GRUSADE AGAINST INDECENT POSTERS

Club for Country Girls Located in the City Taking Shape—Victoria Day Horse Parade.

The eighth annual meeting of the Local Council of Women of Toronto was held yesterday afternoon in the Woman's Art Gallery, Confederation Life Building, the president, Mrs. George Kerr, being in the chair.

The report of the secretary showed that considerable growth had been made during the year, and the number of federated societies had increased to 27.

The newly-affiliated societies were: Auxiliary of the Western Hospital, The Alumnae of Victoria College, The Round Table of Toronto Conservators of Music, the women members of the United Empire Loyalists' Association, and the women trustees of the Associated Charities.

An interesting clause in the report was the record that the Local Council of Women had endorsed the petition presented by the Ontario Medical Association and the Prisoners' Aid Association, regarding proper care and treatment of pauper inmates.

The treasurer's report showed receipts to be \$207.64 and expenditures \$178.70, leaving a balance of \$28.94 on hand.

A resolution was adopted accepting the retirement of Lady Taylor from the presidency of the National Council of Women until the annual meeting to be held in July, and the nomination of Mrs. Gibson of Hamilton as president pro tem.

The president, Mrs. Kerr, was re-appointed to office; the treasurer, Mrs. Coad, was re-elected by acclamation; and the other officers elected for 1902 were: Vice-presidents, Mrs. Tibbels and Miss Carty; Mrs. Torrington, Mrs. Tibbels and Mrs. Patterson; recording secretary, Miss Cox; corresponding secretary, Miss Josephine MacCallum.

Reports were received from the majority of the federated societies. Some facts gleaned from the reports with regard to their work are interesting. The report which was made some time ago by the ladies against objectionable posters is about to bear fruit. Judge McLaughlin is engaged upon important amendments to the law on this point, which he will shortly bring to the legislature. The movement to provide comfortable rooms, and eventually a residential club for Toronto girls, whose wages are small and surroundings unpropitious, is gathering strength, and Mrs. Brown, 21 McMillan-street, has begun by throwing open her parlors to girls of this class. A committee will visit the jail at an early date to investigate the alleged unsanitary condition of the apartments of insane patients, of whom it is said there are twenty all crowded into one room, where they eat, sleep and live. Over \$100 has been raised already for prizes for the humane horse parade on Victoria Day.

The endeavor will be made to secure the aid of the government in bringing out girls from England for domestic service on the Exhibition Association and request that a lady representative be placed on the Board of Directors.
