




OF THE

BRITISH COLUMBIA

PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME.



In submitting to the subscribers their annual report for the past year, the Committee have to thankfully acknowledge the liberal support given to the Home, and the expressed willingness of many to increase their support should it be required.

It is with unfeigned sorrow that we have to record the death, during the past year, of our much-loved President, Mr. A. A. Green. Only those who have known and witnessed his kind deeds, not only in connection with the Orphanage, but also in business relations, can understand how truly his services were a work and labor of love and how great was the Institution has sustained in his departure from our midst.

The management of the Home by the Matron, Mrs. Walker, has been most satisfactory. The household arrangements have received very careful atten-

tion from the Ladies' Committee, and to their efforts the continued success of the Institution largely due.

While the children have on the whole enjoyed good health there has been some sickness in the Home during the year. Thanks, however, to the professional services rendered by Dr. Milne, the children, with one exception, are again in the enjoyment of good health.

The total number of children cared for and provided with a home during the year was 58.

In June last the Treasurer received \$1,000 from "A Friend" as a donation to the Institution, and in July, \$40 was placed on the collection plate of John's church from "A Friend" to the Home. In August \$15 was received from collection in Methodist church, Westminster. In December the Wrights' and Caulkers' Association donated \$100. Also in December there was received from G. Hyde, Esq., Westminster, Executor of the late E. Hitchcock, a legacy of \$200.

In addition to the cash subscriptions elsewhere acknowledged, kind friends have contributed

provisions, fruit, vegetables, etc., for all of which Committee return grateful thanks.

Heretofore the building on Rae Street has been sufficient for the accommodation of the children, affording a home. The Committee, however, are of the opinion that, owing to the largely increasing population, it will soon be called on to provide a separate building for the boys and girls, and hope to be enabled to provide a home that will be a credit to the city and province.

Full particulars of receipts and expenditures may be found in the Treasurer's Report appended, in conclusion the Committee desire to render thanks to God for the measure of success and prosperity he has been pleased to grant to the Institution, and hope that every effort made for the care of the destitute children may receive His blessing.

British Columbia PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME.

CONSTITUTION

(ADOPTED OCT. 27, 1873.)

INCORPORATED 11TH JULY, 1883.

1. This Institution shall be called the "British Columbia Protestant Orphans' Home."

2. The object of this Institution is to receive, and to provide a home for orphan, destitute and other children, under the age of ten years, requiring such care; and to educate them in the Protestant faith, and instruct them in the elements of secular knowledge.

3. The management of this Institution shall be vested in a Committee chosen from the subscribers, at the annual meeting to be held on the second Tuesday of December, in each year, said Committee to consist of four representatives from each Protestant denomination in Victoria, of whom at least one shall be a Clergyman, and not fewer than two Lay-

men, and one-third of whom shall constitute quorum for the transaction of general business.

4. It shall be the duty of such Committee their first meeting, to be held not later than week after their election, to appoint from their own number, a President, Secretary and Treasurer; meet at least once a quarter, and oftener if required to provide for the support of the Institution by means of voluntary contributions and otherwise, as they may deem advisable.

5. The Committee shall also, at their first meeting after election, appoint a committee of ladies composed of an equal number from each denomination to take charge of the internal management of the Institution. Such committee of ladies shall appoint their officers and make their own regulations equitably according to the spirit of this Constitution and the basis on which the Association is formed. On approved monthly requisition they may draw on the Treasurer for necessary funds, and shall there with pay all bills. They shall also present to the President a monthly report of the state of the finances and the condition of the Institution.

6. The religious training of these orphans shall be conducted according to the doctrines and tenets held by the orthodox Protestant Churches. In this Constitution those Churches are esteemed orthodox.

which hold as the foundation of their faith the sufficiency and authority of the Holy Scripture for salvation—Holy Scripture being the commonly received books of the Old and New Testament,—so that, whatsoever is not read therein or may not be proved thereby, is not to be required of any that it should be believed as an article of the Christian faith or be thought requisite or necessary to salvation (Art. 6, Ch. of Eng.); and which also hold the articles of the Apostles' Creed as truths of our common redemption, on the ground that they may be proved by most certain warrants of Holy Scripture. All, therefore, who hold any office or authority as over the orphans shall be and continue to be Protestants of good character and sound in the faith. A form of prayers prepared for the purpose, together with portions of the Old and New Testament Scriptures, shall be read morning and evening daily.

7. The orphans shall, in charge of the matron, regularly attend divine service on Sunday (mornings) in the Victoria Churches of such of the orthodox protestant denominations as are or shall be from time to time represented on the General Committee, as follows:—That is to say, the attendance shall be given in quarterly (tri-monthly) periods at the services of each such denomination in succession. In the case of any such denomination having regular services in more than one church in Victoria, the

quarter's attendance pertaining to that denomination may be equally divided among its several churches. Attendances at any other times shall be in the discretion of the General Committee, as shall also other questions or exceptional cases that may from time to time arise.

8. One Minister of each Protestant denomination as aforesaid, in quarterly rotation, shall be the Minister or Chaplain of the orphans, with pastoral authority over them for that time as over a portion of his own flock, providing he does not in the exercise of such authority, violate any Rule of this Constitution.

9. No alteration shall be made in this Constitution except by a vote of two-thirds of the whole Committee sanctioned by a majority of the subscribers present at a general meeting, of which thirty days notice shall be given. Such notice to specify the changes recommended for the consideration of the meeting.

10. It shall be lawful for the Committee from time to time make, vary and alter by-laws for the government of the Institution, and for all matters and things relating to the conduct and management of its affairs, provided that the same be not inconsistent with the foregoing Constitution, and that notice
