The Grand Master appointed Rep. C. N. Trew, of No. 3, to fill vacancy in Committee on Finance.

The Grand Master then read his report as follows:

TO THE R. W. GRAND LODGE OF THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA:

VICTORIA, February 10th, 1879.

REPRESENTATIVES AND PAST GRANDS:—Again we meet, as is the custom and law of our Order, to legislate for the interest of Odd Fellowship, and for the good of the human family. The finger of time marks with unerring certainty the passage of one year since we were last gathered in annual communication, and is there one heart among us that rejoiceth not for the manifold benefits bestowed on us by our Supreme Grand Master? Is there one brother here who cannot join with us in peace offering and praise for all the blessings vouchsafed us during the year? If so, then, indeed, he is ungrateful and unworthy the name he bears, for while other countries have been suffering from war, famine and pestilence, ours has been blessed with peace, plenty and health.

Our beloved Order in this Jurisdiction is advancing slowly but surely, and this slow and sure advancement I hold to be the true and solid progress of our admirable institution. May wisdom guide you in all your deliberations; may peace, harmony and good will characterize every thought, word and action.

On the 12th of February, 1878, I granted a dispensation to New Westminster Lodge, No. 3, to hold a Ball in the name of the Order on the 14th of that month.

On March the 30th, 1878, I granted dispensations to all the Lodges in this Jurisdiction to celebrate the 59th Anniversary of our Order on the 26th of April.

In May I received a circular from the Grand Lodge U. S. calling attention to the unlawful practice in some Jurisdictions of having the form of Funeral Ceremony printed and bound with their Constitution and By-Laws. I sent this circular to all the Lodges in this Jurisdiction, calling their particular attention to its contents, and I understand that all those Lodges heretofore having the "form" appended to their By-Laws have caused the same to be destroyed.

I received an "Appeal" from the Grand Lodge District of Columbia stating that Fred. D. Stuart, Past Grand Sire, is dead, and that he left a daughter unprovided for. The brethren of that district are anxious to erect a suitable memorial to his memory and to provide for the orphan. I sent this to the several Lodges, and regret to state that there has been no response.

July 1st, 1878, in company with Bro. J. D. Robinson, Grand Secretary, I visited New Westminster Lodge, No. 3, and installed the Officers.

On the 2nd of July, I granted a dispensation to Victoria Lodge, No. 1, to hold a public installation.

On the 5th of July, I installed the Officers of Black Diamond Lodge, No. 5, at Nanaimo, in company with Bro. Grand Secretary.

Accompanied by the Grand Officers, I installed the Officers of Columbia Lodge, No. 2, on the 10th, Dominion Lodge, No. 4, on the 11th, and Victoria Lodge, No. 1, on the 15th, all in the month of July, 1878.

In September I received a Postal Card from the Grand Lodge of Tennessee, appealing for help for the sufferers by the terrible scourge of yellow fever which

at that time was raging in the city of Memphis. I lost no time in bringing the matter before the Lodges in this city, all of which immediately responded with a gift of \$10 each. I then forwarded it to New Westminster Lodge and it gave \$10. Being anxious to forward the money as quickly as possible I placed it in the hands of the Agent of Wells, Fargo & Co. of this city, who kindly forwarded it free of charge. I then sent the card to Black Diamond Lodge and it sent \$10 for the same cause; this amount I immediately sent by cheque payable in New York, and communicated with Marcus Jones, President of the Relief Association, and in due course received acknowledgement.

In company of the Grand Officers I installed the Officers of Columbia Lodge, No. 2, on the 8th of January, 1879, the Officers of Dominion Lodge, No. 4, on the 9th of January, and Victoria Lodge, No. 1, on the 13th of January.

Bro. S. T. Styles, D.D.G.M. for District No. 1, reports "That on the 25th of March, 1878, he granted Dominion Lodge, No. 4, a dispensation to confer the five degrees on a Brother who was about to leave for the interior of British Columbia, and that on April 5th, he granted a dispensation to Columbia Lodge, No. 2, to confer the first three degrees in less time than the law allows on a Bro. about to leave for the Cassiar Mines."

The D.D.G.M. for District No. 2, Bro. H. V. Edmonds, reports as follows: "I have to report that during my term of office no appeals or decisions have been referred to me. The only official act that I have been called on to perform has been to install the Officers of No. 3 Lodge, which I did on the 16th of January. I have much pleasure in stating that No. 3 Lodge continues to prosper, its progress although slow being sure."

Bro. E. Quesnell, D.D.G.M. of District No. 3, reports that Black Diamond Lodge, No. 5 is progressing but he hopes to see a large increase of members during the year. He regrets that the Representatives from that Lodge are unable to attend. The Nanaimo Brethren are seriously talking of starting a new Lodge at Wellington.

From these reports you will see that my D.D. have not been called on to decide any questions of law, and that the whole Jurisdiction is working in peace and harmony.

In conclusion, I desire to tender you all my grateful acknowledgements for the many acts of kindness extended to me during my official term. To our R. W. Grand Secretary I am under many obligations for his kind attentions.

From the returns of Subordinates to 31st December, I find there has been a loss in membership during the past year of 4: this is no doubt to be attributed to the continued depression in business. No new Lodges have as yet been started although at the beginning of last year there was every likelihood of one at Burrard Inlet, but up to the present time nothing has been done.

Previous to the annual session of the Grand Lodge, U. S., in September, I forwarded a communication to Grand Secretary Ridgely calling his attention to the petition for remission of tax of 1877 by the Committee of Finance. I find by the printed proceedings, which only came to hand last week, that our tax has been credited, and we will, therefore, not have this amount to pay until we have 10 Subordinate Lodges in the Province.

I am pleased to report that I am, by the assistance granted by the Grand Lodge at last session, in a comfortable office, where the books and papers of the Grand Lodge are at hand. The rent is heavier than I expected, viz. \$10 per month, but it is worth the money, and in the course of the year, as you are all aware, the new Hall will be erected. In that building a good office is provided for the Grand Secretary, with a fire-proof vault where papers and documents belonging to the Order can be deposited in safety. These premises will, it is anticipated, be ready for occupation by the end October next, so that our session of 1880 will be held in the new Hall.

On the 29th September the President of the Odd Fellows' Union, handed me the Constitution and By-Laws of that body for approval. I consulted with the Grand Master as to the proper course to pursue, and we both considered that the Legislative Committee was the proper one to examine and report upon the same. I immediately handed the document to the chairman of that Committee, and on the following day, 1st October, had it returned to me approved of by three of the committee, the other two members being in New Westminster could not be obtained. I however hand in the document to the Grand Lodge with this report for their action on the examination made by the majority of the Legislative Committee.

The Appeal papers in the case of Samuel Sea v. Columbia Lodge, No. 2, laid over from last session, I handed to the Appeal Committee together with the letter of the Appellant for them to take what action they considered necessary in the case.

I also handed to the Committee two appeals from Bro. Wm. Harrison, P. G., handed to me from Columbia Lodge, No. 2.

I received from Dominion Lodge, No. 4, amendment to their By-Laws which I handed on the 15th July to the chairman of Committee on Laws of Subordinates; they have not been returned to me approved, and I presume will be brought before the Grand Lodge by the Committee.

I have to report having procured a set of Regalia for the elective Grand Officers, during recess, which have been paid for out of the funds of the Grand Lodge.

As usual, I have forwarded to the several Grand Secretaries, a copy of our proceedings, and also to many others who wrote to me for copies, and I find that out of 150 copies printed there are only ten left, which I consider insufficient. In future I will require to get a larger number printed so as to have more in reserve for binding hereafter.

The correspondence of the year has been all attended to promptly, but as there is nothing to bring before the Grand Lodge for action, I merely make a note of the same.

Annexed you will find Abstract of Reports of Subordinates as usual, to be appended to proceedings of the session, when printed.

In conclusion, Representatives and Brothers, I have to thank you for the courtesy and confidence reposed in me, which I assure you I appreciate, and endeavor to conduct the affairs entrusted to me as carefully as possible.

We, the undersigned Committee on Appeals, beg leave to report that we have carefully examined into the case of Bro. W. Harrison's appeal against the part Columbia Lodge, No. 2, I. O. O. F., took in the formation of the Constitution of the Odd Fellows' Union of Victoria, B. C., etc., etc., and also against the Constitution of the Union itself. 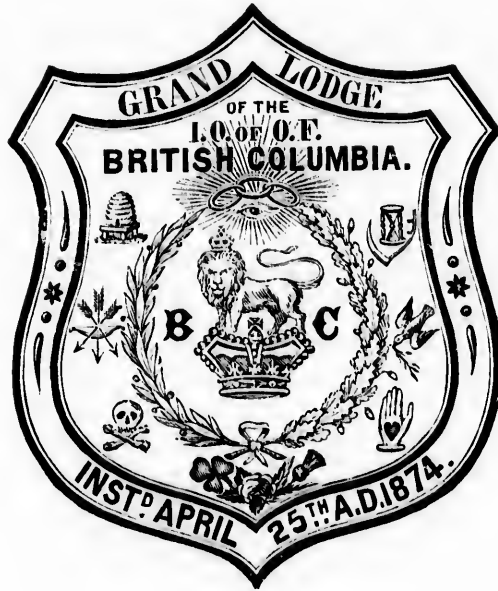
Rep. Trew, of No. 3, gave the following notice of motion, viz:
