It is entitled "An Act Respecting Boards of Education in Certain Cities," and is framed primarily to provide for the amalgamation of the boards in the City of Toronto. It is stipulated that its provisions shall apply to cities of 150,000 and over. Mr. Harcourt explained that if the act works well it may be amended so as to apply to cities of less than 150,000.

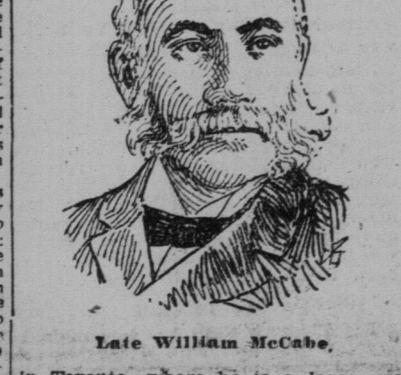
# GRAIN DUTIES ABOLISHED IN ENGLAND'S PEACE BUDGET WITH SPLENDID SHOWING

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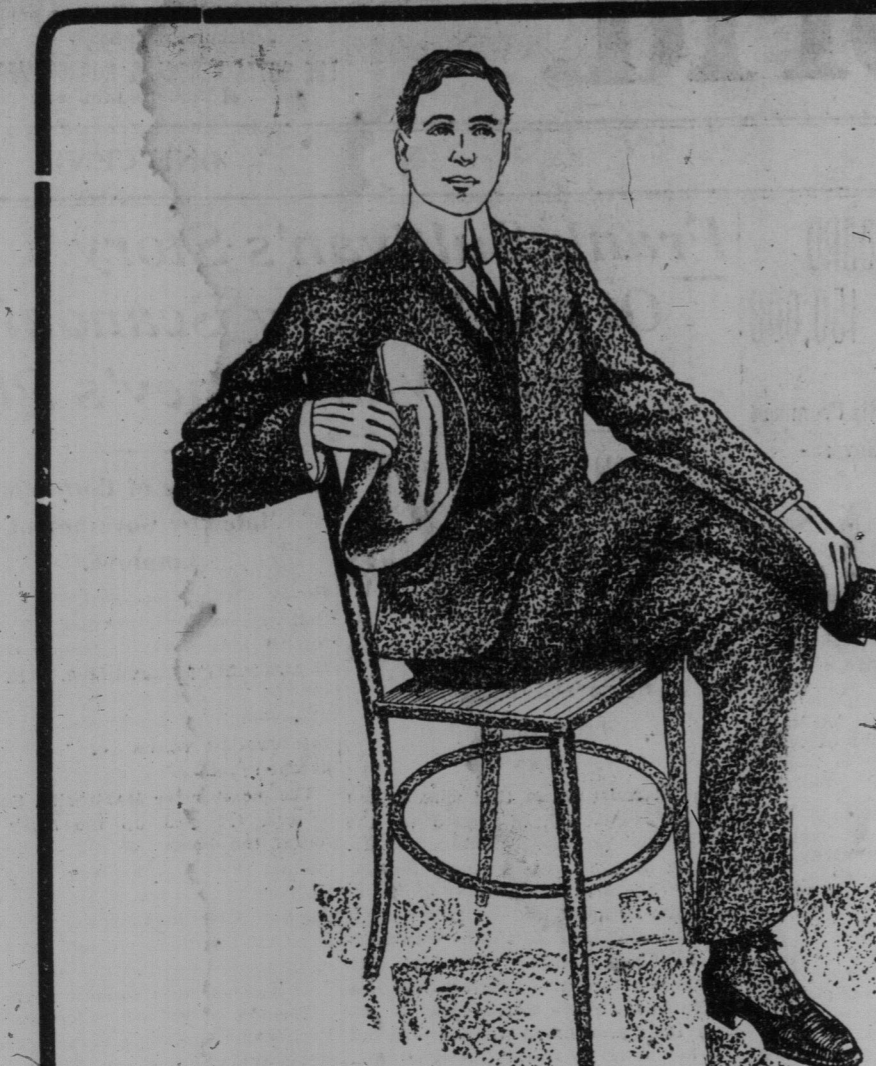
