A TERRIBLE FIRE.

One of the most disastrous conflagrations within the memory of men now living occurred, in Prince William street on the morning of yesterday. It broke out in the cellar of the establishment occupied by Mr. M. C. Barbour as a dry-goods store, at about half past ten on Thursday evening. The engines were promptly on the spot, but the darkness of the night, and the heavy rain, which came down in torrents, made it difficult for the firemen to fight the flames as rapidly as was desired. Steadily it spread until about 3 o'clock on Friday morning, when it burst out in a rolling volume of flame and lit up the heavens in a golden glare. Meantime the fire brigade stood at their engines, like soldiers at their guns, and though walls fell and explosives broke the echoes and shrieks of wounded men filled the air, not a man stirred from his post or deserted.
