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
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

[Paffed the 13th of March, 1811.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

THEREAS it would much advance the general profperity of this Province, if the Public Highways and Roads were amended; May it pleafe your Majelty, That it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the King's most excellent Majeft by and with the advice and confent of the Legiflative Council and Affembly of the Province of Upper Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled " An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act paffed in " the fourteenth year of his Majefty's reign, intituled, " An Act for making " more effectual provision for the government of the Province of Quebec in " North America, and to make further provision for the government of the " faid Province," and by the authority of the fame, That out of the rates and duties already raifed, levied and collected, or hereafter to be raifed, levied and collected, to and for the ule of this Province, there be granted to his Majefty. his heirs and fucceffors, the fum of three thousand four hundred and fifty pounds, to be iffued out of the Funds now remaining or hereafter to come into the Receiver General's hands, unappropriated and arifing from fuch rates and duties as last aforefaid, which faid fum of three thousand four hundred and fifty pounds, shall be disposed of, appropriated and applied in repairing the roads already laid out, and building bridges in the feveral Diffricts of this Province.

11. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid fum of three thousand four hundred and fifty pounds shall be appropriated in the following manner ; to the Eastern District four hundred pounds, which faid fum of four hundred pounds shall be laid out and expended on the following roads : commencing at Sutherland's Creek in Lancafter, from thence to the Point Au d pounds; & feventy-four pounds fixteen fhillings & ten pence Bodet, one h three farthing. ... be laid out on the aforefaid, that is now in the Commiffioners hands in the Eaftern Diffrict; and one hundred pounds in the County of Dundas; fifty pounds to be laid out in building a bridge at Captain Mc. Martin's, and fifty pounds to build a bridge near Munrow's Mills, acrofs the creek; and one hundred pounds to be laid out on the Post-Road, to commence at John Matice's in the Township of Cornwall, and continue on faid road to the Province Line, County of Prefcot; on the front road of Ealt and Weft Hawkelbury, beginning at the Lower Canada Line, from thence to the Welt Line of Hawkelbury, near Alexander Grant's, one hundred pounds ; to the Diftrict of Johnstown four hundred pounds ; County of Grenville, on the bridge in Johnstown fifty pounds; to build a bridge over the River Rideau, from lot number twenty-fix in the Township of Marlborough to lot number five in the . Township of Oxford one hundred pounds; from James Humphrey's, in Ed. wardfburgh, to Lewis Grant's Mill, twelve pounds ten fhillings ; from Johnftown to Gideon Adams's, Elquire, twelve pounds ten fhillings ; on the bridges

Serveen Thomas Frefer's, Elquire, and Johnflown, twenty five pounds ; twenty pounds on the front road leading from Adam Cole's in Elizabeth Town, to Charles Jones's Mills in the Township of Yonge ; and one hundred pounds on the road leading from the aforefaid Mills to the Eafternmost boundary of the Midland Diffrict ; and eighty pounds on the road leading from the Iron Works in Lansdown, to Stephen Wathburn's in Lansdown aforefaid, thends to Solomon Conley's, thence to Abraham Randah's, thence to Nathanici Brown's, thense to Abraham Coon's, on fuch part of the aforefaid roads as fhell by the faid Commillioners be deemes most necessary 1 to the Midline District four bundsed pounds, which fom fhall be expended on the roads as follows, that is to fay, from the Eaflern boundary of the Township of Pittburgh by the King's Mills to the town of Kingflon, the fum of one hundred pounds ; from the Ead fide of Collins's Creck in the third Concellion of the Township of Kingkon, to the road palling through the fourth Consellion of ErneR-town, forty pounds ; From the Western boundary of the Township of Hichmond to the Eastern bound dary of the Township of Thurlow, one hundred: and twenty pounds ; leventy pounds to the bridge to be built or repaired, on the fecond Concession road of the Township of Kingston; fifty pounds from Townsend Carman's house to the Carrying Place, in the Township of Amelialburgh ; twenty pounds from the Western boundary of the District of Lohnstown, on the read leading from the Iron Works in the Township of Lansdown, until it interfects the read itt. the Township of Pittsburgh near the Kingston Mills : to the District of Newcase tle, four hundred pounds, that the faid fum fhall be laid out as follows, on the road leading from the Carrying Place at the Head of the Bay of Quinty, to the Mills on lot number thirty-four in the first Concession of the Township of Murray, one hundred pounds ; on the road leading from the River Treat to the East line of the Township of Cramahe, one hundred pounds; on the road near the line in front of the fecond Conceffion of the Township of Cramahe, forty gounds ; on Dundas Street, leading through the Townships of Clark, and Dare lington, in the County of Durham, one hundred and fixty pounds.

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Provided always, That if any part of the above named roads in the Diffrid of Newcaftle and the Diftrict of Johnstown, fhall be altered agreeable to the provisions of an A& palled in the fiftieth year of his Majefy's reigna intituled * An AA to provide for the laying out, amending; and keeping increase the " Public Highways and Roads in this Brovince, and to repeal the Laws now in " force for that purpofe," before any of the fums above granted fhall be expended ed on them, it thall and may be lawful for the faid Commiffioners: to open and amend the faid road fo altered, any thing in this Act to the contrary nouvithin That the fum of fix hundred paunda appropriated for the Home Ganding. Diffriel, be expended as follows, viz, one hundred and fifty pounds on the road from the Eaftern boundary of the Home Diffrit on Durdis Street, to the bridge over the River Rouge, or Nen; two hundred pounds on the roud hnown by the name of the Middle Road from the Town of York to the River Credit . two hundred and fifty pounds for building of bridges over the Rivers of Hunse her and Credit, near the mouth of each river, refpectively, on sho line of soul

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called the Middle Road as aforefaid : to the Diffrict of Niagara the fum of four hundred and fifty pounds, from Vanderlip's through the Grand River Swamp, to Alexander Weftbrook's, one hundred and twenty five pounds ; from Brady's Tavern, through Satifices to the Forty-mile Creek, filly pounds ; on the new Lake Road from the Forty-mile Creek, to the Beach at Jones's, ten pounds ; from the Porty mile Creek Eaft wardly to Shipman's Tavern at the Twelve-mile Creek, fixty pounds ; from Shipman's on the Middle Road leads ing to Niegara until that road interfects the Lake Road, forty-five pounds ; from Shipman's Tavern, on the road leading to Queenfton ten pounds ; from Wiltiam Sicel's in Humbertion, to Elijoh Doane's in Crowland, fifty pounds ; and that the Coindillioners of Public Highways for the Diffrict of Niagara, are hereby authorized and required to apply on the building a bridge across the Outlet of Burlington Bay, being on the division line between the Home Difwiet and Diffict of Ningers, one hundred pounds : to the Diffrict of London; the form of four hundred pounds, the money in the Diffrict of London Mall be applied on the Pablic Road leading through the Townships of Burford, Ox4 ford. and Delaware Yown, in the following mannet, that is, from the now dwelling House of John Yeighs in Barford, to the junction of the roads on a Wefterly courfe, about one mile from Samuel Kiney's, twenty pounds's from the Weft sert of the Fine Wind Falls to the Cooly Place, thirty pounds; from thence to the Township Line of Oxford, forty-five pounds ; from thence to Captain Canfeld's, eighty-five pounds ; from thence to Hatkins's, thirty pounds ; from Conwright's now dwelling Houle to Reynolds's Mills in Dorchefter, forty pounds ; from thence to Archibald M'Millan's in Weitminiter, fixty pounds? from the West fide of the River Latranch in the Wildernels, hinety pounds? to the Weffern Diffriel, the fam of four hundred pounds, from the Moravian Village in AmherRourgh, ewo hundred and fifty pounds; from Amherftburgh to John Connect's one Hundred pounds , from the Moravian Town on the Delaware Wildemolis fifty pounds.

141. And be it further Emailed by the Authority aforefaid, That at any time from and after the pathog of this Act, is thall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Porlon administering the Government of this Province, to appoint one or more Committener or Committeners for each and every District of this Province, for carrying the provisions of this Act into excontions which Committener or Committeners that have full power and authority, and they are hereby required to proceed to repair and amend fuch zonds, and build fush bridges in each and every District of this Province, as herein before deferibed, to which he or they filled be respectively appointed, and the faid Committener or Committeners respectively, fill caufe the work required by this Act, to be done or performed between the first day of May and the first day of November.

IV. And be a further Emerted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid Commissioners respectively appointed by this Act, fhall once in every year, on of before the first day of January, transmit to the Governor, Lieutenant Goverups, of Barford administering the Government of this Province, a true account of the expenditures of the money by him or them received, under and by virtue of this A& (in detail) with proper vouchers accompanying the fame, to be laid before the Legislature for their infpection.

V. And be it further Enasted by the authority aforesaid, That it fhell and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Perfon administering the Government of this Province, to direct the Money appropriated and apportioned as aforesaid, for each and every District thereof, to be paid to any one of the Commiffioners for fuch District or Districts, applying for the fame.

VI. And be it further enabled by the authority aforefaid, That before any Commillioner shall proceed to carry into Execution the feveral powers and authorities by this Act conferred, he shall take the following Oath, I, A. B. do swear that I will faithfully and impartially, to the beft of my fkill and judgement, perform and carry into execution, the feveral powers and authorities in me vested in and by a certain A& of the Legiflature of this Province, intituled, " an Ad for Granting to his Majefty, a certain fum of Money cut of the Funds and plicable to the uses of this Province, to defray the expences of amending and repairing the Public Highways and Roads, and building Bridges in the feveral Districts thereof," without favor or affection to any perfon, or perfons whomfoever, and will duly and faithfully account for all Monies which shall from time to time come into my hands for the purpose of carrying the provisions of the faid A& into execution, fo help me God ; which faid Oath shall be taken before any one of his Majefty's Juffices of the Peace, in and for the Diftrict for which fuch Commillioner shall be appointed, and a Certificate of fuch Oath. the Justice administering the fame, is hereby required to transmit to the Clerk of the House of Astembly of this Province, with all convenient speed, after such Oath shall have been by him administered : Provided nevertheles, and it is here. by declared, that nothing herein contained, fhall repeal or annul any of the provisions of any existing Act or Acts of this Province contained, for raising or levying the Rates thereby imposed, or compelling the labour by fuch Acts or in any of them required to be done and performed on any Public Highways and Roads comprifed in fuch Ads; but all and every fuch Act and Acts, is and are hereby declared to be and continue in full force ; Provided alfo, that nothing in any former Law or Statute of this Province contained, shall from and after the paffing of this Act, be held or conftrued to impower or authorize any Magistrate or Overfeer in any fuch Law or Statute mentioned; in any mane, ser to interfere or give directions, touching or concerning any Road or Highway to be laid out, or repaired under and by virtue, of this Act ; neverthelefs. the faid Magistrates and Overfeers, and every of them, is and are hereby authorized to carry into execution, all and every fuch power and authority, as by fuch Law or Statute, they are vefted with, in all cafes in which the executing fuch power will not impede, or interfere with the powers or authorities given in and by virtue of this Act. And whereas an Act paffed in the fiftieth year of his Majefty's reign, intituled, "an Act for granting to his Majefty, a certain fum of Money out of the Funds applicable to the ules of this Province, to defray the expences of amending and repairing the Public Highways and Roads, laying

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out and opening new Roads, and building Bridges in the feveral Diffricts thereof," it is by the fecond claufe of the above recited Act, enacted, that fifty pounds be appropriated on the Road leading from the Iron Works in Lansdown, to Kingfton to commence at Levy Hatchkuffes in Leeds, thence to continue on to the Eafternmoft boundary of the Midland Diffrict; And whereas the above recited part of the fecond claufe of the faid Act, is found inconvenient, fo far as it relates to fifty pounds being expended on the Road commenceing at Levy Hatchkuffes, and to continue on to the Eafternmoft boundary of the Midland Diffrict: Therefore be it enacted by the authority aforefaid, that the above recited part of the faid Act, be, and the fame is hereby repealed.

VII. And be it further enabled by the authority aforesaid, That it fhall and may be lawful for the faid Commiffioners appointed by the above recited Act, to lay out the faid fum of fifty pounds, on the Road leading from the aforefaid Iron Works, to the Eaftern boundary of the Midland Diffrict, any Law to the contrary notwithftanding.

VIII. And be it further enabled by the authority aforefaid, That the Money hereby granted to his Majefty, shall be paid by the Receiver General, in difcharge of fuch Warrant or Warrants, as shall for the purposes herein fet forth, be issued by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, and the Receiver General shall account to his Majefty, his Heirs and Successors, for the tame, through the Lords Commissioners of his Majefty's Treasury, for the time being, in successors and form, as his Majefty, his Heirs and Successors, shall be graciously pleased to direct.

IX. And be is further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That each and every Commissioner appointed under the authority of any former Act, or Acts of the Parliament of this Province, for laying out, amending, and keeping in repair the Public Highways and Roads in this Province, in whofe hands any balance remaining unexpended, and who fhall not be appointed a Commissioner under and by virtue of this Act, fhall on or before the first day of May next, pay over every fuch balance, into the hands of any one Commissioner appointed under and by virtue of this Act, in their refpective Diffricts, in which fuch Commissioners heretofore appointed, may reside, and the faid balances, the Commissioner or Commissioners appointed under or by virtue of this Act, are hereby authorized and required to expend in their refpective Diffricts, as by the Act of the fiftieth year of his Majefty's Reign, is required.

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
