For the first time since the investigation began James McKeen, associated with Mr. Hughes as counsel for the committee, conducted the examination to-day. Mr. McKeen, who has been studying the technical end of the investigation, opened outlining to Mr. McCall the power and scope of the committee and said its report to the legislature will in no way be limited by the

Mr. McCall was questioned as to surrender values, under the Massachusetts laws and also as to non-forfeiture laws. He said the first non-forfeiture law was known as the law of 1861 and was the result of a general demand that a policyholder should be remunerated for premiums paid if the policy was surrendered before its expiration. Mr. McCall said a company's surplus is earned by a lesser mortality than that assumed to be probable and also by securing the rate of interest on money and investments better than that counted upon in the actuaries' tables.
