

Steamer Eavestone May Have Been in Service of the British Admiralty, Which Would Make Sinking a Legal Act -Wilson Considering Calling of a Conference of Neutrals -War and Navy Departments Are Getting Ready For a

Washington, Feb. 6 .- An official report of the sinking of the steamer Eavestone and the killing of an American seaman, reached the state department today from Consul Frost at Queenstown. The ship was a provisional British collier.

The consul's message said: "Provisional British collier Eavestone sunk by shellfire from German submarine in vicinity of Fastnet yesterday (February 4). American negro, able seaman, Richard Wallace of Baltimore, killed during shelling of boat, just after left Eavestone. Details not yet available."
