The American papers have been paying much attention of late to the supply of nickel at Sudbury on the Canadian Pacific le'y. Sudbury it will be remembered is the junction whence a branch rums to the Sanlt connection with the Minmenpolis and Duluth lines, and is claimed to be the centro of tho richest mining district in Canada. The American Navy Department has for some time past been employing the product of these mines in the manufacture of nickel-steel armour-plates for their new war vessels, which they are now buildiag at' $a$ rate that bius fair beforo many years to place the Enited States, in ruspeet of its Navy, on a footing with some of the leading mations of Europe.
Copper was discovered at Sudbury durintr the construction of the Canadiau Pac. ific R'y. A mumber of capitalists from Cleveland and Akron, in Ohio, beeame interested, and it was fomm on analysis that the nickel existed in unusually large quantities. Deretoiore the world's supply of nickel used principally in tho making of spoons, forks, coins, plated and other ware, had come from Pemsylvania, and from the mines in the French penal colony of New Caledonin. The New Caledonia niekel is lound in beds of serpentine, but the veins are shallow, and in miners' language not "persistent." The total product of nickel before the discovery at Sudbury did not mueh exceed 1,200 tons per anmum.
The ore is minod in Now Caledonin by primitive methods-eonvicts' labour being employed as well as mative Chinese labour -and is carried many wiles to the blast furnaces, which are fed with Australian coke and coal. The cost of transportation

alono is a leavy ltem, and the fuel is dear.
What is called " matte" is obtained in the smelting of the ore. Nickel matte bears the same relation to refined nickel that pig-iron bears to refiued iron "nd stecl. In 1882 the average price of nickel in the United States was $\$ 1$ per pound, and the total production in that country was somewhat less than 300,000 pounds per annum. The prico in England was somewhat less as the bulk of the supply came from New Caledouia, the mines of Which wore opened in 1876. The New Caledonia product, however, has been chiefly employed in tro large establishments in France. The development of the Sudbury deposits has reduced the price of nickel to about 50c a pound, and when appliances for treating matte have been introduced on a larger seale, refined nickel can probably be obtained for 25 c a pound, or even less.
The use of nickel as an alloy of. steel gives it great commercial importance. The matte is tougher and much more ductile and elastic than steel iteelf and does not rust mader water. English metallurgists employa it in the manufacture of gun barrels, but the real credit of bringiug out nickel-steel belongs to the Navy Depnrtment of the United States. The experiments made in the United States by Mr. Tracy, the Secretary of the Navy, go to show that a 101.2 inch plato of nickelstecl is superior to a 12 inch plate of ordinary armour steel.
The ackinley tariff admita nickel ore and matte free of duty into the United States, repealing the old duty of 15 c per pound. Nearly the sole products of the Sudhury miues have thus far gone to the United States for nrmour-plate purposes. Seven mines altogether have been opened, and others worked to a limited extent. Nickel bar ore has also been found near Ottara. Experts claim that the supply in the Sudburs country is practically inexhnustible. They spank of six or seren hundred millions of tons in sight, and predict that in a few years, twenty thouennd tons of nickel will be produced nanually in that locality, but it will depend on the disposition of the Dominion Govermment to comply with the requests of those who have largely. invested their enpitnl in the enterprise. :The Blizzard mine, and others owned and controlled by Montral capitalists, are now under the management of what is known as the

Shifts of all kinds are resorted to, of course, to give an air of responsibility and solidity, such terms as "financial company;" "gold syudicate," etc., being made use of. The private banking. house of James G. Shipley, Ailsa Craig ,Ont., nppenrs to have enjoyed a high repuitation, but we now have to record a suispension of payments with liabilities ranging between $\$ 40,000$ and $\$ 60$, 000. To enote partly from a newspaper in the loeality-th? bank was largely taken adrantrige of by stock dealers and speculative famers. The deposits were large, acconmodntion from Mr. Shipley in a variety of ways. The deposits were large, and ns every person acquainted with hri. loss arising through non-payment of either principal or interest. Any amount remaining orer-due duriug sixty days is paid over within three catendar urouthe from the time the holder of the deposit-rceeipt prosents his claim. It is a condition that he slath give notice of default withiu twenty-one days after the delay of sixty days has clapsed, otherwise the compañy will not be liable.
When we come to cunsider that owing to the energetic canvassing of Britigh hawers and others, the Australasian banks have secured between forty and fifis million pounds sterling of deposits, principally Scoteh moneys, remaining wr tums ranging from a few montis to five years, it is not to be wondered at that this new feature 'in underwriting shomd be largely a aniled of by British investors.
This underwriting nevertheless not only cuts into the companies but sometimes into the banks. This arises from the present paucity in number of such companics, and the absence of any system of re-insurance. It talies no time for them to become 'full' on a particular risk, and a late customer unable to secure iusurance becomes timid, then anxious; communicates his fears and anxieties to others, and so starts a general alarm which poads on to heayy withitrawals of deposits. The ruin of oue colonial bauk having its parent office in London is largely attributable to such a coincidence of facts.
The rates of insurance can only be learned on dirett application as the companies issue no sehedules of rutes; but such tables as we have seen quote rates for India, Africa and Australasia varring from '2 shilljugs to 20 shurings, while in the case of Canada the guotations have averaged 5 shillings or t of ofe per cent.
The depositors in Canadian banks are
for the most part resident within the Dominion and our deposit-recelpts are probably seldow before the companies. Nevertheless in view of the circumstances affecting the latter, and the very eiremmeribed amount of insurance which they are able to offer on any one risk. it does not seem out of place in this cursory reference to the matter to sugrest that our Canadian banks would besb conserve their interests by making the issuance of their deposit-receipts to investors beyond the sea very limited both in frequency and umount.

IRIZL ESEASS LN FIRE INSURANCE.
There is a paper of some interest in a recent issue of the Engligh "Post Magazine" entitled "Woollen Worsted Mills as Fire Insurance Risks." It was an essay read by Mr. F. B. 'Denle, of The "Conmercial Union," and is stated io have gained for its author a prize -Westowei, we presume, for cho chear manner in which was demonstrated the frequent causes of fires in that class of risks. We have no fault to find with: the winner of the prize, except perhaps is is, that he tells us the same old story we have hurd betore, only in difierent Horls. It did not require a prize essay to teach fire insurance men, that the picker is one of the chlef sourees of damger, as regards fire, in a woolen mill, or that drying wool over the boiler on "grated foom does not enfance the sufety of the risk.

- It is carious to mote the altra-conservative spirit in the English mind in respect to new inventions, for the wry tel of the above essay cannot avoid uttering a note of warning as to eleclut lighting, saying that an luperfect insulation "pasy give ilse to much greater dauger than where gas is cmployed," although in a previous semtence he had grown eloquent upou the
amount of money lost to insurance companies from the use of matches! We honestly believe that everg hazard of electric lighting is far outweighted by its aduantages, espectialy in the picking and carding rooms of a woollen mill, where the fluff and dust is so dangerous when coming in contact with an open light.
All this however is merely by the way, and wo are quite sure that an ẹsay which would win a prize from oni insurauce offices here, and a handsome one too, would be that, which would discover the cause and. give the remedy for the numerous and disastrous fires which dontinually visit our city. Scarcely had we recovered our breath, so to speak, from the recent conflagration on St. Jimes street than a similar catastrophe oecurs on SI. Paul and William strects. The daily papers are "lways singiug the praises of our gallmut fremen, how they fought like herwe: with the devouring element and so forth, but we look for more than mero physieal courage and endurance in a fire brigale. At both the late large fires the water pressure was lamentably dejective and the stemmers were late on the fidld of action. Where does the fault lie? As tax payers both to The city and to the insmance companies We late a right to know. It is all vers well to ery ont that the men behaved nobly, did all that it was humanly possible to $\mathrm{do}_{2}$ but there is an old naying that "the proof of the pudaing is in the eating," and there must be something radically wrong somewhere for our fires to spread from building to building as they so often do. How is it that Toronto is not visited with such serious fires? That city canuot boast of better water works, nor more subs. stantial buidings, and so we think here is a subject for a prize essaig which we would auggest might be addressed to Che Chatiman of the Fire Commltter,

The drawer is evideatly not in touch with his eljent, and ii this "hashez-ulder " principle whelt the system diseloses be general, it evidenees office methods necting fastant: remonlelling if trade if to hold together on any wholeaome basis. Those English mammaturars who have sent out travellers are remping the bencrit of their enterphise. In the Birmingham and Sheffeld trades, south dificau busimess has shown an appreciable change ror the better "iluring the month. Some heary contracts ate spokes of for rolling stock for the new South Arican railway sehemes, ant orders totaling altogether soma c300,000 have recently been placed with British inms on this account. some göod orders for mining machinery have been both despatehed and placed during Jap̧ary, and the work in conmetion with further installations on rock-drilling and other phant is now befug competed for by British engineers. In South Africartorekecpers are begiuring to throw some specuilation into
huying instead oi merely covering thelr requirements. Agriculturists are falr. Is prosperous, ind are therefore spending money, and quite•an extensive amde has reematy sprong up in ithirying implements. The milwas extensions are exercisiug a marked effect upon the prosperity of the country; While the fruit export promises to add an important element of progress. It is not surprising, therefore, that mer chants and storekecpers in all the big centres throughout Soutls Africa are fuaking additjous to their places of business, or erecting new premises.
The development of Canadian manufactures and the need of exportable mankets for our produce, of all kinds, may well lead us to engnire whetiver Arica is not likely to be a purchaser for grools from the north. What has bere done in the past way be briefly told. It is to be noped that in any new watitng rooms they may provide, due regard will be hat to the properties and decencies of lite.

During the year, 182 udditional corporations in the United States have selected this Company for the bouding of their employecs, amougst others, three of the largest riilrond corporations in that country who had hitherto takeu bouds elsewhere.
In view, however, of the present speculative rates of premium offered by other Coupanies and required of this Company by certain employers; as a-coudition of securing; or retaining; their business,' the management have not sought to enter the lists with their competitors in that respeet, but have rather given particular and special attention duriag the past year to the revision of and withdrawal from fts books of risks which had bceome of a doubtinl or undesirable mature, both as to classification of the employment and the persomal status of the employees, and aithongh other bonds have been readily substituted elsewbere, this Company has cause for congratulation in having by its action averted what might have been somo very heayy losses, quite a mumber of those so withdrawn from, or avoided in the first place, having been subsequently announced through the public press and otherwise as defaulters to cousiderable amounts.

The extra supervision and iuvestigation necessanily involved an increase in tho working expenses, hat considerably less in proportion than the saviug of loss which hats been offected thereby.
The defalcations made public in the press in the Linited States, in 1892, of amonnts of $\$ 1,000$ and over, number 489 and sum ap $\$ 5,900,000$, but, as this does not cover amounts under $\$ 1,000$, it is fair to as. sume that the total is rery much larger. Of this mmber, an examination of the list shows that but five oi them were bonded in this Company.
Not a few corporations, who at first blush, have held that cheap rates are an clement of ceonomy, have called unou this Company to meet the lower rates offered by its less-ppperienced competitors, hut on representation, they have been convinced that a proper protection can only be gecured by an adequate premium being piaid, and that cherpmess and inefficiency not onl $y$ do not constitute cconomy but involve danger of disuster and there fore it is unt in the interest of the proprietors of their institntions to vely upon a security which is offered at less cost than the outlay neiessary to ensure proper protection.
The United States Gumantec Company, in which this Compainy has a large inierest and which is conducted in close niliance with this Company, has progressed in a very yntisfactory manner, und in addition to pryiag a dividend of oper cent. per amunn on its stock, has accumulated at surplus equal to mearly 12 per cent. on its capital over and above all: liabilities. The re-insurnnce of surplus lines between the two companies has worked yery satisfinctorily and therelig every prospect of each Company veing of material value to the other in all respects.
The Directors had for some time under consideration the opening of an ngency in London, Eugland, in view of frequent applications made by British corporations to bond representatives in Amorica, and
the prospect of transactiner a kntisiactory lusiness of re-insurance of the surplus lines of Companies on that side of the Athantic, ans well as having a Burcan for more direct. and immedinte information in regard to persons bonded on this silde, whose former anpoyments tul antecedents were over there, and for such other purposes as might serve the interests of the Company with present or prospective clichits
In September of hast year, it was resolved that the Mamuing Director ahound proced to Enghand for this purpose, and the Directors havo to report that an ageney has been opened in Lombon, mader auspices which promise to yied satisfactory results, nad-until this shall have been demonstrated-at a limited expense o the Company.
The Directors desire to ackuowledge the services of the varions local bonrds and Secretaries, and take this opportunity to express their resect at tho loss by denth, luring the pust yenr, of two valued Diractors of the Pitisharg Branch Board who had remitered material assistance to the Compray hy their influthee.

To day the reserve and aurplus funds anount to $\mathbf{8 2 7 8 , 4 0 7 . 3 2 ,}$ Tho assets have been increased during the yoar juist closed by the eubstantinl sum of $\$ 1,022,800.29$. These results, I venture to hope, Fill boentisfinctory to the shareholders; they.
have not been attniued without a good deal of hard work and carciul attention upon the part of your directors and offiecrs. At the time this company commenced business the days of high rates of interest and large prolits to loan companies had well high passed, and the statement we place before you to day, of our first nine yents' operations, is the result of moderate divideuds to shareholders, low ratio of expenses aud a careful selection of loans. The yoar has come nuil rone and we have now reached ond thirtieth maniverfary, and I ventare to thiak that the report just hatd before you fully realizes the favornble anticipations expressed when we met our shatelathers wrelve monthis we meg one shathohders wedve months
nogo. There can be no buter evidence (I was guing to sily, speaking from atockholder's point of view, no plensanter evidences) of stability than thent which is afforded by the unvarying rate of dividend, 10 per cent., which we hate continued to pay to our Shareholters for so many yents.

noy, were shared in by other companies, will occur agrin. All these amoumta, how: over, have, als I hare said, been written off, in pursuance of a policy which. We believe to be the only safe one, of charging all such matters against the Contingent Fund without delay, instead of carrying them over from year to year, and the Contingent Fund, which was expressIy created for the purpose of mecting any losses which might from time to time oceur, has proved amply surficient to meet all demands upon it, and it will be made the policy of the Directors to keep it always in such a position.
We continue, as hitherto, to olvtinin all the money wo require to the full extent allowed by the act of incorporation, and on the most fayorable terus, which is the best iudex of the high standing of the Compuny in the estimation of investors, both in His conmtry and in Great Eritain.
