THE QUESTION OF CHEAP WATER.

Some interesting statistics on the question of cheap water have been collected by Ald. Boustead, chairman of the city water works committee.

Mr. Boustead does not deny that parties whose water-rates are charged by meter are not paying more than their just proportion of the total amount consumed.

Just proportion of the total amount consumed, but he affirms that with two or three exceptions the citizens of Toronto pay their water at a cheaper rate than any city on the continent.

Mr. Boustead finds that in quantities of 100,000 gallons and under per quarter less is paid in Toronto than in either Cleveland, Toledo, Milwaukee, Buffalo, Rochester, Montreal or Chicago.

It is difficult to understand what Ald. Boustead expects to accomplish by his proposal to repeal the local improvement by-law, passed by the city council last year.

He has always been a strong advocate of that system, and has frequently of late expressed himself in favor of its introduction.

It will of course now be in order for Ald. Boustead to show how permanent roadways are to be secured without the adoption of the local improvement act.
