THE CARE OF RACE HORSES.

From the Chicago News. "There is all the difference between the stable surroundings of trotting horses and running horses that there is between a palace and a hovel," said a horseman yesterday. "Running horses being less prized, naturally less care is taken of them. If you visit the stable of a runner you are apt to find the animal with a \$3 blanket on, standing in an unkept stall, with a colored man asleep in one corner and another negro trying pork outside. With the trotters it is very different. You will find the stable spot and apart from the hay left to the door—so clean that one could eat a meal there without the slightest compunction on the part of the stomach. The harness will be clean and shining, the several parts neatly hung on pegs; the rubbing cloths will be dry and clean and folded in fanciful shapes like hotel napkins; the straw under the padded animal's feet will be as dainty as the matting in a maid's room. The horse will be fed in a stall, and the ends of it at the front of the stall will be plated into the semblance of a mat. The horse itself will be fresh-rubbed several times a day, and his coat will gleam like silk. His hoofs will be bathed and dried, and his whole person will be closely washed by his rubber, who is constantly with him. Every symptom is noted and reported to the trainer or owner immediately it appears. The trotter's meals are served to him with clocklike regularity, and his daily life is one round of methodical health measures. The trainer, as a doctor would about a patient, a series of questions, which bring out the condition and condition of the horse since he last visited the stable. He asks how it has slept during the night, if it coughed while eating, etc. At night the "rubbers" sleep with the horses as a trained nurse would with a patient. As soon as a trotter has left the track after a race he is taken to his stable and thoroughly rubbed down. His hoofs and feet are bathed in tepid water, his fore legs bandaged with flannel, and his form enveloped in a cooling blanket. By the way, a trotter's dress costs fully twice as much as a gentleman's. A suit, consisting of a dress blanket, hood, surcingle, cooling sheet and outfit, costs \$150. The blanket, hood, etc., are made of fine blue cloth, finely bound and embroidered, with horse's name, etc."
