VALIDITY OF ANGLICAN ORDERS.

An Interesting Series of Arguments by Rev. Prof. Clark of Trinity College.

St. Margaret's Church on Spadina avenue was filled to overflowing Sunday to hear the Rev. Prof. Clark of Trinity College deliver a sermon on the "Validity of Anglican Orders." Taking the words "and how shall they preach except they be sent" Romans 10 and 15, the Rev. Prof. said that at the Vatican Council held at Rome in 1870 when the question of union was discussed the Bishop of Rome attacked the validity of the Anglican orders. It did not matter whether the Church of Rome would confirm their orders or not. The special apostolic commission herself to this Church unless she concurred in the validity of the Anglican orders.

Below Pope Leo XIII. denounced the Church as invalid many Roman Catholic bishops in the validity of Anglican orders. The Rev. Prof. said that the Bishop of Rome attacked the validity of the Anglican orders. It did not matter whether the Church of Rome would confirm their orders or not. The special apostolic commission herself to this Church unless she concurred in the validity of the Anglican orders.

The first argument, a wholly historical argument is out of place, as the Pope does not refer to it and so does not put it in issue. The Rev. Prof. said that the story emanating from Nenni to the effect that some Anglican ministers and placing a Bible on Parker's head proclaimed the validity of his consecration by historical facts of a most trustworthy nature from both Catholics and Protestants alike.

The second point is of more importance and is the basis of the great deal of argument. Barlow, it is claimed by the Catholic side, did the consecration at the time himself, and so any act of the time done by him would have no force of validity as a minister of the Church. The Rev. Prof. said that the literature on the matter is very confused but there is no evidence to be considered with some care. He was a Bishop under Henry VIII. He was a member of the House of Lords and took his seat regularly. This is proof that he was a minister of the Church and that he was a properly ordained priest.

Barlow was not the only consecrator. He was assisted by four other bishops. The Rev. Prof. said that the literature on the matter is very confused but there is no evidence to be considered with some care. He was a Bishop under Henry VIII. He was a member of the House of Lords and took his seat regularly. This is proof that he was a minister of the Church and that he was a properly ordained priest.

The fourth point involves considerable difficulty. It is always hard to state any intention in an act of consecration. In this case the intention was not of one person as is the case with the Roman Church, but of the Church as a whole. The Rev. Prof. said that the literature on the matter is very confused but there is no evidence to be considered with some care. He was a Bishop under Henry VIII. He was a member of the House of Lords and took his seat regularly. This is proof that he was a minister of the Church and that he was a properly ordained priest.

On concluding Professor Clark said that the Church rested its power on the fact of Christ and not on any human institution. He said that the Church is a society of civil and religious liberty, which liberty is extended to Catholic and Protestant alike.

A sensible suggestion. Editor World: Noting your paragraph in today's World to the effect that Mr. Leopold Meyer was on a special visit to ascertain prospects of mining in Canada as a profitable investment on behalf of a wealthy Belgian syndicate, and that it was his intention to purchase this inquiry in British Columbia and the Northwest, it is somewhat mortifying to see our own Province of Ontario apparently given the go-by in such an expedition as he contemplates.

Last Saturday Mrs. Clemens took a Yonge-street car to do some shopping. Woman-like, she carried her purse in her hand, and on getting out, left it on the seat behind her. Conductor McKenna, coming into the car at the moment saw a woman pick it up, but she did it in a manner that she was not to be suspected. As the fair claimant had no idea where the purse contained and became confused when questioned, the conductor took possession. The woman left the car angrily. On the car's return, she boarded it and at once proved ownership of the purse. It contained \$80.00 out of which several bills were pressed upon Conductor McKenna as a thank offering for his services.

The First Shed Turned. Before sunrise yesterday, while the pretty hamlet of York Mills was wrapped in a soft mist and moonlight, the splendid shed on the hill above was turned over to prepare the way for the rails that the Metropolitan Company hope by Nov. 20 to have laid down between the present terminus of the line and Richmond Hill, some nine miles northward. Early in the day a gang of 75 men were at work and by night had surfaced for three-quarters of a mile. Instead of laying the line on the west side of the road, as is the case south of York Mills, the northern portion will be laid on the east side. She was between the top of York Mills hill and the present terminus will be taken up later on.

Rev. Dr. Robertson Goes Abroad. Rev. Dr. Robertson, Superintendent of Missions of the Presbyterian Church of Manitoba and the Northwest, leaves this week for Great Britain, where he will spend the next six months in the interest of Canadian home missions of the Presbyterian Church. A large number of congregations, as well as warmly friendly throughout the country warmly interested in the Canadian field, are already prepared to give their support, and it is hoped that as a result of Dr. Robertson's visit many more congregations will become interested in the work.

Seventeen Hindoes Drowned. Colonel Cayton, of the British Steamer Telford, Captain Lemerle, on Sept. 17, for Bombay, founded at sea on Sept. 17. Seventeen of her crew and passengers, all natives of India, were drowned. The remainder of the passengers were rescued and arrived here. The Telford was a steel screw steamer of 1408 gross tonnage, 234 feet long, with 22 feet depth. She was built at Whitehaven in 1884, and owned by Halse Casson Joseph of Bombay.

Her Cargo on Fire. New York, Oct. 26.—The British steamer Worsley Hill, Captain Cameron, put in on Oct. 26. She was bound from New York to Havre, and left the former port Oct. 18. An attempt will be made at once to get out the fire.

EAST TORONTO.

Charles Leamen Hurt—The Wealthy Tramps Pay Their Fines and Leave—Methodist Church Anniversary.

Chris. Leamen, an employe of the G. T.R. yard at York Station, had the two first fingers of his right hand badly lacerated while coupling cars near the roundhouse on Sunday night. Leamen is one of the first riders of the R.C.C. Club. He was a prize in the R.Q.T. race and was in the winning team for the Dunlop trophy at London.

Martin Brockington, his brother Arnold and Thomas Hutton, the three wealthy tramps who were sent down for ten days by Magistrate Ormerod for begging in the village, got out again a few hours after their incarceration. When behind the bars the three found enough in their pockets to pay Martin's fine of \$4. As soon as he got outside he drew the \$400 he had lying in the bank, and returning liberated the other two. The balance of \$388 Martin said he was going to invest in the Ontario gold mine.

Hope Methodist Church celebrated an anniversary services on Sunday and last night in the heartiest of manners. Revs. G. F. Swinburn and E. C. Swinburn conducted the Sunday services. Last night's program was marked by the famous sermon of Rev. G. O. Johnston on "Influences." Choice music was rendered by E. Choler and solos were given by Miss Westlake and Messrs. S. Faircloth and A. Costain. The service was a most successful one.

The work of enlarging the yard at York Station by putting in another siding has been completed. The yard is now one of the largest in Ontario, and daily accommodates engines from Stratford, London, Niagara Falls and Hamilton, etc. On Sunday there were 39 in active work in the yard and 25 in the roundhouse out for business.

SCARE AT THE FALLS. Over the Reported Disappearance of Four Young Men—An Incendiary Fire—Belonging to the Convention.

Niagara Falls, Ont., Oct. 26.—(Special).—The entire vicinity of the great cataract was in an excited state all last evening and a part of this morning. Yesterday afternoon a rumor became current on the American side of the river that four young men who had gone out shooting that morning above the Falls had failed to return and this rumor finally circulated in the Canadian side. Following closely upon this came the startling report that some one had seen the bodies of the four young men in the river. The rumor was immediately given up as a baseless one. The young men were supposed to have taken the fatal shot, turned up at their respective homes late last night, but this was not generally known until this morning.

About 42000000 the old Elgin House, at the foot of Bridge-street, now occupied by the Niagara Falls Park and River Railway as head offices, was destroyed by fire on Sunday. The fire was immediately given and the fire extinguished before much damage had been done. The cause of the fire is unknown, and was doubtless incendiary. Loss fully covered by insurance.
