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CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be denominated "The Ontario Rifle Association."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$1 per annum, shall become a member of the Association.

3. Donors of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association or of a prize of not less value than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as life members of the Association.

4. Any Battalion or Rifle Association in the Province subscribing not less than \$10 annually to the funds of the Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, in the proportion of one to every half-dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to elect from its members the persons to hold such memberships, and return their names and addresses, when elected, to the Secretary of the Association, to be registered by him one week previous to the match.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council

The Lieut.-Governor of the Province of Ontario, for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President.

7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents,—one for each Military District.

8. There shall be a Council, composed as follows :—

1st. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected primarily at this meeting, and hereafter at the annual meeting.

2nd. The Deputy Adjutants General of Militia.

3rd. The Brigade Majors.

4th. The Presidents of local affiliated Associations and Clubs, being members of the Association,—

Five of whom shall form a quorum ; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

9. The Council shall choose from the members elected the President of the Association.

10. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such District, and who shall be elected by the Council.

11. There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

12. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

13. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them ; no by-law being, in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

14. The annual prize meeting shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.

15. The prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed by the Council from time to time.

16. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having

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been previously submitted to the Council), be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.

17. There shall be an annual meeting, to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

Secretaries of Rifle Associations affiliated, or desirous of affiliating with the Ontario Rifle Association, will confer a favor by forwarding the names and addresses of the office-bearers of their Associations, as soon after their election as possible, in order that they may be published in the annual report.

BY-LAWS.

The next annual meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto, on the Third Tuesday in June, 1871.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council; the first of which shall be held on the day after the annual meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meeting.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of any members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

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REPORT OF COUNCIL
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.
1870.

In presenting the Report of your Association for 1870, your Council beg to congratulate the Association upon the growing interest that is evinced in its welfare,—not alone by the people of Ontario, but by institutions and residents of the Mother Country, whose interests and sympathies have led them to subscribe generously towards the organization of Canadian National Defence. They are deserving of the warmest thanks of the Association, and your Council have transmitted, through the President, to the Grand Trunk Railway Company, the Trust and Loan Company, the Canada Company, and to the late Thomas Brassey, Esq., a fitting acknowledgment of their generous donations. They have also to record their thanks to the Legislature of Ontario for the grant of \$500 to the Association, for the year 1871. As a means of procuring a permanent memorial of the late Mr. Brassey's gift of £100 stg., your Council have procured a silver challenge cup to be offered as a prize in the Company Match, which will serve to record the generosity of the giver towards this Association.

Your Council hope that the donations from the Mother Country, and the recognition of the usefulness of the Association by the Legislature of the Province, will stimulate the institutions and people of Ontario, outside of the Volunteer organization, to aid the Association in the work it has so successfully commenced; by spontaneous aid to its funds, and by voluntary memberships and donations—without which it cannot carry on its operations with success, and without compelling its members to sue for support, as they have been hitherto obliged to do from year to year.

In the unavoidable absence of the President, in England, and the establishment of Brigade Camps at that time, the Annual

Matches were postponed from the 21st of June until the 21st of September. Owing to large Brigade Camps at Goderich and Sarnia, and various Battalion Camps at other points, held at the same date, the attendance at the Matches was smaller than last year, although five associations have been formed, and affiliated with this Association, since 1869. It is gratifying to remark, however, that the gross receipts for entries, sighting shots, and ammunition, were larger by \$257.42 than the corresponding receipts for last year, and that the expenses were largely decreased, notwithstanding the hire of markers, register-keepers, buglers, &c.—much more expensive items than before the regular troops were removed from the Toronto garrison. Much of the work on the ranges was of a permanent character, and will prove of great use in future matches. A large quantity of serviceable stores were purchased, and a suitable storehouse having been obtained in the Old Fort, through the kindness of the Minister of Militia, it is trusted that in future years the annual expense attending the matches will be still further decreased.

The Imperial stores having been removed from Toronto, and the Association, consequently, being no longer able to borrow camp equipage, it was thought desirable by your Council to purchase a small supply of such stores from the Imperial authorities, and while an opportunity offered of doing so, at a reduced price. A large marquee, 20 tents, 200 blankets, and 50 targets, in addition to a number of rifles to be offered as prizes, were therefore obtained, at a cost of \$1,584. These stores proved of great service during the last matches. They will also be available in County matches; your Council recommending that they be issued on such occasions, on payment of the expense of transportation, and a small charge for wear and tear. The targets, discs, glass, &c., for temporary butts, may also be issued on similar terms.

Your Council have again to record their thanks to the Dominion Government, through the Hon. Sir G. E. Cartier, Bart., Minister of Militia, for the renewal of their liberal grant to the Association. To His Excellency, Lord Lisgar, Governor-General of the Dominion, they are also indebted a third time for the handsome cup, which is made the first prize in the aggregate scores, and which was won by Private Blacklin, 3rd N. B. Militia. To His Excellency, W. P. Howland, C.B., Lieut.-Governor of Ontario, the Association is likewise indebted for the same liberal donation

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as last year, and which was devoted to the purchase of a prize cup for the second best aggregate score. This cup was won by Ensign Dillon, 34th Battalion.

A liberal prize list, in which nearly \$2,500 was offered in prizes; which comprized the Aldwell Challenge Trophy, the Brassey Cup, and the Cups presented by His Excellency the Governor-General, and the Lieut.-Governor of Ontario, the Silver Medal of the National Rifle Association, and a large number of Snider-Enfield Rifles and Carbines, with Ammunition,—drew together a number of representatives from some thirty affiliating associations. A record of the winning scores is to be found in the Appendix, from which will be seen, that the high average of former years is not only maintained, but in some cases increased.

The Wimbledon system of squadding, and a regular rotation of ranges, was adopted during the last meeting, with great success. Eighteen ranges were constructed, six first class, six second class, and six third class, beside the Pool, Time, and Running-man Targets. The marking was altogether by discs, and the Butts in the first and second class Targets, on the sunken system. The markers were principally discharged soldiers, and after a little practice, did their work well. No serious accident occurred. The thanks of the Association are due to Lieut.-Col. R. B. Denison and Major Otter, for their able conduct as Executive and Range Officers. The weather, during the first four days of the match was very favorable; on the two last days, a drenching rain spoiled the comfort of the competitors, although the firing was continued.

The Aldwell Challenge Trophy, forming the first prize in the Battalion match, was won by the 10th Royals. The Brassey Cup, the first prize in the Company Match, was won by No. 5 Company, 37th Batt. (Haldimand Rifles).

The liberality of the Grand Trunk, Great Western, and Northern Railway Companies, and of the Royal Mail line of Steamers, in carrying competitors to and from their homes at one fare, deserve the thanks of the Association.

To the Committee of Arrangements, Lieut.-Col. Dennis, as Statistical Officer, the Surgeons of the various City Corps who attended the Camp daily, and the Reporters of the *Globe*, *Leader*, and *Telegraph*, for their able and full account of each day's proceedings, the thanks of the Association must also be recorded.

It is a matter of regret, that the ammunition drawn from the Imperial Magazine was so defective as to injure the character of the shooting. This has caused the Council to decide that in future the ammunition may be supplied by the competitor, provided that it is of Government issue, or that obtained from the Ontario Rifle Association.

An appropriation was made for the purpose of defraying the travelling expenses of the Provincial Team to and from the Dominion Rifle Match at Fredericton, N. B. The particulars of their visit, and the scores made by each member of the Team will be found in the Appendix.

Carrying out the resolution of the Council, on the subject of sending a Team to Wimbledon, to compete at the Annual Meeting to be held there in July next, the President addressed a Circular to all the members of the Council entitled to vote, submitting the names of Lieut.-Col. Skinner, Lieut.-Col. Gilmor, Lieut.-Col. J. S. Dennis, and Major Scoble, as Captains of the Team, and asking for their votes. Lieut.-Col. Skinner was elected by a majority of one. All the members voted with the exception of three, the President being one.

The President has been in communication with Lord Elcho, one of the Council of the National Rifle Association, and with Captain Mildmay, Secretary of the N. R. Association, on the subject of the Ontario Team visiting Wimbledon. The result of the correspondence is very satisfactory. The Ontario Team is assured of being received with a most hearty welcome, and will be allowed to compete for all prizes open to Volunteers, including the Queen's.

The President suggested to the Council of the National Rifle Association, through Lord Elcho, the modification of the existing rules in reference to the International Trophy, so as to throw it open for competition to Canadian Volunteers. The suggestion has been most kindly received, with an earnest desire to meet it; and although the Council of the N. R. A. would not entertain a farther amendment of their rules, they proposed to institute an Imperial Challenge Match, open to teams of ten from Great Britain, Ireland, India, and Colonies. It will undoubtedly be a most important and interesting match, and in which the Ontario Team will have an opportunity of competing.

The President has also been in communication with the Grand Trunk Railway authorities here, and in England, and the owners

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of the Canadian Mail Line of Steamers, on the subject of carrying the team to and from England, and has every reason to hope of obtaining most liberal terms.

Your Council have decided to vote again the bonus of \$20 to affiliating Associations for 1871, on the following conditions, viz.: The amount, together with a special badge provided by the Association, to be awarded to the highest aggregate score made at the Annual Match of the Affiliating Association during the year 1871; upon the condition, that the holder of the badge shall present himself at the Ontario Rifle Association Matches for 1872, to compete in a match provided for the purpose; as a means of ensuring a full representation from affiliating associations, and to establish a nursery for the representation of Ontario at future Dominion and Wimbledon competitions. And upon the farther condition, that an authorized copy of the winning scores at such match be furnished to the Secretary of the Ontario Rifle Association, on or before the 1st November, 1871.

TORONTO, 15th Sept., 1870.

SIR :

I have the honor to inform you that, in accordance with your instructions, I took charge of the Ontario Provincial Team on arrival at Fredericton, N. B. Twelve selected names were sent me by Major Scoble. Gunner Russell, also named, did not attend. I had, consequently, to select the three additional men—Capt. Bell, Private Jackson, and Private Jennings.

I regret that Ontario should not have come off first; but under the circumstances—New Brunswick firing on their own ground, and having all their best men on the spot—we could not expect much more; and I am gratified to be able to inform you that the appearance and general conduct of the Ontario men left nothing to desire.

Considerable opposition was made to my entering five men to compete in the Affiliated Associations Match, to represent the Ontario Rifle Association, but overruled; and the selected team—Lieut. Gibson, Ensign Wastie, Sergt.-Major McNachtan, Sergt. Brass, and Pte. Oronhyatekha—won the second prize of \$50, which amount I have received and handed over to the Treasurer.

As this was a small-bore match, I beg to suggest that the amount be handed to the winners. There was a general understanding that such would be the rule adopted.

I beg to annex a statement of expenses incurred by me for the Association. I paid, as you will observe, entrance fees for the team in the All-Comers and Dominion matches, as I thought it would be desirable that the men should have some practice; and I beg to inform you that they were put to some expense not anticipated when they started, having been detained a day at Gorham, U. S., and having to pay about \$1 each extra on the boat between Portland and St. John.

The customs officers in the United States were most courteous, passing the arms, &c., and the baggage of the men without any search even.
