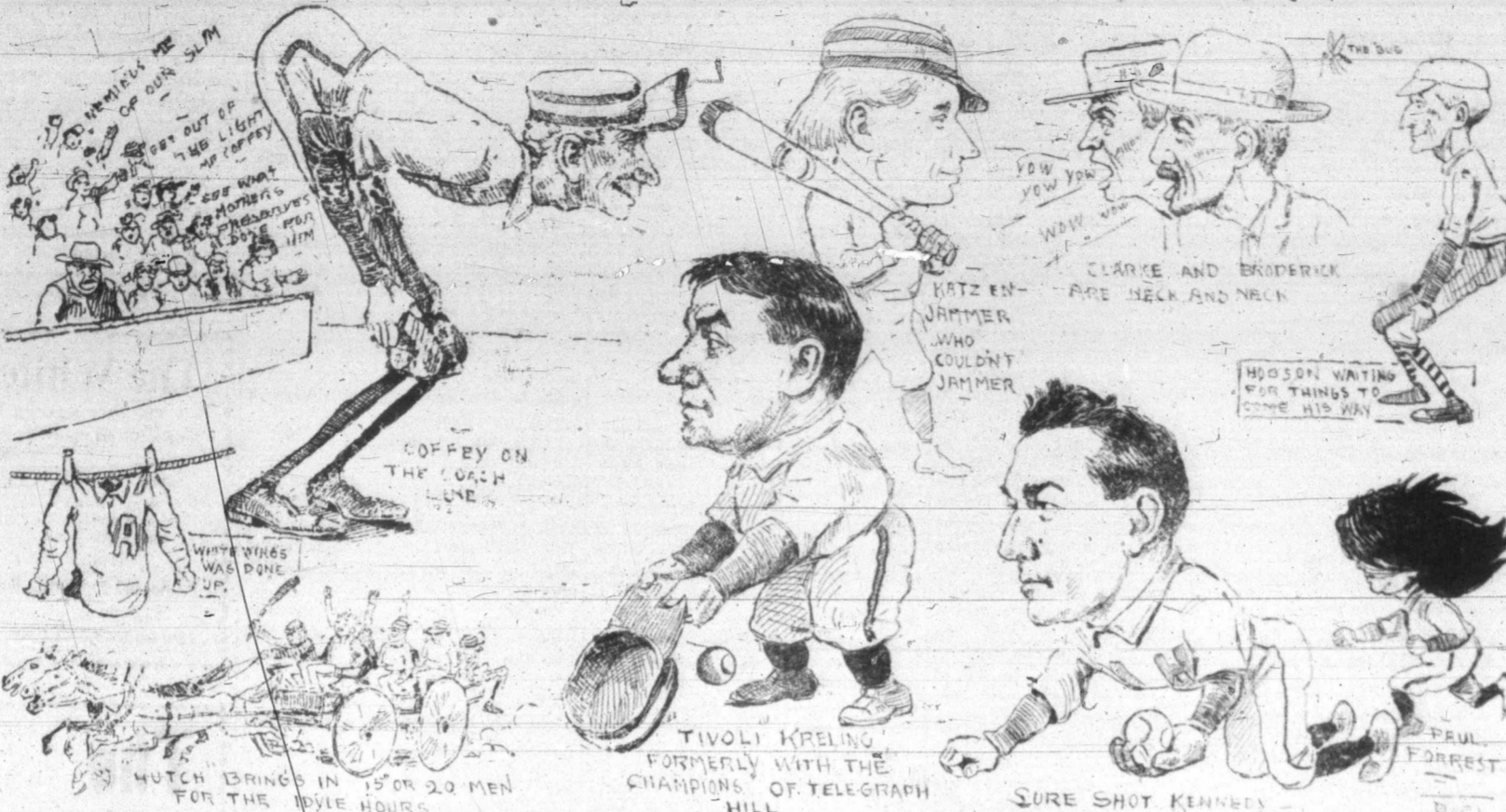

HYDRAULIC OPERATIONS

Big Plant Installed on American Creek

By Means of Hydraulic Elevator Will be Enabled to Handle 1000 Yards Daily.

So quietly has the firm represented by Dr. Green, late of Evanston, Illinois, conducted mining operations during the past three years on American creek that he has thoroughly developed a large area in that section and installed the first real hydraulic mining machinery in the country, expending \$75,000, and scarcely any one has heard anything of it.

Nothing like wages could be made at it. The first year of Dr. Green's residence in that section was spent entirely in proving the value of the gravel in different places. He soon became convinced that there was a good thing in sight and without letting anyone know of the result of his investigations he began quietly buying up such claims as he desired.

Previous to securing the machinery for the services of a highly competent hydraulic expert were obtained who spent some weeks in examining the ground. His report fully coincided with the opinion of Dr. Green and the purchase of the machinery as started followed at once.

Water for the use of the lift and sluicing will be brought from the intake wholly in flumes and hydraulic pipe. At present there are forty men at work on the flume which will be 8000 feet long when completed and will carry 1500 inches of water, an amount nearly double what is needed.
