There he found a powerful dark bay horse all saddled and bridled for assisting his flight, his wife having omitted none of the details in making preparations for securing her husband's liberty. The keeper seized a large dragoon pistol and started in pursuit. Stopping, he took aim and fred at White, who ducked down on the saddle and threw himself under the horse's neck in such a way as to expose only his left leg and arm. Taking aim the second time, the cap snapped, seeing waich White raised up and levelled a pistol as if intending to fire, but changing his mind, gave one yell of triumph and, waving the pistol above his head, disappeared from Memphis, perhaps forever.
