














Enlistment, and such proper Officers as I shall appoint.

I Do therefore hereby, with the Advice of his Majesties Council, Encourage and reward all such able-bodied effective Officers and Soldiers as shall serve for the said Expedition, That they shall receive £100 per Month, as their Wages, advanced to them in hand, That each Soldier shall have £100 per Month, and Officers shall be entitled to all the Privileges of a Private Soldier, That they shall be paid off before the Service be over, And that they shall be entitled to their Wages next coming. And to the intent that the Service may have a due and proper Management, I command the election of the Captains in whose Companies the names of the Officers and other Officers whom they shall elect to the chief Officer of each Regiment of Militia.

AND in order to prevent any Intelligence of the intended Expedition from falling into the hands of the French, I Do hereby command the Sheriff of this Province, to deliver without Delay to the chief military Officer of every Company, and to the said Proclamations as there are military Companies immediately after receiving the same, call his Company together, and that he read publicly to his said Company, and that he shew the said Proclamations in their hands, and suffer no Copies to be made of them. Use of the said Proclamation has been made by the Sheriff, who is also hereby required to take a List of the Proclamations so delivered, and to whom delivered, and that he sends the said List with the Proclamations so delivered up.

Given at the Council-Chamber in PORTSMOUTH,  
the 5<sup>th</sup> Day of August, in the Eighteenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord King GEORGE the Third, by the Grace of GOD of GREAT-BRITAIN, FRANCE and IRELAND, King, Defender of the Faith, &c.
