









STUDENTS ARRIVE TO RESUME WORK

Almost a Thousand Coming For the First Time—All Dread Initiation Ceremonies, Which Rarely Come Up to Standard—This is Enrollment Day.

This morning something like thirty-five hundred students will gather in the vicinity of Queen's Park to enter upon the college year of 1913-14, and among that number there will be higher than nine hundred students who will find their way for the first time as students of the University of Toronto. For many months these nine hundred youths from the high schools, suburban institutes, homes, stores and sundry other places have been waiting for the great day when they will be admitted to the university.

The members of the other years have had some worrier of their own; at least, those who were awaiting the supplementary examination results. They did not see their cognomen when they were called to the examination, and they do not know whether they were successful or not.

The interfaculty meet will be held some time between Oct. 12 and 17, and all intending applicants for the fall term will go to Kingston on Oct. 24, to have their names entered on the roll.

The inauguration address by President Falconer in convention hall is listed for Tuesday afternoon, when the students will dutifully gather to hear the verdict read out that they are condemned to spend the next year of their lives in more or less severe. This opening ceremony is an annual affair, and is looked upon by the old students as a festive occasion.

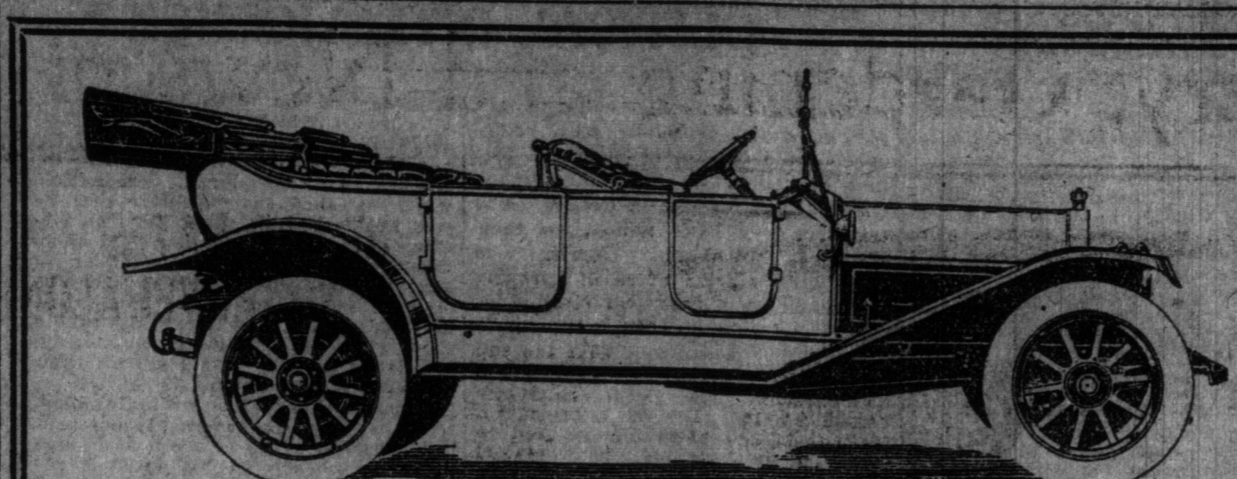
HONORS FOR LAD WHO SAVED LIFE

Due to Advice That Canadian Duties Not Likely to Be Disturbed.

CHICAGO, Sept. 27.—What were alleged to be authentic advices that Canadian duties would not be removed until after the meeting of parliament in the spring caused a decided rally in wheat prices today. The market, which at first had been depressed, closed firm, 1/4 to 3/4 to the bushel in advance of a net loss of 1/4 to 3/4, and a gain in wheat, and provisions finished irregularly, varying from 1/4 to 3/4 in an advance of a shade.

Trade was brisk and prices high as there was a shortage of supplies.
