

	Brethren,
P. M.	By the blessing of the Great Architect of the Universe we are permitted to meet at this our Tenth Annual Communication for the purpose of closing the work of

one Masonic year and to commence the labors of another. I have much pleasure in meeting you and I trust that our united deliberations may be gratifying to ourselves and beneficial to our beloved order for whom we meet to legislate.

The interests of the Craft in this province are for the time being entrusted to our care, and though our jurisdiction is small and our numbers few, still I feel sure we shall be none the less mindful of the sacred trust committed to our keeping.

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Nothing of particular note in Masonry has taken place in this province since we last met; a feeling of harmony and brotherly love prevails, which I hope may long continue.

In common with every loyal and well disposed inhabitant of this Dominion, we all, I am sure, deeply deplore the unfortunate outbreak which has taken place in the North West Territories, and although it is happily, to all appearance, nearly crushed out, still we have to lament the death of many brave men who have fallen in defence of the laws of our common country. Many members of our order were amongst the first to go to the front from the different provinces of the Dominion, amongst whom I may name, M. W. Bro. General Laurie, Grand Master of Nova Scotia. Some of our Brethren have been killed in the conflict and to their afflicted friends we tender our heartfelt Masonic sympathy.

In the past year the Grand Lodge of Virginia, sustained a loss in the death of M. W. Grand Master, Bro. Henry William Murray, who died on the 15th August, 1884.

A commission was issued appointing R. W. Bro. Hon. William Ross, of Halifax, to be the representative of this Grand Lodge near the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia, to fill the vacancy created by the death of our late representative R. W. Bro. Henry Shaw.

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Ion. this tia, late I have issued a dispensation to Bros. Roderick McNeill, M. D., George B. McKay, Daniel Sutherland and a constitutional number of other Brethren to form a new Lodge at Stanley Bridge to be called "Prince Edward." This Lodge opened under most favorable auspices and I learn a new Masonic Hall has been erected which is expected to be ready for use during the present summer. The zeal and earnestness manifested by the Members of Prince Edward Lodge augurs well for its future prosperity.

A dispensation has been issued to St. George's Lodge No. 4, authorizing the election of the W. M. for a third year.

A dispensation has also been issued to Zetland Lodge No. 7, for a like purpose.

I appointed R. W. Bro. Neil McKelvie to visit King Hiram and Mount Zion Lodges, R. W. Bro. Wm. T. Hunt to visit Mount Lebanon Lodge, R. W. Bro. Thomas H. Pope to visit Alexandra and Zetland Lodges, R. W. Bro. Thomas A. McLean, to visit True Brothers Lodge and R. W. Bro. Albert Aitken to visit St. Andrew's Lodge.

The bye-laws of Victoria Lodge No. 2, have been submitted and approved of.

I was asked, "Has a Lodge power to grant demits to Entered Apprentices or Fellow Crafts for the purpose of affiliating with another Lodge?" My reply was, No a demit cannot be granted to Entered Apprentices or Fellow Crafts, but the Lodge may request or give consent to another Lodge to finish the work but the Brother would be a member of the Lodge so requesting or consenting and all fees would have to be paid such Lodge.

Another question asked was, Can a Lodge working under dispensation affiliate Brethren? To which I answered, "No."

The Brethren in our sister jurisdiction of New Brunswick held a celebration of the Centennial Anniversary of the introduction of Freemasonry into the Province of New Brunswick, in the city of St. John, on the first day of July last. An invitation was courteously extended to me to be present and participate in the cermonies on that occasion, but unfortunately pressing business engagements obliged me to decline.

Before closing this brief report of my doings for the past year I begonce more to thank you all for the kind and fraternal treatment which you have on all occasions extended to me.

May the Divine Blessing rest upon us and may we strive to practice the precepts and virtues inculcated by our order.

GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT.

To the M. W. Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island:

I herewith submit my Annual Report.

As soon as possible after the Annual Communication of 1884, I had the proceedings printed and forwarded to all the Officers and Members of the Grand Lodge, also to all foreign Grand Lodges.

By direction of the M. W. Grand Master and on petition of a Constitutional Number of Master Masons residing at or near Stanley Bridge, a Dispensation was granted empowering them to open a Lodge at that place, to be called Prince Edward, U. D.

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ers and es. ion of a Stanley open a The Minute Book and Bye-Laws have been received and will be handed to the Committee on Lodges, U.D., to report thereon, and an application will be made for a Charter.

I also by order of the M. W. Grand Master, issued dispensations to St. George's Lodge, No. 4, and Zetland Lodge, No. 7, granting them leave to elect and install their W. Masters for a third year. Dispensations were also issued to St. John's Lodge, No. 1, and Victoria Lodge, No. 2, to hold a special communication for the purpose of receiving reports of Committees appointed to obtain a more suitable Hall for the use of the Masonic Bodies in Charlottetown, and to act thereon; also other reports on Masonic business.

By direction of the M. W. Grand Master a Commission was issued appointing R. W. the Honorable William Ross, of Halifax, N. S., the representative of this Grand Lodge near the M. W. Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia, to fill the vacancy created by the death of R. W. Henry Shaw, of Kentville, N. S.

I annex a statement of cash received during the year showing the amount to be \$281.76.

I also annex an abstract of returns received from the Lodges and regret to say that there has been a falling off of membership. During the year there have been raised 33, admitted 2, reinstated 2, making 36 new members against which 15 have demitted, 23 have been suspended for non payment of dues. 5 are reported missing and 1 died, making in all 44; and we as have had no returns from Orient Lodge at Souris, for some years, we loose 18 members by that Lodge.

I cannot close this report without expressing my thanks to the Deputy Grand Master, Brother Wakeford, for his kindness during the year in giving me assistance and information. I was five years out of harness and upon entering into to the duties of Grand Secretary last year, I was rusty, and I was not backward in applying to Brother Wakeford when I wanted advice or assistance.





RESTORATION.—A brother who has been indefinitely suspended, can be restored to membership by a majority vote of the Lodge at any regular communication, notice having been given at a previous regular communication that a motion to that effect would be made.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

MASONIC BURIAL.—The friends of a brother who died while under suspension for non-payment of dues, cannot, by paying his dues, entitle him to Masonic burial. —(Proceedings, 1880.)

MOTIONS.—A brother who gives notice of motion to amend the constitution cannot delegate another brother to move in the matter in his absence.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

Demits cannot be granted to entered apprentices on Fellow crafts, 1885.
