INCORPORATED SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF HURON.

THIRTY-FIRST SESSION.

Being he Fourteenth under the Synod Act of Incorporation of 1874.

FIRST DAY.

The Synod was convened at London on Tuesday, December 4th, 1888.

Divine service was held in St. Paul's Cathedral Church at 10 o'clock a. m.

The Holy Communion was administered to the Clergy and Lay Representatives by the Lord Bishop, assisted by the Very Rev. G. M. Innes, M. A., Dean of Huron; Ven. F. W. Sandys, D.D., Archdeacon of Kent; Ven. J. W. Marsh, M.A., Archdeacon of London; Ven. A. H. R. Mulholland, Archdeacon of Grey, and Rev. Canon Smith.

The sermon was preached by Rev. Canon Richardson, M.A., Rector of the Memorial Church, London, Ont., from St Matthew, xxviii., 20.

The Synod assembled at 2:30 o'clock p.m., in the Chapter House, for business.

The Lord Bishop in the chair.

The Bishop's Address.

His Lordship then delivered his annual address to the Synod, as follows:

REVEREND BRETHREN AND BRETHREN OF THE LAITY :-

It is only just to you to explain the reason of our meeting, at this very unusual, and perhaps inconvenient, period of the year. Sailing, as early as I did, I found it impossible to prepare, as it is always necessary to prepare, for the meeting of so august a body as this; and subsequently, my return to Canada was delayed by one of those unforseen, yet veritable dispensations of God which control our actions, and mark the good pleasure of His will. If, therefore, under these circumstances, I have caused trouble or inconvenience to any or to all, I must ask forgiveness on the ground that in taking this exceptional date, I acted in the way my judgment deemed to be the best.

Perhaps it may not be irrelevant to say, that for once we shall have the coolness and frost of winter to bear on the heated and somewhat exciting debates of Synod; and perhaps, the absence of the sultry heats of the greater dog star may exercise an influence far more bene ficial than otherwise, on the evenness of mind with which we now approach the various questions submitted to our care.

I desire also to put on record my sense of God's goodness in having, through the intercession of many prayers, vouchsafed to me and mine, such multiplied proofs of Hislove in preserving us both by sea and land, and in bringing us home in peace. I have also publicly to thank my late Commissary, the Very Rev. Dean Innes, not only for his kindness in undertaking the onerous position of administrator during my absence, but also for the unremitting assiduity with which he discharged the duties of his office.

Having just returned from one of the most important and grave councils ever held by the Anglican Communion, a few words here concerning it may not be out of place.

The Lambeth Conference, though not clothed with any judicial powers, by which its decisions could be enforced, will always have a peculiar authority of its own. Its authority is exclusively derived from the profound respect with which the Conference is everywhere regarded by the Church at large. Earnest prayer was offered up on its behalf, that God would guide all its councils and frame all its decisions; and now that its session is an accomplished fact, however much opinions may differ as to some of the conclusions arrived at, yet surely all will agree that the Lambeth Conference of 1888 will ever stand forth pre-eminently in the future history of the Church.

First.—It demonstrates, as no meeting of the Anglican Communion ever before demonstrated, the essential unity of the English

By this unity I do not mean to emphasize the fact that the Episcopate of Canada met the Episcopates of India, Australia, Africa, China and of other lands, more or less remote; but I do mean to emphasize the significant circumstance, that the Conference was attended by upwards of twenty-nine Bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the United States. Political differences do, we all know, separate England from the great Republic. The huge stone wall of separation between the two countries is apparently cold and forbidding, but on either side the wall—as some one has beautifully said—grows the green living vine of the Church. Long have these two vines grown in immediate proximity to each other, but still separated by the wall; to-day they have overgrown the upmost limit of the wall. Their branches and tendrils haveintertwiped, and while England and the United States by reason of the wall are two, the members of our Communion by reason of the vine are absolutely and indivisably one. Their Bishops were there among us, not as strangers and foreigners, but speaking, acting, and voting as integral members of the body itself. I cannot indeed but think that the kindness, the open-handed hospitality and even enthusiasm with which they were received in England, will leave upon their minds an indelible impression which will operate in the maintenance of peace, and the cementing of those bonds of cordiality which should ever subsist between two nations who are one in the unity of blood, one in their love of freedom, one in the possession of that eternal truth which is revealed in the word of God.

Secondly.—The Lambeth Conference has declared the earnest desire of the English Church to promote the reunion of the various bodies into which the Christianity of the English speaking races is divided.

Whatever may be said concerning the past, the Church of England is now proclaiming her fixed intention of doing, with the blessing of God, all within her power for the promotion of organic unity and peace. The resolution passed by the Conference on this point was as follows:

"That this Conference earnestly requests the constituted authorities of the various branches of our Communion, acting as far as may be, in concert with one another, to make it known that they hold themselves in readiness, to enter into brotherly Conference (such as that which has already been proposed by the Church

"in the United States of America) with the representatives of other "Christian Communions in the English speaking races, in order to con-"sider what steps can be taken either towards corporate reunion, or "towards such relations as may prepare the way for further organic "unity hereafter."

The deep significance of this utterance is not to be overlooked. It teaches us that the Anglican Communion in seeking unity, would begin first of all with those who in many respects are most closely allied to herself; I mean the great non-comforming bodies into which our common Christianity is divided. The Christians who agree with us in holding the inspired Book of God as our only authority in matters of faith; who generally without addition or subtraction, are willing to subscribe all the articles of our Nicene Creed; who in the lives of many of their professors have exhibited such rapture of spirit and holiness of walk as to demonstrate God's presence among them in verity and truth; these, I say, are the people of all others who are most closely and intimately connected with ourselves; and it is in reference to these that the Church requests the "constituted authorities" of the various branches of our Communion to publish it far and wide that she is ready to enter into brotherly conference in order to consider what steps can be taken towards a true corporate reunion.

Thirdly.—The Lambeth Conference has demonstrated the desire of the Anglican Communion to hold converse and fellowship with all those who are willing to meet her on friendly terms.

To the Greek Church, the Conference desired to express the hope that the barriers to fuller Communion may be, in course of time, removed by further intercourse and extended enlightenment.

The Archbishop was requested to appoint a committee to consider our relations with the Unitas Fra!rum or Moravians. Sympathy was expressed with the old Catholics of Austria; with the struggling Reformers of Italy, France, Spain and Portugal; whilst with reference to the Scandinavian Church, the Conference was of opinion that earnest efforts should be made to establish more friendly relations with it; and that approaches on the part of the Swedish Church, with a view to the mutual explanation of differences, would be most gladly welcomed, in order to the ultimate establishment, if possible, of intercommunion on sound principles of ecclesiastical polity.

Fourthly.—The Conference has vindicated the character of the Church as a witness for the truth. It has grappled with the question of Polygamy as seen among the barbaric nations of the earth, and has endeavored to lay down a definite rule by which our Missionaries are to be guided when polygamist converts present themselves as candidates : has been en against the than those i the sacred o but strongly

progress and increased activity. It gives me pleasure to say that the Mission Fund debt has now been reduced to the small sum of \$500, an amount so insignificant that, to use the language of the Secretary-Treasurer, the debt is to-day practically extinguished. The receipts this year are in excess of those of last, and would be far more than they are, were it not for the very reprehensible habit indulged in by some, of neglecting, in an almost wholesale manner, the various offertories appointed by the Synod. When these omissions amount, as they usually do amount, to several hundred in the year, it is easy to see the very grave and irremediable loss which is suffered by the Diocese at large.

I think it only fair to state, in this connection, that while many of our clergy omit the collections from the wrong impression that their people are being too frequently solicited, yet there is another view of this subject which they would do well to take, and that is the following: That, irrespective of the loyalty which every clergyman is bound to show toward his own Diocese, and which loyalty should ever lead him to say that "Where his Synod commands, his duty is to obey," irrespective, I say, wholly of this consideration, there is this thought, that there must be in the ery congregation some to whom it is a real pleasure to give, be the amount never so little which they have to bestow, toward the offertory appointed by the Synod. They are therefore debarred, and, I think, wrongly debarred, by the nonaction of their clergyman from giving toward an object which has enlisted their sympathy and support. In concluding this subject, I may say that, if a clergyman announces a collection and there is no response whatever, he at least has done his duty, it is the people who are indifferent to the cause, but if he himself absolutely fails to give out any notice whatever, then, I think, not only the Synod, but the people themselves, have a just cause of complaint.

THE SUPERANNUATION FUND.

As this is a fund in which at least the clerical section of the Diocese is deeply interested, I will call your earnest attention to the amendments proposed to be made in Canon XXI. As you cannot too jealously guard a fund of such immense value as this, I trust that its various clauses will be carefully and attentively weighed before any conclusion is finally arrived at.

CONFIRMATIONS.

Between July, 1887, and June, 1888, I have confirmed 2,192 candidates. In addition to these, there were 93 more, kindly confirmed for me by the Bishop of Niagara, on an occasion when I was too indisposed to be present. The proportion for the year was as follows: Males 827, females 1,458, total 2,285. I may add that, during the five years of my Episcopate, there have been confirmed 8,011 candidates, all of whom, with the exception of the 93 above alluded to, were confirmed by me separately and individually.

NEW CHURCHES.

I have much pleasure in saying that the following new Churches have been built and opened:

1. In February last I opened St. Paul's Church, Southampton, an exceedingly neat and commodious building, reflecting great credit on the Clergyman, the Rev. T. L. Armstrong, and his congregation for their zeal and good taste.

- 2. In May last I laid the toundation stone of St. George's Church, Hamburg. This Church was subsequently opened by the Commissary during my absence. Great praise is due to the Rev. J. Edmonds and his faithful congregation there for their zeal in this work. Their numbers are few, and surrounded as they are by a vast German population, the difficulty of bringing their work to a successful termination was great. I must give them a high and well-merited meed of praise.
- 3. In October, 1887, a beautiful new Church was opened at Glanworth, displacing the old wooden structure of many years' standing. Christ Church, Glanworth, is an exceedingly handsome structure, built after designs of Mr. Craddock, of this city, and reflects great credit on the devoted congregation there, who, with their minister, the Rev. Clarence Ball, worked zealously for its erection.
- 4. On the 8th of January I opened a remarkably neat and commodious Church at Comber, called the Church of the Ascension. As the Church of England has never had a building in this place before, great praise is due to the earnest members of the flock there, who, with their late devoted pastor, the Rev. T. H. Brown, brought the work to its present completion.
- 5: Trivett Memorial Church.—This remarkable and beautiful Church, built entirely at the expense of Mr. Trivett, of Exeter, and whose foundation stone I laid in August, 1887, is now, God willing, to be opened for Divine service on Sunday, December 23rd. In order

In Mr. Trivett's name, as Chairman of the Building Committee and as Bishop of the Diocese, I extend to you all a hearty invitation to be present, not only to enjoy and be edified by the service, but to show your loving appreciation of Mr. Trivett's noble and open handed liberality in erecting so splendid a Church to the glory and praise of God.

- 6. St. John's Church, Desboro.—This handsome and commodious Church has been erected by the indefatigable labors of the Rev. T. H. Fairlie and his devoted congregation. I may say that Mr. Fairlie has shown the most praiseworthy zeal and consecration in his vast and important parish, which will soon imperatively require sub-division.
- 7. St. John the Evangelist, London.—This extremely handsome Church has been erected by the self-denying labors of the Rev. Principal Fowell and the members of his late flock. The congregation of the new Church is that which lately worshipped in the Chapter House, but in historical continuity is the same as that which formerly occupied St. John's Chapel, in connection with Huron College. The new Church is a credit to their zeal and energy.
- 8-9. A new Church has also been built and opened by the Rev. G. C. Mackenzie, Rector of Grace Church, Brantford, at Terrace Hill, in the immediate vicinity of the city. Mr. Mackenzie deserves great praise for the zeal and energy which he has displayed, not only in the erection of this Church, but also in the projection and completion of another at Holmdale, which I am to open, God willing, on Sunday, December 16th. It is well when leading and powerful Churches set an example of expansion and increase.
- with his accustomed zeal and devotion, has rented and will, I trust, soon secure a really splendid building situate in a densely populated district, lying to the south of the Memorial Church. The rector, by means of a student, now supplies this Church with two services on the Lord's Day and one during the week. I sincerely trust that this valuable property may soon be secured to the Church.

ST. PAUL'S CATHEDRAL.

I desire to explain to the Synod the position of St. Paul's Church, London, as the Cathedral Church of the Diocese.

As the matter is one of public interest, I will read the deed of agreement in its entirety, only prefacing my remarks by saying that its terms are mainly a copy of what is now known as the " Montreal Agreement," a compact which is gradually becoming the model for all Churches having a dual capacity.

Agreement made and entered into the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven.

Witnesseth, that the parties hereto are agreed that the Bishop shall constitute the said Church of St. Paul, the Cathedral Church for the time being of the said Diocese of Huron, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter contained, and the Bishop doth hereby ordain and declare the same accordingly.

I The Bishop shall, without previous notice, take such part in the services of the Church as he may desire. And upon at least four days previous notice to the Rector, or his representative for the time being, occupy the pulpit of the said Church and preach; provided that such notice shall not be given more frequently than twice in any month.

2. The Bishop may, upon due notice to, and the concurrence of the Rector or his representative for the time being admit or introduce any clergyman to preach or officiate in the Church.

3. Upon the occasion of a visitation, ordination, confirmation meeting of the Synod, public thanksgiving or fast, the services of the Church shall be under the direction of the Bishop. On such occasions the Bishop shall assign seats to the Clergy, but the Rector shall have at all times a right to his own seat.

4. If at any service the Archdeacons, Canons, or any of them are present, they shall occupy such seats as the Bishop shall appoint.

5. The assistant ministers of the Church shall be nominated to the Bishop by the Rector, but shall not officiate therein until duly licensed by the Bishop.

6 The Bishop shall, on giving due notice, have the use of any vestry or schoolroom connected with or appertaining to said Church for any meeting he may desire to hold, provided the same has not been appointed for any parochial purpose at that particular time.

7. The Rector and Church Wardens agree to make all proper provision for the conduct of all such services as the Bishop may appoint under section "3" above.

8. Nothing herein contained shall be taken or read to deprive the Bishop or his successors of the right at pleasure to make and constitute any other Church within the said Diocese of Huron to be the Cathedral Church of the said Bishop and his successors, in the place and stead of the Church aforesaid.

APPOINTMENTS.

Throughout the past year I have made the following appointments, which I now formally announce to the Synod:

First, to the Deanery of Huron.—As Rector of the Mother Church of the Diocese, and as one entitled by his position, his years and his character, to the office, I have collated the Rev. George M. Innes, M.A., to the Deanery of Huron, vacant by the death of the late Very Rev. Michael Boomer.

Secondly, to the Archdeaconry of Grey.—To this dignity I have collated the venerable A. H. R. Mulholland, Rector of St. George's Church, Owen Sound. As the Archdeacon has now been working in the area covered by the Diocese of Huron for nearly forty years, having been ordained in the year 1849, and, what is more to the point, has been in one parish throughout this immense period, his record of service deserves the praise of the Diocese.

Thirdly and Fourthly, as two positions in the Chapter became vacant by the preferment of the Very Rev. Dean Innes and the Venerable Archdeacon Mulholland, I collated to these vacancies the Rev. A. S. Falls, who has, with so much acceptance and ability, labored in this Diocese since 1859; and the Rev. Evans Davis ordained in 1871, whose burning zeal and entire consecration are the admiration of all who know him.

RURAL DEANERIES.

As regards Rural Deaneries, I wish it to be distinctly understood that I purpose, God willing, making from the present a change in the manner of their appointment. The plan I have adopted, and which is, in the main, similar to that pursued in a neighboring Diocese, is as follows:—

On a Rural Deanery becoming vacant, I will request the Archdeacon of the District to summon a meeting of the Ruri-decanal Chapter, as at present constituted, that is to say, consisting of Clergy, Churchwardens and lay representatives. At this meeting the Archdeacon will preside. It will be his duty to call upon the members present to elect by ballot the Clergyman whom they desire should occupy the office of Rural Dean. Upon his election being declared it shall be his duty to transmit the name to me, and then, if there be no reason to the contrary, I will appoint the Clergyman so elected by giving him a commission under my hand and seal. In other words, I give to the Chapter the nomination, reserving the actual appointment to myself.

As regards the duties of Rural Deans and other functionaries

the question is one of great difficulty and must be handled with becoming delicacy; as, however, a committee of the Provincial Synod has been struck to consider the whole matter in all its bearings, I trust that something both uniform and satisfactory may soon be arranged for the well-being of this part of our internal economy.

HURON COLLEGE.

As this College is now, with the blessing of God, greatly prospering under the able and judicious care of the Rev. Principal Fowell, I trust it will receive the full and hearty support of the entire Diocese. The great and pressing want of the day is earnest, consecrated young men—men full of faith and of the Holy Ghost. Most earnestly, therefore, would I urge you, if you know of such, to press them to enter, and without delay, this noble institution, where, under its able Principal, their spiritual life will be developed and their minds enriched with treasures both new and old.

THE WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

I cannot too earnestly commend this good work to you; nor can I too frequently say that just in proportion as we give out do we receive in return. The Women's Auxiliary of this Diocese is doing a great and noble work, and I trust that the Clergy will give it their hearty and cordial support.

UNION WITH OTHER CHRISTIAN BODIES.

As you are well aware, a deep and widespread movement is now on foot to consider the question of union with other Protestant Bodies, and while I am not in a position to say much, I may say this, that you who have studied our Lord's most emphatic words concerning unity, must see how supremely important it is, that we should do all in our power to bring about so holy and glorious a result. Let me urge you, therefore, to remember this subject at throne of grace, and earnestly to pray that He who is our Great High Priest within the veil, may fill us all with the Spirit of Unity and Peace; and by making us in absolute union with Himself, make us in absolute union one with another.

THE QUIET DAY.

I held in February last a Quiet Day with the Clergy, my object being the quickening and deepening of our spiritual life—the bringing us nearer our risen Lord, and the making us to realize how infinite is His glorious fullness to supply to the uttermost all our need. I cannot indeed say, dear brethren, whether you received benefit or only say the day could hardly be without some stimu-

And now, trusting that God will guide us to a right judgment in all things, and will lead us to those conclusions which will most advance His own glory and the Kingdom of His *dear Son, I will conclude by expressing the hope that if this be one of the shortest sessions of Synod, it may be one most beneficial for good.

The Executive Committee herewith submit their annual report :

DIOCESAN INCOME.

- 1. The Committee are glad to be able to record a considerable increase this year in the amount of moneys received from the Diocese as annual income, the total being \$18,744.40, a gain of \$2,902.69, as compared with last year.
- 2. The increasing interest in the cause of Mission work beyond the borders of our Diocese is a most encouraging feature, and cannot fail to bring a direct blessing on our own more immediate home operations.
- 3. In this good work the Committee feel that much is due to the zeal and energy of the Women's Auxiliary. The Committee desire to carl special attention to the generous and persevering efforts of Mrs. Boomer, who so successfully organized and carried out to completion her Jubilee Offertory for the Missionary Diocese of Algoma, which realized \$1,032.34 from the Diocese of Huron.

4. CLERGY MAINTENANCE AND MISSION FUND.

The overdraft of this Fund, which, at last Synod, amounted to \$4,916.48, has been reduced to \$535.08, and may, therefore, be now considered as fairly extinguished.

The practical working of the Clergy Maintenance and Mission Fund Canon has, so far, been most successful, and although, in one or two cases, difficulties have arisen, as might naturally be expected, yet your Committee feel satisfied that if administered with due regard to its spirit and intention, the operation of the Canon will prove most beneficial to the best interests of the Diocese.

At the September meeting of the Committee action was taken as follows:

The Chairman, Rev. W. A. Young, presented the following report:

To the Executive Committee of the Diocese of Huron:

The Committee appointed at the June meeting of the Executive Committee "to consider and bring in a plan for the distribution of the London Surplus Recorial Income so soon as the judgment of the Court of Appeal has been pronounced," beg to report as tollows:

I. That the Court of Appeal for Ontario pronounced judgment in the case about the first day of July last past, unanimously sustaining the judgment of Mr. Justice Ferguson, and confirming the decree with the variation that reference to any additional Incumbents within the Township of London, whether they should be entitled to share or not, was to be omitted.

2. That the Committee held a preliminary meeting, all the members being present except Mr. Grey, in London, on the 8th day of August, and having before them the resolutions of the Executive Committee and the judgments of the Courts, agreed to notify the various Incumbents and Churchwardens of all the Churches within the Township of London, that the Committee would sit again on the 15th day of August, at the Chapter House, London, and would then be prepared to hear anything that those claiming to share might desire to urge in reference to the principle of distribution or as to the p oportion of the surplus to be allotted to each.

That pursuant to such resolution and notice the Committee met in London, at the Chapter House, on the 15th day of August, and heard either personally or by their representatives all the I cumbents of the Churches within the Township of London, and the Churchwardens of the same, with the exception of the Rector and Churchwardens of St. John's Church, London Township, who did not appear.

4. That the Committee find from the evidence before them, including copies of the patent granting the endowment and of the various Acts and judgments dealing with it, that the endowment was granted

(a). For the spiritual welfare of all the Crown's "loving subjects," within the Township, and

(b). To attain this end-for the support and maintenance of a Protestant clergy duly ordained according to the rites of the Church of England.

To the Right Reverend Maurice Scollard Baldwin, D.D., Lord Bishot of Huron.

RIGHT REVEREND FATHER IN GOD, -We, the Clergy and Laity of the Diocese of Huron in Synod assembled, are pleased with this opportunity of making known to your Lordship our gladness of heart on your safe return to your Diocese, and our gratitude to Almighty God who, in His kind Providence, has brought you once more to our midst. We rejoice that your Lordship had the opportunity and pleasure of attending the Lambeth Conference of Bishops, conceded to be the most important council in the history of the Church, and we have no doubt but that we, as a Diocese, will reap the benefit arising from your Lordship's co-operation and intercourse with such an august body of divines. We are pleased to add our testimony at this time to what is already admitted as a fact, that the Diocese as a whole is in a most prosperous state financially and spiritually, which is greatly owing to your Lordship's ability and devotion in the work entrusted to you. We now desire to assure your Lordship that it is our purpose and privilege to stand by you and uphold your hands in the work of our common Lord in the Church so dear to us all. We regret exceedingly to have learned of the ill-health of Mrs. Baldwin, but we are pleased to hear of decided improvement since her return; and we fervently hope and pray that she will soon regain her usual good health so as to enable her to engage in those benevolent and Christian works which are so dear to her. It only remains for us to state that we are rejoiced at your Lordship's expression of pleasure on your return to your Diocese, there to remain so long as the Lord is pleased to spare you and give us your valuable fostering care and oversight.

The Committee on Sunday Schools beg to submit the following report:

- 1. The depository has been re-opened, and a supply of prayer books, library and prize books obtained from the S. P. C. K. and R. T. S., at the former reduced rates.
- A selection of suitable hymns for Sunday Schools has been made from the Hymnal Companion, and printed in cheap and convenient form.
- 3. At the invitation of the Bishop of Toronto a meeting was held in Toronto in September, 1887, of delegates from the Sunday School Committees of the various Canadian Dioceses, to organize an Inter-Diocesan Sunday School Conference, at which meeting the Very Rev. Dean Innes, Rev. E. C. Saunders and Mr. Chancellor Cronyn attended on behalf of this Diocese. In November, 1887, the first meeting of this Conference was held in Toronto, at which representatives from several of the Dioceses were present. The Conference recommended:
- a The publications of the Church of England Sunday School Institute as a basis of a uniform scheme of Diocesan Sunday School lessons to be adopted by the Church of England in Canada.

Your Committee would point out that these publications have been for several years the authorized basis of Sunday School teaching in this Diocese.

b The following course of lessons for a term of three years, beginning Advent, 1888:

SCRIPTURE LESSONS.

1st Year. Lessons on the Collects. 2nd Year. Lessons on the Catechism. 3rd Year. Lessons on the Prayer Book.

The Conference further recommended that a series of simple lessons for junior classes on the Scripture subjects embraced in the above scheme (similar to the illustrated "Leaflets for the Little Ones," issued by the Rev. Henry Holland), be prepared by a Joint Diocesan Committee to be appointed by this Conference.

A detailed scheme was also adopted for the first year, beginning Advent. 1888.

- c That examinations be held annually for teachers and scholars as follows:
- "I. With a view to encouraging as many as possible to become students and candidates, the Committee recommend the division of subjects into classes adapted to two grades of teachers and two grades of scholars.
- "2. That the subjects of examination be those of the Sunday School Institute scheme for each year respectively.
 - "3. That the examination be held annually in the month of December."
- d A Committee was appointed to prepare a set of "Leaslets for the Little Ones," and to make arrangements for their illustration. No action has as yet been taken by this Committee.
- e At a subsequent meeting of the Inter-Diocesan Committee in Montreal in April last, the question of issuing leaflets prepared by the Committee was considered, but no action was taken, consequently there are at present no leaflets issued under the authority of this Committee, each Diocese and school being free to adopt its own.

Canon XXI. On Superannuation.

As passed, the former Canon being repealed.

In order to provide for the administration of the Superannuation Fund; be it enacted as follows, viz.:

I. Every clergyman of ten years and over active service in the Diocese of Huron, and not being under ecclesiastical censure, shall be entitled to share in the benefits of the Superannuation Fund, according to the provisions of this Canon.

II. Every clergyman who shall be placed on the list of superannuated clergymen shall receive an annual allowance of \$300.00, and an additional sum of \$15.00 for each and every year above ten years of active service in the Diocese, but in no case shall the said allowance exceed in the aggregate the sum of \$600.00, including the amount paid to the original commuted Clergy: Service in the Diocese of Toronto previous to the establishment of the Diocese of Huron to count.

Proviso: That no clergyman at present on the list of superannuated clergymen shall have his annual allowance reduced.

III. Any clergyman of less than ten years' service, unable from sickness or accident to continue duty, may have his case dealt with by the Executive Committee at their discretion.

IV. Every clergyman who desires to be superannuated must forward to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod an application in writing, setting forth the full particulars of his case. He must also procure a physician's certificate (said physician to be named by the Executive Committee), stating the causes which render him unfit for duty, and the Executive Committee shall, after due investigation, have power to place such clergyman upon the superannuation list of the Diocese.

V. Whenever it shall appear to the Bishop or the Executive Committee that the interests of the Church require that any Clergyman of the Diocese should from any cause be superannuated, a committee, to be appointed as hereinafter provided, shall have full power to enquire into such case, and if it shall appear to them that such clergyman ought to be superannuated, they shall report the case to the Executive Committee; provided, that no case shall be entertained by the Executive Committee unless it shall have been first brought before them in writing, signed by the Bishop, or by at least four members of the Executive Committee.

VI. The Committee of Enquiry shall consist of five Clergymen of the Diocese of not less than ten years' standing in Priests' Orders, two of whom may be named by the clergyman in question within one month after written notice, and three shall be ballotted for by the Executive Committee, unless the clergyman shall refuse to name the two, when the five shall be ballotted for. Such enquiry shall be beld privately, but a record of the proceedings shall be made in writing for the use, if required, of the Executive Committee, and on application in writing by the said clergyman, a copy of the proceedings shall be furnished to him.

VII. Any superannuated clergyman being under sixty-five years of age shall, if able, be subject to perform occasional clerical duties at the call of the Bishop, on payment of ordinary travelling expenses, or he may be placed in charge of such Parish as, in the opinion of the Bishop, he may be able to serve.

Canon XXVIII., On The Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

(Amendments as passed.)

When any Clergyman shall have been sentenced, under the Canon on the Discipline of the Clergy, to suspension or removal from the performance of clerical functions, he shall, ipso facto, forfeit all claim upon the Widows' and Orphans' Fund. Provided always, that if such suspension or removal be for less than five years, the sentenced Clergyman may, on his restoration, revive his c aim on the Widows' and Orphans' Fund by paying to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Synod all arrears of entrance money and annual subscriptions due by him at the time of or subsequent to the passing of sentence.

Should a Clergyman, sentenced to suspension or removal for a stated period not exceeding five years, die while under sentence, his widow and family shall be entitled to enjoy the benefits of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund on payment of all arrears, as required in the foregoing clause. But this clause shall not apply to any case in which sentence has been passed without such express limitation.



What ever progress has been made has been accomplished by my own individual efforts in my place, not written or spoken of elsewhere than here. We feel, however, that we have reached our limit of progress until we have a regular
