TUESDAY MORNING.

The councillors elect met at the Court House, Amherst, at 10 o'clock a. m., when the clerk proceeded to open the poll books and read the returns of the presiding officers. Gentlemen of the Council,

It is needless to say that my election to the honorable position of Warden of this large and important County is a great surprise to me. I appreciate the honor, not only for myself, but as being the first Warden for the district which I represent. I trust I will be able to merit the confidence you have placed in me, and shall endeavor to the best of my ability to fulfill the duties of the office without favor, always keeping in view the best interests of the people of the County of Cumberland. I trust that the Councillors may work together in harmony,

and that the good feeling which has previously existed at this council board may continue during my term of office. SCHEDULE "A."

It is hereby ordered and ordained by the Municipal Council for the County of Cumberland, and in session assembled this 12th day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, as follows:—

CHAPTER XIII.

DOGS.

Sec. 1.—For the purpose of these by-laws, and in the construction thereof, the word "dog" shall, except when "bitch" is hereinafter specially mentioned, include bitch, and the word "owner" shall include a person who keeps, harbors or possesses a dog and a person on or about whose premises or in whose control, company or charge a dog is usually to be found.

Sec. 2.—No dog under the age of four months shall be subject to these by-laws.

Sec. 3.—No bull-dog or mastiff shall go at large within the county without continually wearing a muzzle sufficient to prevent such dog from biting or doing mischief.

Sec. 4.—Upon complaint made to any justice of the peace in and for the County of Cumberland that a dog within the municipality is fierce and dangerous, the owner thereof shall be summoned, and after hearing the complaint the justice of the peace may order that the dog be continually prevented from going at large or he may order such dog to be destroyed.

Sec. 5.—The owner of any dog within this municipality, who without provocation injures any one in his person by attacking, biting or attempting to bite such person, shall forfeit and pay as a penalty a sum not exceeding \$20.00, and in default shall be liable to imprisonment for a period not exceeding sixty days; and if it shall appear upon the hearing of any charge under this section that the dog complained of is fierce and dangerous, the justice hearing the complaint may, in addition to any penalty he may inflict upon the owner thereof in respect of the particular offence charged, adjudge by a separate order that the dog be continually prevented from going at large, or he may order that such dog be destroyed.

Sec. 6.—All orders, by-laws, forms and regulations regarding dogs inconsistent with the foregoing are hereby repealed, particularly chapter xiii. of the rules, regulations and by-laws of this Municipal Council passed at the meeting thereof held on the 12th day of April

in the year 1898.

Sec. 7.—The foregoing by-laws shall be known as chapter xiii. of the rules, regulations and by-laws of the Municipal Council of Cumberland County, and shall take the place of chapter xiii. ordained and passed as aforesaid on the 12th day of April in the year 1898.

Agreement Between County and Town of Amherst, 1899

Memorandum of agreement made and entered into this 17th day of January, 1899

Between the respective committees appointed by the Council of the Municipality of Cumberland and the Town Council of the Town of Amherst to adjust the sum payable by the Town for the said year into the County Treasury of the said Municipality under Section 81 of the Town's Incorporation Act 1895 on behalf of

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their respective principals. The said town hereby agrees to pay and the said County to accept the sum of four thousand and seventy one dollars in full and in lieu of all County rates and assessments incurred for all services borne for the joint benefit of the Town and the Municipality for the said year 1899. While this sum indicates the amount claimed from the Town by the Municipality as its annual contribution toward the maintenance of the harmless insane at Halifax and Pugwash—toward the payment of the debenture of the Municipality falling due during the present year representing a portion of the money borrowed by the Municipality to erect the harmless insane asylum at Pugwash and all other expenditures whether on capital or current account connected with the support and maintenance of the patients in the said asylum and all capital expenditure as well it is hereby provided that the consent of the Town to contribute toward the support of the said insane for the present or any other year past or present or toward the debenture or other capital expenditure on account of the said asylum at Pugwash shall not be a bar to the right of the Town hereafter to contest its liability to contribute in the future toward these items of expenditure on insane account nor as any acknowledgement on the part of the Town that the same is an expenditure to which the Town is liable to contribute under the provisions of the above mentioned section of the Towns' Incorporation Act or otherwise by law.

It is hereby further agreed that the Town shall pay all jail expenses of drunks, etc., sent up from the Town Court if a fine is collected, otherwise the same shall remain part of the jailor's general account the Town's proportion of which general account is included in the sum which it is to contribute as above specified.

This agreement shall not come into force until it shall have been ratified by each of the said Councils by resolution passed at a regularly called meeting of the same.

Report of Commission for County Asylum.

To the Warden and Municipal Council of Cumberland,

Gentlemen :—

We, your Commissioners for the County Asylum for 1898, beg leave to submit to you the following as our annual report :

We have during the year given the financial matters in connection with the institution careful attention and special attention was given to the system or method of book-keeping as commented on in your commissioners last annual report, and we are much pleased to report, as a consequence a marked improvement in the state we now find the books in. We have examined the different wards of the institution and would here call your attention to the urgent need of better ventilation throughout the building, as well as, in the opinion of your Commissioners, the necessity in the interest of the health of the inmates of the institution of a small specially constructed building in which to lodge the filthy patients of whom there are now ten at the Asylum and whose presence in the main building now endangers the health of the institution. We have examined the quarterly and annual accounts and reports and with the exception of table No. 2 in the annual report of the Superintendent, where an amount of \$24 00 for 12 tons of hay bought has been credited to the farm in error, we find them to be correct, and that the cost of maintainance for the year has been \$3473.11, making the cost per week per inmate \$1.47, which we find since the accounts have been put in better shape, to be as low as in any year since the opening of the institution. There is an amount owing to the county for the maintainance of a patient who was admitted as a private paying patient. The parties furnished at the time of admittance the necessary bond with the name of H. J. Embree as bondsman. At a meeting of your commissioners

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held on July 15th a resolution was passed cancelling this bond. In December your commissioners called for tenders for the supplies of the Asylum for the year 1899. For the groceries and dry goods which were, as last year, divided into four classes with a view to meeting the wishes of a number of intending tenderers. We received five tenders which on being monied out were found to range as follows: Class No. 1, Elliott & Co., \$624 18; S. Allan, \$634 85; Black & Co. \$642 42; C. W. Morris, \$707 80; Dunlap Bros & Co. did not submit prices for a sufficient number of items to enable us to money out their tender. Class No. 2, Elliott & Co., \$125 70; Black & Co., \$127 50; S. Allan, \$129 42; C. W. Morris, \$139 43; Dunlap Bros. & Co., \$139 76. Class No. 3, Elliott & Co., \$19 16; Black & Co., \$19 89; S. Allan, \$21 48; C. W. Morris, \$25 04; Dunlap Bros & Co., \$24 53. Elliott & Co. being the lowest on these three classes they were awarded the contract. Your commissioners selecting the following brands of flour at the prices submitted in their tender as being the best in the country's interest, Empress at \$4 40 per barrel, Crown at \$4 00 per barrel and Goderich at \$3 80 per barrel. Black & Co's tender being the lowest on class 4, theirs was accepted. For the supply of meats we received 4 tenders, that of A. J. McLeod's being the lowest at 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents per lb for beet, 4 cents per pound for lamb in season and 4cts per pound for mutton was accepted. For the supply of butter we received but one tender, that of S. M. Lowe at 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ c. which was accepted. For the supply of potatoes we received two but considering the prices therein submitted as too high neither of the tenders were accepted. We may here say that all the prices in the above accepted tenders are extremely low, being little if any above wholesale prices.

Report of Committee on Roads and Bridges.

To the Warden and Councillors :

We your Committee on Roads and Bridges beg leave to report as follows :—

We find in examining the highway master's road returns for the several districts in the county, first, the road masters have been very negligent in sending in their reports, one district, No. 6, only sending in two reports.

Second, The careless and negligent way nearly all returns are made out. A number of them not having the name of the road master on and a very few of them having the number of the polling district on.

We, your committee, would respectfully recommend the Clerk to urge upon each highway master the importance of performing their duty in accordance to law.

We further recommend that the following persons be permitted to perform their labor in the statute districts hereinafter designated and under the authority and control of the highway masters of said road districts :
