MAY EXHUME WOMAN'S BODY.

Martha Collins, Who Took Paris Green, Was Christian Scientist.

Woodstock, Nov. 8 .- It is highly probable that the remains of Martha Cross Collins, who died a week ago at her home in East Zorra, just north of the city, as the result of a dose of paris green, alleged to have been self-admin-istered, will be exhumed and an inquest held.

Detective Greer of Toronto is in the city to-day. At the time of the alleged suicide two of the Collins family were said to have Christian Scientist tenden-

cles, one being the dead woman and the other a married sister, who lives somewhere in the western states. En-quiries were made at the time for the purpose of ascertaining whether other members of the family entertained a similar belief. A brother of the decased said emphatically that there was
