MINUTES OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BAY OF  
QUINTE CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST  
CHURCH.

Held in the Town of Lindsay, Ont., commencing on  
Thursday, June 2nd, 1898.

## OBITUARIES.

### JAMES GREENER.

On Sunday afternoon, June 13th, the loving and much loved father Greener quietly passed through the veil into the holy of holies. He had lived eighty-five years, the last twenty-five of which in a superannuated relation were spent in Lindsay, where he had also served two several pastoral terms. He left no children in the flesh, but many will gather about him in that day when he may say, "Here am I and the children which thou hast given me." The wife of his youth, the affectionate and consecrated helpmeet of his home and his ministry, survives him, though in feeble health. James Greener was the son of a mining engineer, of Hepburn, County Durham, England, and was born April 4th, 1813. His parents were both devoted Christians and members of the Wesleyan Church, and his father an exhorter and class-leader for many years. The teachings of home and the class-meeting, which he regularly attended, gave him clear conceptions of a spiritual experience, and at nine years of age he sought and found the pardon of his sins. His conversion was on this wise. He obtained a copy of the first number of the *Wesleyan Penny Magazine* in the Sunday School, and in reading it found a story of the conversion of a boy who was seven years old. The Spirit of God applied that story, and he said, "That boy was converted at seven years, and I am nine, and not yet converted." He went in grief of soul to his own room, and prayed that God would be merciful and pardon him, and give him that peace. It came to him there and then, and he rose from his knees, and went to tell his mother, who rejoiced with him. The story of his Christian boy life, as written in his diary, is very interesting, but there is not room for it here. At nineteen years brother Greener was made a local preacher, and became at once very useful in this service. His preaching was very acceptable, and being a good singer, and having good tact in conducting meetings, he was given plenty of work. He learned the dry goods business, and having a good situation at twenty-two years of age, he married. His wife was Miss Jane Barron, "a pious and devoted Christian worker." For sixty-two years she was the light of his eyes, and the sunshine of his home, and a true helpmeet in his ministry. About three years after his marriage he was persuaded to start for America, and with a friend, also married, he sailed the sea for eleven weeks, and landed in New York. They went by boat to Albany, and leaving their wives they walked the whole distance to Montreal. Some weeks later, when navigation opened, Mrs. Greener took the journey by

boat and stage, and joined her husband in Montreal. That friend of the preachers and of Methodism, the late Hon. James Ferrier, met Brother Greener in the prayer-meeting, and discerning him as a man of God, at once opened his way to a business situation, which made him comfortable. Two years later a very fine business opportunity was set before him, and his friend Mr. Ferrier advised him to accept, but when he laid it before God it was forbidden. Immediately after this came a call from God and the Church to enter the ministry. It was to go out of the midst of abounding comforts to take care of a few scattered sheep in the wilderness, and without any definite promise of support. But he "conferred not with flesh and blood," and for three years amid much hardship, perils and poverty, he served the backwoods missions. Among the circuits where brother Greener labored are Perth, L'Orignal, Aylmer, Kemptville, Lindsay (two terms), Consecon, Waterdown and Newburgh. In 1872 he was compelled by broken health to superannuate, and made his home among the people of Lindsay, whom he much loved. During these years of retirement, he rendered good service to the Church; and the cause in Lindsay, now one of the most pleasant and best ordered congregations in Methodism, owes much to the wisdom and holy life of this man of God. Brother Greener was a diligent, systematic and earnest worker, a doctrinal and practical preacher of high order, and a wise administrator in the affairs of the church. He believed in entire sanctification as taught by Wesley, and lived it and preached it. He died as he lived, with a simple, sublime, satisfying trust in God, and consciousness of acceptance through the merits of Jesus Christ. A few weeks before his death the writer enjoyed the privilege of an hour with him, and it seemed as the ante-chamber to the celestial city, while the dear old man talked of "Christ precious now and forever." His body was laid to rest in Lindsay cemetery, where lies the dust of many preachers.

#### REV. JAMES KINES.

Rev. James Kines was born at Lockport, N. Y., November 13th, 1840, and died at Clifton Springs, September 8th, 1897. When a child he came with his parents to Canada and received his early education in the schools of Ontario, fitting himself for the position of teacher. He was converted when quite young in a special meeting held in Seymour by the late E. A. Ward, being the only convert of that meeting. His experience of conversion was so clear he could never doubt it, while his call to preach was equally distinct. In 1863 he was received as a candidate for the ministry on the recommendation of the Campbellford church. His probation was spent on Milford, Hungerford and Sidney circuits, with a year at Victoria College. He was ordained at Kingston in 1868 by Rev. Dr. Punshon, whose sermon on that occasion still lingers in the memory of many who heard it. After ordination Brother Kines was stationed at Hamilton East and afterward at Keene, Odessa, Wilton, Sherbrooke (two terms), Morrisburg, Montreal, Kingston, Carleton Place, Oshawa and Cobourg. His health began to fail when in Oshawa, but, strong in mind

and full of hope, he undertook the work in Cobourg, rendered heavy by the union of the two churches. Securing an assistant for a few months he sought rest, hoping for full recovery. The best medical skill was employed, but all to no avail. His work was done and the Master called him home. Brother Kines' ministry was marked by great evangelistic power. His earnest, soul-searching appeals seldom failed to carry conviction, and on all his circuits many owe their conversion to his powerful exhortations. A wise and careful administrator, a trusted adviser, a warm-hearted and sympathetic friend, he was beloved by all who knew him, and many are the regrets to-day that the Church has lost such a valued minister. As an executive officer his ability was fully recognized. Twice he was a member of the General Conference, and many of the important offices of the Church he was chosen to fill. In 1889 his brethren of the Montreal Conference conferred upon him the highest honor at their disposal by electing him President. His term of office was pre-eminently successful. As a temperance worker Brother Kines stood in the very front rank. He saw the necessity for fearless, aggressive work in the field, and hesitated not to take advanced ground. The religion Brother Kines preached to others he illustrated in his own life. Those who were privileged to enjoy an intimate friendship with him felt the refining influence emanating from a heart filled with the Holy Spirit. He not only preached Christ in the pulpit but in his daily life. His home life was particularly attractive. He was married in 1868 to Miss Butler, of Kingston, whose life is brightened to-day with the fondest memories of the past and most blessed hope for the future. His remains rest in Catarauqui cemetery awaiting the resurrection.

CONSTITUTION OF THE CONTINGENT FUND.

NAME.

1. This Fund shall be called the Contingent Fund of the Bay of Quinte Conference of the Methodist Church.

OBJECT.

2. The objects of this Fund shall be, (1st) To pay all contingent expenses in connection with the working of Conference and its committees; (2nd) To defray extraordinary expenses incurred in the service of the Church; (3) To relieve cases of special affliction. All applications for expenses incurred in the general work or for claims not otherwise specified shall be submitted to the Committee in detail for their investigation and approval.

SOURCES OF INCOME.

3. The sources of income shall be, (1st) A collection to be taken up on all the Circuits in the month of September in each year; (2nd) The public collections taken up at each Annual Conference; (3rd) Such amount as may be appropriated by the Billenting Fund Committee.

COMMITTEE.

4. The Conference shall elect seven ministers and seven laymen who shall compose the Contingent Fund Committee of this Conference.

(1) It shall be the duty of the Committee to consider all claims properly presented to it, and recommend appropriation to their proper objects, and report all their proceedings to the Conference;

(2) This Committee shall meet at the seat of Conference and appoint a chairman and secretary-treasurer from among themselves, and also two auditors, subject to the approval of Conference;

(3) It shall be the duty of the secretary-treasurer to keep a book in which he shall record the proceedings of all the meetings of the Committee, and the chairman of the Committee shall sign all orders upon the secretary-treasurer which have been authorized by the Committee;

(4) It shall be the duty of the secretary-treasurer to receive all moneys raised for this Fund from the financial secretaries of the Districts, and make such disbursements as have been authorized by the Committee;

(5) It shall be the duty of the auditors to examine the accounts of the secretary-treasurer annually, and present their report to the Committee.

REGULATIONS.

5. The superintendents of circuits shall remit to the financial secretaries of the Districts only all collections taken up on behalf of this Fund.

6. The financial secretaries shall pay over the money of this Fund to the secretary-treasurer not later than the day before the meeting of Conference.

7. All applications for grants from this Fund shall be presented to the Committee by the chairman of the District from which the claim is made, or by such other person as he may appoint to represent his District.

8. No application for aid from this Fund shall be entertained which

9. No application shall be entertained for medical expenses where the Circuit, has paid the minister a salary of \$700 and upwards, except in special cases when pressing necessities would warrant special appropriations.

10. Ordinary expenses for physicians' bills shall not be entertained.

11. The maximum amount allowed for funeral expenses shall be for the minister or his wife \$40, for children \$20.

12. The Secretary of Conference for each year shall order the necessary supplies for his successor in office.

13. In the matter of claims for ministerial supply on account of affliction or death, in no case shall the Committee consider any claims for more than the salary of a single unordained man.

14. The disbursements of each year shall not be in excess of the amount received except in extraordinary cases.

15. The chairmen of districts and superintendents of circuits and missions shall duly advise all who make application to this Fund of the existence of this rule.

#### REPORT OF THE SUSTENTATION FUND COMMITTEE.

Your Committee recommend that the Constitution of the Fund, as printed in last year's Minutes, be readopted and be printed in the Minutes of Conference for this year.

1. The object of this Fund shall be to augment the salaries of all ministers and probationers, in the active work in the Conference, who receive less than the following amounts: Ordained married men, \$600; ordained unmarried, \$350; probationers, \$300. These amounts in every case to include salary, board, fuel and horse keep.

2. The income of the Fund shall be the amounts received from offerings and special collections taken on all our circuits and missions.

3. The general management of this Fund shall be entrusted to a committee composed of one minister and one laymen elected to the Annual Conference by each Annual District Meeting when the laymen are present, and a ministerial secretary-treasurer elected by the Annual Conference on the nomination of the Committee, and who shall be convener of the Committee. This Committee shall transact all the necessary business in accordance with the following regulations:

- (a) In making grants from the Fund the Committee shall have strict regard to the aforementioned scale of allowances, except in the case of large families, when the Committee shall have the power to increase the allowance at their own discretion. No claim shall be entertained which has not first been presented by the Quarterly Board and recommended by the Annual District Meeting, and all Quarterly Boards presenting claims for recommendation shall declare their inability to meet their net deficiencies.

- (b) When the District Meeting deems it expedient, a committee shall be appointed to visit such circuits as ask for assistance, to inquire into their circumstances and report to the treasurer of the Sustentation Fund before the first session of said committee.
- (c) Should the income of the Fund in any year prove insufficient to meet the claims thereon, then the grants shall be so distributed as to make up the allowances of claimants to the same percentage according to the aforementioned scale. Should there be a surplus over the said claims, it shall be carried forward and included in the total income for the ensuing year.
- (d) A report shall be presented by the Committee to the Conference annually while in session, including a summary of the business transacted, and an audited statement of receipts and disbursements, and any suggestions deemed necessary to the interests of the Fund, said report as adopted by the Conference to be printed in the Minutes.

Claims amounting to nearly nineteen hundred dollars were placed before the Committee. The sum of \$503.00 was the total amount at the disposal of the Committee, and disbursed as follows, taking as a basis \$500.00 for married men and \$259.00 for single men, excepting in very special cases :

6. That permission be granted to the Trustees of the Bethany Church on the Myrtle Circuit to sell the said church and furnishings and transfer proceeds to Trustees of Myrtle Church.
7. That permission be granted to the Trustees of the Methodist burying ground at Brechin, on the Beaverton Circuit, to sell the same, with the understanding that the proceeds of sale be disposed of according to Discipline.
9. The old church on the Fifth Line, Tyendinaga township, on the Lonsdale Circuit, and the old parsonage on the same circuit, having both been sold by the official consent of the Rev. N. A. McDiarmid, as President of Conference, and the proceeds applied to the building of a new parsonage on the said circuit, without sanctioning the irregularity in this case, we nevertheless recommend that the above-mentioned consent be endorsed by this Conference.

### EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee respectfully submit the following report :

In reviewing the work of the year we are pleased to note that there is an increase of 21 Epworth Leagues, and 501 Epworth Leaguers as compared with last year. There is, however, a decrease in other young people's societies. Still, we hope that no real loss will be sustained for the lack of due care in the change of the name of our societies.

We very much regret that in the Junior Department there is a decrease of eight Leagues. This is, however, partially accounted for by union of circuits, and the fact that some Junior Leagues have changed to Mission Bands. We would emphasize the great importance of the Junior work, and urge all our workers to give more careful attention to the children, and we suggest that care be exercised in securing the Juniors as members of the adult Leagues.

We are pleased to report that the total receipts in the Leagues show an increase of \$683. The missionary contributions of our Leagues show a gratifying increase of \$601.26. This is to be attributed largely to the influence of the Forward Missionary Movement, our practical sympathy with which we hereby reaffirm. We commend the formation of "Pray, Study and Give" Bands in all our Leagues. We also respectfully request all our ministers to assist in every possible way the student representatives of the *Campaigner*. We recommend most heartily the adoption of the plan and programme of the Forward Movement in Evangelistic work and Bible study as prepared by our General Board, and respectfully request our ministers and Epworth League presidents to study the letter issued to them on the matter of the Executive Committee of the Conference League.

Believing that we should give to God at least one-tenth of income we urge upon the young people of our Leagues the recognition of this principle by incorporating its study in the programme of their services. We most heartily approve the plan adopted by the General Board in providing a course of reading yearly for our young people, and advise the formation of reading Circles wherever practicable in our societies.

Your Committee report that after reviewing the work in this most vital department, we find cause for rejoicing in the increases reported of schools 7, scholars 1,016, officers and teachers 96; also the phenomenal increase of our Sunday School periodicals of 13,327, making now an average of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  for each scholar in our schools. Still, there is room for increased loyalty to our own publications and book concern generally. We venture to urge the introduction of the *Methodist Magazine* into more of our schools, assured that the result would prove elevating to the literary tastes of the scholars, and would materially assist the worthy editor in reaching his ideal of a magazine of the twentieth century for the Methodist Church.

Your Committee would respectfully ask for the reintroduction of the note of assistance to the blackboard artist in our highly appreciated *Banner*.

The Home Class Department has proved itself an efficient auxiliary to Sunday School and Church work, and we recommend it for trial in connection with each school.

We very much regret a falling interest in the study of our catechism, especially as we now have therein such an excellent compendium or summary of doctrine.

We again urge as a privilege as well as a duty the educating of our young people up to the line of loyalty supporting the funds of our Church as named in this connection in the Discipline, Section 304.

We further recommend for the best results that all our schools be kept open the whole year.

We suggest that the attention of all our congregations be called to the various items of our report.

Your Committee recommend W. S. Gibson as Conference representative to the Provincial Sunday School Association, and Rev. D. Williams, Secretary-Treasurer for the ensuing year.

A vote of thanks was tendered the retiring Treasurer, Rev. D. O. Crossley, and Rev. G. H. Copeland was appointed to the office.

### TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee on Temperance beg leave to report as follows ✓

1. That we rejoice to find the Temperance sentiments and principles of our people continuing to develop, and to know that an opportunity is to be given to obtain an expression of the will of the electors of our Dominion upon the question of prohibiting the importation, manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes. We endorse the declaration of principles made by our last General Conference :

"That the liquor traffic cannot be legalized without sin, and that it is the duty of the civil Government to prohibit the trade in intoxicating drinks."

We believe our country is now ready to abandon this great national evil, and is therefore now ripe for an efficient prohibitory liquor law.

victims, directly opposed to the material, moral and spiritual progress of the world, and through its influence and effect always opposing the extension and advancement of the Kingdom of Christ; that it is directly responsible for the actual loss of at least many millions to our country by the destruction and misdirection of capital, of human life and of productive energy, besides causing the improper expenditure of \$40,000,000 which is paid annually for liquors consumed; that it is the cause of at least two-thirds of the crime and pauperism in our country, and the prolific parent of disease and insanity; and that any legislative measures which to a reasonable extent curtail this traffic will so increase the general prosperity of our country that the loss of customs, excise and license revenue will almost immediately be counterbalanced by the saving effected in criminal and other expenses, and the revenue from increased trade consequent upon the improved conditions of our country.

In the opinion of this Annual Conference the Government of the day would, if the Prohibition Plebiscite is carried, be justified in resorting to such means of raising the revenue as would be found necessary to make up any deficiency in the revenue of the country produced by a Total Prohibition Law.

3. That inasmuch as interested parties will doubtless leave no stone unturned to maintain the license traffic in all its present power and influence, we recommend that an energetic campaign of education be at once inaugurated, and respectfully suggest the following methods:

- (a) That all active ministers of this Conference preach at least two sermons on this subject prior to the taking of the Plebiscite vote.
- (b) That we secure the co-operation of all our Sabbath Schools and Epworth Leagues, and make this matter a special subject of prayer.
- (c) That we co-operate with Temperance societies and county organizations now formed, and charge ourselves, where necessary, with the responsibility of securing thorough organization in those counties and districts not now organized.
- (d) That Temperance workers, as far as possible, familiarize themselves with the various phases of this question by studying such books as "The Facts of the Case," "The Prohibitionist's Handbook," "The Temperance Primer," etc., all of which may be obtained at the Book Room.
- (e) That county organizations take steps to systematically distribute the many excellent books endorsed by the Dominion Alliance, and that Sabbath Schools distribute large numbers of *Pleasant Hours* and *Onward*.
- (f) That a systematic, wise, personal and energetic canvass be at once inaugurated among and by the membership of our Church.
- (g) That especial attention be paid to the registration of manhood suffrage voters under the proposed Dominion Franchise Act.

4. We sadly deplore the apparently increasing evil of cigarette smoking, and urge all workers for Christ to use their best efforts in combating and eradicating this pernicious and dangerous habit, which undermines the mental, moral and spiritual powers of its devotees.

5. We heartily sympathize with all Temperance organizations, and thankfully acknowledge communications from the Women's Christian Temperance Union and the Dominion Alliance, and we hereby assure them that they have our sympathies, prayers and support in their noble work.

6. We recommend all ministers to see that delegates are appointed by their various congregations and young people's societies to attend the Provincial Prohibition Convention at Toronto, July 5th, 1898, and that Revs. C. W. Watch and G. H. Copeland, and Messrs. E. D. O'Flynn and O. Hezzlewood be appointed as representatives from this Conference to the Council of the Dominion Alliance.

#### REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee on the State of the Work report as follows:

After a careful review of the work and a close examination of the statistics for the year, while we find much to encourage we also find something to regret. The increase in membership is 235. This number, though gratifying, is not so large as might have been expected in the circumstances. Whether this small figure is due to numerous removals, or to a rigid revision of church registers, or not, we do not know, but we would naturally have expected a greater growth during the year.

The increase in attendance of scholars in the Sabbath Schools, on the other hand, is very encouraging. The report shows an addition of seven new schools and an enrolment of ninety-six new teachers and 1,016 new scholars. We are glad to find that the depressed condition of the country has not seriously affected the missionary givings of our Church, for while the advance upon last year is not quite so great as the advance of last year upon the previous year, yet there is an aggregate increase in the income of the General and Woman's Missionary societies of nearly five hundred and fifty-nine dollars (\$559.00). There is also a small advance in the amount contributed to the Educational Fund of nearly ninety-eight dollars (\$98.00).

We regret to find, however, that while five young people's societies have been formed, there is a decrease in membership of 558. We also regret to notice a decline of \$993.50 in the total amount contributed towards ministerial support. We have not been able to ascertain the causes of this unfortunate deficiency, but the fact seems to be of sufficient importance to mention with regret.

The number of new subscribers to the *Christian Guardian*, we regret to say, is only 26, and a matter of still greater regret, in our opinion, is the fact that within the bounds of this Conference our Church paper is taken by only one person out of every fourteen members. It does seem to us as though it might and should receive a much wider circulation. In conclusion, we beg to submit the following recommendations:

of Districts by one at least, if not two or three. In our opinion Campbellford and possibly Tamworth District might be rearranged in the interests of the circuits, as well as of the men. Should such readjustment necessitate the lessening of the number of Chairmen, as it undoubtedly would, no injustice would be done to anyone, as there is nothing in our Discipline to imply that a man who is once a Chairman should always hold that office.

2. That the preaching places be rearranged. In our opinion we have too many small appointments, as well as too many Sabbath services. It would be a great advantage to the people themselves, as well as to the pastor in charge, if the number could be reduced.

3. That while we recognize the superficial and unsatisfactory character of the work of many travelling evangelists, nevertheless we realize the importance of evangelistic services, and, in our own opinion, much more might be accomplished by ministers on adjoining circuits combining for special work. We also think that a greater use might be made of the Sunday School, as a means of increasing the membership of the Church, if the teachers would talk from time to time with their scholars about the duty of taking a stand for Christ and of offering themselves for admission into the Church on public profession of their faith.

DEARLY BELOVED BRETHREN,—Grace, mercy and peace be multiplied unto you through our Lord Jesus Christ.

The ever-revolving wheels of time have brought us once again to our Annual Conference. You will be pleased to know that we have not labored in vain. The net increase for the year is 235. While we would have been grateful for a larger number gathered into the Church, yet it is a cause of thankfulness that, after making deductions for removals and deaths, we are enabled to report the number we have.

Looking back on the past we can say, "Hitherto hath the Lord our God helped us." We think of the present and our language is, "The Lord of hosts is with us and the God of Jacob is our refuge." Contemplating the prospects of the future we say from our hearts, "This God shall be our guide even unto death." Our Conference in the pleasant and prosperous town of Lindsay was one of pleasure and profit. Ministers and laymen alike impressed with a sense of the duties and responsibilities resting on them entered heartily into the work demanding their attention, and we trust the outcome will be increased usefulness in the service of our Master. Some who were with us a year ago have been called to the higher fellowship and loftier worship of the skies. We miss them, and our thought translated into words is:

"O, for the touch of a vanished hand,  
And the sound of a voice that is still."

We are still permitted to labor, and our prayer and hope and expectation is that we too may one day hear the "Well-done" of the Master as He accords us His warmest welcome and exalts us to His loftiest throne. The spirit of revival has been graciously present on not a few of our circuits, and many have been led to know and love the Christ whom to know is life eternal. And may we not confidently hope that the seed sown by those whose hearts have not been gladdened by visible results during the past year may in the coming year bring forth abundantly so that the sower and the reaper may rejoice together.

We cannot hide from ourselves the fact that this busy, bustling age is one of unrest, hence it behooves us to stand by those principles which

have remained unshaken through the years, and not to turn our sails to catch every breeze. We do not and dare not claim perfection even for our beloved Methodism, but her traditions, her genius and history are dear to us, and if we are only faithful to our trust she will continue to be in the future what she has been in the past—a mighty power in the hand of God for the moral and spiritual uplifting of the race.

While our churches are generally well attended yet there are too many who are careless and indifferent. It is the business of the Church to reach these by her sympathy and her work. To attempt to rectify the evils and redress the wrongs of our fellow-creatures without the influence of gospel teaching is certainly trying to build from the top.

The success of Methodism in the past has been unique, but to rest on the record of the past is to invite failure in the future. If our Church is to be vigorous and strong we must cultivate religion in the home. Neither church nor school can take the place of the home. See to it that cheerfulness, purity and piety are maintained in the home life. The home is the first form of the Church, and has an important influence on the children, the Church and the nation. Let true Christian principles be inculcated by precept and example, and those whom God has committed to our care will, in the coming days, look back and remember with gratitude the sacred influences that come down upon the worshippers around the family altar.

Our Sunday School work is being pushed with vigor. While the letter is taught the spirit of the truth is not forgotten. Our thousands of consecrated teachers are helping to mould character and to save souls. We cannot too strongly impress the necessity of a careful study of our Church catechism; next to teaching our young people to be Christians we want to make them loyal and devoted Methodists, able to give an intelligent reason for the hope within them. The Epworth League wisely directed is capable of becoming a great power for good. We need all the forces we can gather in the struggle against the powers of evil; the energy and enthusiasm of youth are required as well as the ripener experience of age.

Our connexional funds must be liberally sustained if we are to meet the ever-increasing demands upon us. God has given to our people as large a share of this world's goods as to those of any other church in the Dominion, and yet our givings are not as much per head as those of a sister denomination. We cannot afford to take any second place. If our mission work is to be made thoroughly aggressive there must be a fuller consecration and a larger liberality. The claims of China's mighty multitudes and Japan's teeming millions, as well as those of our French-Canadian brethren, the Indians in our own Province, in the North-West and on the Pacific coast, are pressing claims. The men on our Domestic Missions deserve and should have a larger remuneration for their work. Just now other churches are alive to the need of sending missionaries to the distant gold fields of the Klondike, and we should be ready to do our part so that Methodism may be well represented there.

The Sustentation Fund is such only in name. Some measures should be adopted so that substantial aid could be given to needy circuits and deserving men.

The Superannuation Fund commends itself to your generous support and sympathy. The amounts to which the aged and infirm are entitled should be paid in full, for in many cases the loss of a part of the annuity means hardship and trial.

Our school and colleges are doing a noble work for the Church in the education of our young people. Methodism was born in a university, and early in her history gave her people the benefit of such educational facilities as she could command, and the work she is doing to day along educational lines is work that will tell on the strength and stability of the Church of the future.

The temperance cause is one in which we rejoice to take an active part. For many years we have been looking forward with ardent hope that a prohibitory law might be secured. Now we are to have the opportunity of voting on the straight question, whether we shall have Prohibition or not. In this conflict we bespeak your most earnest efforts both by precept and example, by your prayers and your votes.

Let an earnest effort be made on the part of our ministers, our Sunday School teachers, our Epworth Leagues and other church officers to educate the children under their care in the physiological and moral effects produced by the use of tobacco and to discourage its use in every form.

The publishing interests of our Church were never more prosperous than now, and never more fully subserved the interests for which they were established. The importance of circulating sound and wholesome literature cannot be overestimated. Our publishing house in Toronto is an important factor in the religious influences which uplift and ennoble the heart and mind of our people. Especially is this true of its periodical literature which comes week by week to tens of thousands of homes brightened by the influence of our earnest Christianity. The *Guardian* and the *Magazine* deserve and should have a much larger circulation. Our Sunday School papers are unsurpassed, and loyal to our Church and country, and we are persuaded that our Methodist schools which import their papers from the neighboring Republic are making a serious mistake. If it be true that a few cents may occasionally be saved it must be admitted that these papers are decidedly American in their make-up and often un-Methodistic in their teaching. And it is well to remember that a very large share of the profits realized come back to us as a Church. An important duty of this Conference has been the selection of delegates for the approaching General Conference. We ask the prayers of the congregations on behalf of the brethren upon whom the responsibility of representing the Church in that important assembly devolves, that they may be blessed with a large measure of the spirit of God and that they may be endued by that wisdom which cometh from above which is profitable to direct and guide into all truth. Praying that the coming year may be one of great numerical, financial and spiritual prosperity, we now commend you to God and to the word of His grace which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance among them which are sanctified.
