The day laborer who sells his labor at cost must be paid cash. The commission merchant doing business on 2-1-2 per cent, sells only for cash. In the dry goods business, Cotton goods, on which the profits are reduced to a minimum, must be paid for by the merchant in 30 days; and yet that same merchant is willing and anxious to charge goods for six months. Doesn't it look as if he made it up on other lines; and don't you think the profit on dry goods could be smaller if the time was shortened.
