

MAKE A CLEAN SWEEP.

Dawson's fire department is clearly from fire, the discovery is suddenly made that the firemen and the chies of the department are at complete loggerheads.

The former served notice unon the committee of the council, having the fire department in charge, that they will serve no longer under the present chief. The committee upon investi gation has found that no reasons exist for removing the chief, and in con sequence, the men with one accord have tendered their resignations.

The status of the affair briefly sum med up amounts to this: Either the chief must go; or the men must go, or the difficulty must be covered by making a clean sweep of everyone.

In the opinion of this paper the last proposition defines the course which should be pursued. The interest of the Nugget in the matter is the interest of the public generally We are desirous of seeing the city provided with fire protection which will as nearly as possible minimize the risk that every property owner assumes in this city.

So far as the members of the de partment are concerned, they submit ted their ultimatum to the fire com mittee which left that body scarcely any choice but to take the action oted above.

In consequence the firemen have resigned in a body and have asked to be relieved immediately. The Nugget believes that their wishes should be complied with, and further, is or the opinion that a change in the head of the department should be made at the same time.

The fact that the entire department has resigned rather than serve any longer under the present chief is proof positive that whatever the latter's other qulifications may be, he is not a success in the matter of handling

We submit therefore that the time is ripe for a reorganization of the department from the chief down. There is altogether too much at stake to waste time endeavoring to settle differences which events have already proven cannot be satisfactorily adiusted

The fire department needs new blood and the sooner a complete and radical change in the organization is made the better will the intersts of the city be served.
