The Canadian Legation was inaugurated on 21 May 1929 following the arrival in Tokyo of Hugh Llewelyn Kennleyside as First Secretary and Chargé d' Affaires a.i.

It was formally closed on 7 Dec. 1941 consequent upon a state of war existing between Canada and Japan as of that date. The Canada-based staff of the Legation was to remain interred in Japan until its repatriation in Dec. 1942.

Following the end of the war, the appointment, in Tokyo, of a civilian Liaison Mission accredited to the Supreme Allied Commander, General McArthur USA, was authorised by Cabinet on 9 July 1946. With the subsequent signature of the Treaty of Peace with Japan, normal diplomatic relations were resumed and the Liaison Mission was transformed into an Embassy on 18 March 1950.

While the post of High Commissioner would remain vacant for the next four months, given the importance to Canada of the events then unfolding - the campaign leading to the referenda of 3 June and 22 July and their results - it was imperative for the Government in Ottawa both to continue to be informed on a regular and confidential basis of developments and to be officially represented in St. John's with the duly constituted authorities. As Acting High Commissioner, Mr. Bridle filled the bill admirably. For this reason, we have not hesitated to depart from the rule we had otherwise set ourselves of listing only those persons who had served six consecutive months as Head of Mission.

The Office closed down on 31 Mar. 1949 on the entry of Newfoundland into Confederation as the tenth province of Canada. Mr. Bursnell left St. John's on the same day to go into retirement.

A neutral country, Norway, which had so far avoided being dragged in the Second World War, fell victim of a German surprise attack on 9 Apr. 1940. On 10 Apr. King Haakon and the Norwegian Government left the country, eventually to take refuge in London for the duration of the war. Canadian-Norwegian relations were first established in that city with the accreditation in 1943 of Brigadier Vanier as Minister Plenipotentiary. Following the liberation of Norway on 8 May 1945 and the return of the King to Oslo on 7 June 1945, it was decided to place these relations on a more permanent footing with the establishment of permanent legations in both countries' capitals. Mr. Kearney was Canada's first resident Minister in Oslo.

In effect, Mr. McCarthy presented himself before the President without credentials. As Prime Minister Mackenzie King explained to the House on 25 Feb. 1941:

"A procedure somewhat different from that which is customary has been adopted in the case of Mr. McCarthy going to Washington. As a rule, a new minister presents the letter of recall of his predecessor and his own letter of credence. But as Mr. Christie will remain a Minister, although absent, it has not been thought necessary to have Mr. McCarthy present any letters of recall or letters of credence. The President of the United States and the Secretary of State are agreed that an oral communication by Mr. McCarthy, on his arrival, to the President who understands the special situation and approves of the arrangement contemplated, will suffice. Mr. Roosevelt who, as I have already mentioned, knows Mr. McCarthy very well, has informed me that he will be only too pleased to receive Mr. McCarthy with the full authority and status of Minister the moment he arrives in Washington, without any special letter of credence from his Majesty the King

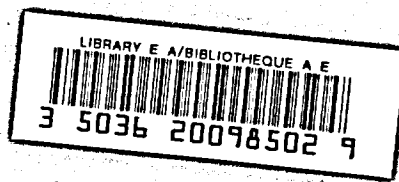
