Captain Kickliam succeeded in bringing on some provisions and some clothes of the rescued sailors, also a retriever dog. While the men were being got on board, the ships collided, and a portion of the Duncan's bulwarks on the port side was carried away. The rescued sailors were all safely landed here, whence they were despatched to the Dutch Consul in Halifax.
