Brazil has free public schools, 500 newspapers and a flourishing commerce. In 1888 5379 miles of new rallway were constructed, the number of steam roads being twenty.

The foreign commerce of Brazil in the year ended June 30, '87, was about \$235,000,000, of which \$104,000,000 were imports and \$131,000,000 exports.

Coffee is Brazil's chief article of foreign sale. In that year Brazil sold the world \$94,000,000 worth. Next and in order came sugar, '8 millions; cotton, '71.2 millions: tobacco, rubber and hides, about 21.2 millions each, and mate tea nearly two millions. Most of these exports go to the United States and Great Britain.


