WHERE LIGHT IS MADE.

THE THREE STATIONS WHICH WILL BE COMPETITORS.

Something on the Advancement of Our Lighting System During the Past Year—The Pioneer Company Which Secured Two Light—The Electric Railway and Other Interesting Information.

Dalhousie was the first to demonstrate that electricity and lighting are the same—on the 10th of May, 1882. One month later Benjamin Franklin saw his famous kite at Philadelphia, and proved the fact for himself. The incredulous took many years to accept this proof, but, after all, electrical science was there at a very primitive stage. Even now, when its subtle influence has been adapted to hundreds of uses by man, it remains incomprehensible and mysterious. The most sanguine disciple of Franklin or Dalhousie could never have conceived the advancement to be made by the discovery of this one of nature's forces, and yet electrical appliances of every description, are today in common use. It would seem at the present time utterly impossible to dispense with the electric telegraph, the electric telephone, the electric light. Their novelty may, perhaps, have ceased to be a novelty, but their value to mankind can never diminish, and other and more applicable inventions take their place, a change which appears as yet far off.

The principal object, however, of the company is to furnish the power by which the railway will be operated. New cars will be put on the road, larger than those now used. These will be in charge of a conductor. No danger, whatever, is involved in the running of the electric cars as there is no possibility of a shock being sustained. The poles which will be used throughout the streets are exceptionally fine. They will be octagon shaped several feet up, and will taper to the top, round. Care will be taken in stretching the wire and painting the poles. The company, under such efficient management, should look for a prosperous future for it is their intention to give as good and as economical a service as any of their competitors. The incandescent light is claimed to have infinite superiority over gas. It is at least brighter, steadier, cleaner, and the indications are that it will be adopted generally for home and shop purposes. With three stations to fill, there is no necessity of St. John ever again being in darkness. We have the illuminating power, and with fair competition, the cost to the consumer of illumination will likely be materially decreased.
