Great Forest Fire in Nova Scotia.

Halifax, July 29.—A forest fire in Ingonish Bay, St. Margarets Bay, has consumed 1,000 acres, and is approaching Indian River.

The fire is burning more furiously than ever. All attempts to check it have proved fruitless. Bands of men have been driven back to Indian River, and up to yesterday it is estimated that over \$70,000 worth of property has been destroyed.

Two large camps belonging to Mr. Beaudouin, who is in charge of the logging operations, have been destroyed. The fire swept down upon the second camp so rapidly that the men had very narrow escape. They had to run for their lives.

This forest fire is the largest that has occurred in Nova Scotia for fifty years. The burned belt reaches from Ingonish Bay to within a short distance of Indian River, and the fire is burning more furiously than ever.

All the season's cuttings have been destroyed, and it is estimated that the loss will be about \$100,000. Mr. Beaudouin, of Toronto, who will be the largest loser, has been telegraphed for by his foreman.
