft glorious Lord God, we acknowledge that we are not worthy to offer unto thee any thing belonging to us; yet we befeech thee, in thy great goodnefs gracioufly to accept the dedication of this place to thy fervice, and to profper this our undertaking: Receive the prayers and interceflions of us, and all other thy fervants, who either now or hereafter entering into this houfe, fhall call upon thee; and give both them and us grace to prepare our hearts to ferve thee with reverence and godly fear: Affect us with an awful apprehenfion of thy Divine Majefty, and a deep fenfe of our own unworthynefs; that fo, approaching thy fanctuary with lowlinefs and devotion, and coming before thee with clean thoughts and pure hearts, with bodies undefiled, and minds fanctified, we may always perform a fervice acceptable to thee, thro' Jefus Chrift our Lord. Amen.

The two Chaplains are to read, one the Epifle, and the other the Gofpel.

The Epistle; 2 Cor. 6. 14. incl. to v. 17. The Gospel, Joh. 2. v. 13. to v. 18. incl.

Then the Bifhop reads the Nicene Creed. After which, a Pfalm is fung, viz. Pf. 100.

The Sermon.

The Sermon being ended, and all who do not receive the Holy Communian retired, and the doors shut; the Bishop proceeds in the Communion Service; and he and the Clergy having made their oblations, the Churchwardens collect the offerings of the rest of the Congregation.

After the Communion, and immediately before the final bleffing, the Bifhop fays the following Prayer.

BLESSED be thy name, O Lord God, for that it pleafeth thee to have thy habitation among the fons of men, and to dwell in the midft of the affembly of the faints upon earth; blefs, we befeech thee, the religious performance of this day: And grant that in this place, now fet apart to thy fervice, thy holy name may be worfhipped in truth and purity to all generations, thro' Jefus Chrift Our Lord. Amen.

The peace of God, which paffeth all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of his Son Jefus Christ Our Lord: and the bleffing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be amongst you, and remain with you always. Amen.
