Our new academy is one of the fin-est school buildings of its class to be found in the province. It occupies a fine site on rising ground near the cen-tre of the town with ample grounds surrounding it for sports and recrea-tion purposes. It is built of brick with granite trimmings and contains three stories. The lower story or base-
