## *Session Report.*

---

In presenting the Report for 1899, the Session has much to be thankful for and much to deplore. Of the hopes and plans with which we opened the year, some have failed and some have surpassed our expectations.

The attendance at the services has increased. While the morning service is satisfactory in this respect, the evening service and the prayer meeting need considerable growth both in numbers and power. These two meetings need more attention than any of the others, and the session commends them to the care and prayer of all our members.

In connection with our public worship the Session recommends :—

- 1 That parents keep their families with them in the family pew. To have boys or girls sitting away from their parents in the back seats of the church is injurious both to the service and to the young people themselves.

2. That people do not loiter in the lobby, but come into the church as soon as possible. To stand round and talk near the entrance robs the service of the quiet and solemnity which should characterize it, and sets a bad example to the younger element of our congregation.

We began the year looking for a decided spiritual uplift. The special meetings held in May contributed greatly to this. The power of the evangelist, the large attendance at the meetings and their deep spirituality, the unity between the denominations, the number who professed conversion and afterwards united with the

church, the new light and strength brought to our members, all combine to make the series one of the most remarkable experiences in our history.

At the same time two facts show that it was not as deep as at first expected :—

1 Our Missionary contributions have, on the whole, diminished. 2. Our members have not been stirred to that earnestness in seeking souls which ought to characterize a real revival. These defects must be remedied at once, if this movement is to result in as real an advance of God's kingdom as we desire.

The Cottage prayer-meetings have not been held as regularly as we expected, chiefly on account of the difficulty in getting suitable places for them. On the second line west, and at Elder Jas. McClure's they have been more successful than elsewhere. They will be carried on in the coming year as opportunity offers.

Of our different organizations the reports will say all that is necessary. In general, they are in good condition. But they all need a more practical interest and sympathy from the membership of the church.

Now as to the future :—

1. It is desirable to take measures to secure more regular Bible study in our home.

2. The Century Fund will call for earnest attention. The great blessings we have received should inspire us to make a great effort to wipe out our own debt and to give substantial aid to the common Fund.

3 We should aim at greater results both in numbers won to Christ, and in the consecration of our members to God for active service. Everywhere there are signs of a coming revival. When it breaks over the church we must be among the first to receive the blessing.

## Report of Board of Management.

In presenting the annual report for your consideration the Board of Management notices that the receipts from all sources are somewhat encouraging as they are larger than for the two previous years, but scarcely sufficient to meet the demands of all bills due.

At the beginning of the year there was a committee composed of the elders and managers appointed to wait on the members of the congregation to ask for a slight increase in their contributions so that there would be as much promised as the board thought would be necessary to meet all obligations, namely \$1486. The committee met with fair success in getting this amount promised, but at present all that was promised has not been received. Consequently there are a few bills unpaid, and the board kindly asks the members to increase their contributions a little, and also to make them weekly or as often as possible so that all demands can be met promptly and render it unnecessary to borrow money and pay interest which has occurred several times in previous years.

To enable the congregation to understand the financial position of the board, the treasurer was asked to make a quarterly statement to the congregation and the board claims that there was considerable benefit by doing so as there was considerable funds received after these statements.

There have been some repairs made to the church property, and the board wishes to express their thanks to the Bible Class for their assistance which enabled them to make such beneficial repairs to the church.
