



REPORTS

Read at the Eleventh Annual Meeting of the Parkdale
Presbyterian Church.

THE SESSION.

It is our privilege again to begin our Annual Report with an acknowledgment of the goodness of God, "His mercy faileth never." We rejoice in seeing so many attending the services at the Lord's House on the Lord's Day, and the large number attending the Sunday School and Bible Class for instruction in the Word. The Prayer Meeting, although not so largely attended as it might be, is increasing in size and, we trust, in power. Often has it been felt during the year that it was a "Blessed hour of prayer." We would especially express gratification at the interest shown by the young people in the Society for Christian Endeavour. We hope it will prove the birth-place of souls, as well as be a school for active service. It is with great satisfaction we learn that in the total amount contributed for the schemes of the church there is a substantial increase over that of any former year. We would urge all to consider their duty and privilege in being allowed to be co-labourers with Christ in redeeming the world.

Yet not withstanding all these encouraging things, when we consider what manner of creatures we ought to be, living as we do daily in the presence of death and eternity, we strongly feel the great need for a baptism of the Holy Ghost upon the church. In the presence of the masses that lie in the stupor of worldiness and death, the church is helpless in comparison with the power of Pentecostal times. MISSION FUND.

In presenting our report we are sorry to say that although the amount raised this year is in advance of last year, it is not at all in proportion to the increase of the congregation, the average per month being about \$56.36.

As many of the amounts are given somewhat irregularly, it is difficult to give an exact statement of the amounts given, but we may state that they range from 5 cents to \$5.00 per month, and lump sums from 25 cents to \$10.00 for the year. Whilst many do not contribute to the mission fund, too much cannot be said of the faithful giving of about 110 members of the congregation, and although we have fallen short of our estimate this year, we hope that all the members will contribute something hereafter and that the result for the next year will exceed our expectations.

A comparison of the reports for 1888 and 1889 will show a steady increase in numbers and receipts, and although the year was begun with many misgivings as to the payment of the large sum due for the library, yet it is with heartfelt gladness we report that debt wiped out, and over \$35.00 in our treasury. This has been made payable owing to a donation from the Ladies Aid Society of \$66.05, which we thankfully acknowledge.

But all this advancement is not what satisfies the longings of the heart. We want to see our scholars brought into the fold of Christ *now*. We do not wish them to wait until years have passed before acknowledging their loving Saviour. As an additional means to this end, a scholars' prayer meeting has been started on Sabbath afternoons, at which a large number have remained. In this work we earnestly desire that parents and teachers will co-operate in earnest prayer and effort that these whom the Lord has given into our charge may become His own children.

Personally, as I am now retiring from the membership of the congregation and connection with the school, I desire to record my gratitude for the earnest and hearty co-operation of teachers and officers, and I retire with grateful recollections of the sympathy and good-will so abundantly manifested in all.

PARKDALE AUXILIARY OF THE W. F. M. S.

In presenting this our Fourth Annual Report we desire to express our thanks to God for His goodness to us during the past year.

Meetings have been held monthly, with an average attendance of 20 members and 6 visitors. We have 48 members on the roll, being an increase of 15 over last year, and 16 are members of the General Society.

Two social entertainments were held for the purpose of raising money for the North-West Indian Clothing Fund, of which a larger quantity than usual was prepared, about \$60.00 being

expended in new material, and a quantity of old but useful clothing was sent in by friends; six comforters and a number of girls' aprons were made by the ladies.

The Girls' Class, under the leadership of Mrs. Swartout, contributed \$5.00 to purchase dolls, which were dressed and sent to Dr. Elizabeth Beatty of India.

In October we held our Second Annual Thanksgiving meeting, which was full of interest, and a time of blessing to all present; the offering amounted to \$23.55.

The total receipts this year are \$240.05, being an increase of \$57.75 over last year.

Death has this year removed one of our oldest members, Mrs. Dodd, whose kind and cheerful words often gave us encouragement when we were few in number.

In July the members presented a Dressing Case to Miss Morden, on the event of her marriage to Rev. Mr. McKenzie, of Montreal, and their departure to the mission field of Honan, China.

We would like to remind our members and friends, of those of our own congregation now in mission fields, viz.:—Mr. James Lawson of the China Inland Mission; Mrs. McKenzie, of Honan, China; and lastly Dr. and Mrs. Wanless, of Kolhapur, India, whose earnest and thrilling farewell words are still ringing in our ears.

Since love is the great motive for all mission work, may our prayer at this time be "More love to Thee, O Christ, more love to Thee," and may that love be expressed by personal consecration and self denying zeal, that this year may be one of spiritual blessing to all engaged in the work.

*Treasurer.***RUTH STREET MISSION.**

To the Moderator and Members of Session of Parkdale Presbyterian Church:—

As your Missionary, laboring for the past three months in the Ruth Street Mission, of which you have the oversight, I desire to submit the following brief report of the work carried on, with present results and prospects.

Services have been held regularly during these months, every Sabbath morning and evening. At the morning service there has been an attendance of about 38, at the evening an average of 98. An increasing interest is manifest in the morning service, chiefly among the young, due, we believe, in great part to the adoption of short sermons for children in connection with this service.

The Sabbath School and Bible Classes are well attended, and thoroughly equipped with earnest workers and teachers, Mr. Jas. E. Duff, the Superintendent, and his colleagues, are reaping now, in an effective Sabbath School, the reward of two years' of hard and often discouraging labor. The work is still carried on under many difficulties, owing to the lack of proper accessories for teaching, such as blackboards, maps, lesson helps, library, etc. As it has been found necessary hitherto, (and will yet be necessary) to devote the Sabbath School collections to church purposes, these could not be procured. Your missionary has no Bible Class in connection with the school, chiefly because there is no room in which to conduct it. The school-room is now full, and to make such a class successful would require a separate room. A good class could be obtained if it could be accommodated, but the people who worship in the mission do not feel able to enter upon enlargement.

The Wednesday evening prayer meeting has been held regularly, and has an average attendance of 30. Your missionary

thankfully records an earnest christian spirit prevailing these meetings, an increasing readiness to take part in the services, and a measure of realization of the Master's promise of quickened and strengthened life in connection with them. A selection of prayer-meeting topics, printed, and circulated among the people has been found most helpful in stimulating interest.

Early in November a "Willing Workers Band" was organized among the young girls of the mission under the care of Miss Wanless and Miss Kilgour. This Band meets every Tuesday evening, and after devotional exercises for a quarter of an hour spends an hour sewing, knitting, etc., for the poor, or invalids of the district.

A Woman's prayer meeting and circle was organized by your former missionary, Mr. McNab. It has been found a most helpful auxiliary. The meetings are held every Thursday afternoon at three o'clock in the mission building. The object has been to reach, interest, and benefit the mothers of the district having no church connection. The work has been found very difficult but the prospects are brightening.

On Friday evening Mr. J. E. Duff conducts a class for Bible Study, at which there is an average attendance of 15. This class has had a marked influence for good in connection with the work here.

The prospects for the mission are encouraging. The attendance and interest has been sufficient to arouse a desire for organization as a regular congregation. It has been felt that the work could be carried on more effectively, that some might be reached who could not be reached with the present standing as a mission, and that an increased responsibility would be felt, and an increased activity induced if organization were granted.

Acting also upon your counsel, the mission made application at the meeting of Presbytery, held on January 8th, 1890, to be organized. The prayer of the petition was granted, and as the neighboring sessions generously waived their right to be consulted, organization is to take effect during the present month.

Your missionary would desire to make special mention of the earnest labors of his predecessor, Mr. McNab, student in Knox College. Traces of his faithful work are everywhere manifest, and the seed he has sown is to-day bearing fruit, in the ingathering of many into the church.

The Sacrament of the Lord's supper was dispensed during the early part of the past summer. The work has progressed, and the desire is that the ordinance shall again be observed in

the month of February, as there are several from the Bible class and the Friday evening class who manifest a desire to unite with the church.

Your missionary would join with the workers here in thanking to God for His abundant blessing, and in prayer that the Holy Spirit may dwell in us, and rest upon us in richer measures, and that we may be kept faithful in the great work the Master has given us here.

First annual report of the Secretary of the Ladies Aid Society of the Parkdale Presbyterian Church.

In presenting this, the first annual report of the Ladies Aid Society, or the report for the last eleven months, as the society was only organized in February, 1889, we desire to express our thankfulness to God that he has brought us to the close of another year in our service to Him.

In addition to the regular monthly meetings which are held the last Tuesday of every month, we have held nine special meetings, making a total of twenty for the year.

Our Roll shows a membership of forty-five, with an average attendance of twenty.

We have had no special object for the disposal of our funds, but they have been distributed wherever the ladies thought most needful.

In connection with the society we have a Visiting or Tract Society composed of about twelve ladies, each member having a certain district allotted to her. The work is interesting and a large number of visits have been made.

During the year we have held a number of very successful church and parlor socials.

The total receipts for the eleven months are \$333.94.

Before closing the report we would take this opportunity of inviting all ladies of the congregation who have time at their disposal to join us in our work.

ABSTRACT OF MINUTES

The Eleventh Congregation Meeting of the Parkdale
Presbyterian Church.

JANUARY 22nd, 1890.

On motion of Mr. James Rankin, seconded by Mr. James Stewart, a resolution expressing the sympathy of the congregation with Mr. Mackay in the bereavement of his esteemed brother, the late Dr. Mackay, of Woodstock, was carried by a standing vote.

After the reception and adoption of Reports, it was moved by Mr. Winchester, seconded by Mr. Duff, that a vote of thanks be tendered the Managers for their faithful performance of the duties devolving upon them, and the clear financial statement presented by them. Carried.

On motion of Mr. Harris, seconded by Mr. J. C. Bell, a complimentary resolution to Mr. Swartout, the retiring Superintendent of the Sunday school was passed.

Messrs. Alex. McMillan and Robt. Forbes, were elected Auditors.

The following gentlemen were elected managers for the term of three years :—Messrs. John Inglis, W. C. Hewish, J. B. Harris, Jos. Norwich, and John Winchester.

Mr. Winchester was nominated against his will and declined to act.

The estimated Receipts and Expenditure for 1890 were then considered.

On motion they were received.

Moved by Mr. Harris, seconded by Mr. Inglis that they be adopted.

Moved in amendment by Mr. Winchester, seconded by Mr. Bell, that \$250 be added to the Pastor's stipend. Lost.

Moved in amendment by Mr. A. G. Gowanlock, seconded by Mr. Winchester, that the Caretaker's salary be increased to \$350, which was afterwards arranged at \$400, the caretaker agreeing to devote his whole time in looking after the church. Carried.

The estimates were then adopted as amended.

Moved by Mr. Harris, seconded by Mr. Winchester, that a bell be purchased, cost not to exceed \$400.

Moved in amendment by Mr. A. G. Gowanlock, seconded by Mr. T. Bryce, that no action be taken in purchasing a bell until next annual meeting.

The amendment was carried.

Moved by Mr. Inglis, seconded by Mr. Harris, that voluntaries be played by the organist, both before and after divine service, and that the secretary make known the wishes of the meeting to the session. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Inglis, seconded by Mr. Harris, that the secretary be authorized to have the proceedings of this Annual Meeting printed in pamphlet form, and a copy given to each family in connection with the church. Carried.

After devotional exercises the meeting adjourned.
