He did not despair of their favourable termination, but if the proposals of the British Government should be rejected, and no proposals were made by the Government, to lay on the table all the communications between the two Governments. He still hoped that an amicable and equitable adjustment of the claims of the two countries might be mide. He must, however, express his deep regret that, while the negotiations were still pending, the new President of the United States should, contrary to all usage, have referred to other contingencies than a friendly termination of them.
