PUNISH RECKLESS NAVIGATORS

Intention of Marine Dept.—Argyle Decision Issues To-Day.

Commander Spain will today deliver judgment at Ottawa in the steamer Argyle case. It is understood that there will be a sweeping condemnation of the conduct of the officers in running at full speed in a fog, and that the captain will be suspended.

The minister of marine is determined to make an example of those found guilty of careless or reckless navigation, involving danger to lives of passengers. Not until an accident occurs, probably, will the mixed question of marine jurisdiction over steamers in Toronto harbor be settled between the civil authorities, the harbor board and Dominion government.

The matters in which the public are interested are equipment, signals, life-saving appliances, drills of crews in safety appliances, lights on boats, rights of vessel, dockage, crowding, and the holding of marine inquests. Last April Ald. Church brought all these matters up in the city council, and some of them were attended to, but the question of jurisdiction is still debated.

CANADIAN TRADE WITH BRISTOL.

Shipping Business Steadily Improving and Exports Increase. (Canadian Associated Press Cable.)

London, Aug. 22.—James Grant, ex-president of the Royal Society of Canada, delivered a lecture last evening at Dundee, on "Tuberculosis and the Simple Life." Charles A. E. Harris is now in London making arrangements for holding a Canadian festival concert next spring. The works put forward will include two of Mr. Harris' own works—"Crown Mass" and "Chorus, Ode to Pan."

CHANGES IN INTERCOLONIAL ONE POSITION ABOLISHED

Hon. Mr. Emmerson, minister of railways, has announced that among the changes to be made in the management of the Intercolonial Railway, the office of chief superintendent, held by the late J. E. Price of Moncton, will be abolished on recommendation of the deputy minister and general manager, who advises that by this step about a thousand dollars a month will be saved in salaries, without in any way impairing the efficiency of the operation of the line. This will be accomplished by adding further duties to those now discharged by the divisional superintendents, and holding them more strictly to account.

The Temagami Region.

Temagami, "Deep Water," and clear as crystal is the new region just opened to the sportsman, and we might say the "prospector," in the rich mining country, from which many millions of dollars worth of ore will be taken out this year.

Will Build It Town Aids.

The stockholders of the Goderich Elevator Co. have accepted the tender of J. H. Frommhauser of Milwaukee for a cement and steel house of half a million capacity, on condition that the by-law now before the ratepayers is carried. If not, the elevator company will pay one-half of any expense the contractor incurs in the meantime, and allow the contract to lie over for a year.

FRANCE THREATENS SUE AN GERMANYS AT HER BACK

Demands Indemnity for Arrest of Algerian Subject or Will Take Decisive Measures to Retaliate.

Tanger, Aug. 22.—The French minister, St. Rene Taillandier, has presented to the sultan, Mulai Abd-El-Asis, an energetic demand for an indemnity of \$2000 for the recent arrest of a Franco-Algerian citizen. The minister also demands the punishment of the official responsible for the arrest, and an additional indemnity of \$100 daily until the prisoner is released.

It is believed that the sultan will probably grant the demands of the minister, as it is definitely known that the French government is determined to adopt forcible means to bring the sultan to terms should satisfaction not be immediately given, including, if necessary, the occupation of a Moroccan port.

This incident is independent of the Franco-German controversy regarding the proposed international conference. Indeed, it is known that Germany approves the course of France in sending the unwarranted arrest of one of her citizens, and the German government has given official notice of its intention to support the action of the French government.

Moroccan officials recently arrested the chief of the Algerian settlement at Gharb because of local troubles. The demand of the French minister for the release of the Algerian was refused, the sultan claiming that all Muslims in the moment of selling to the territory came under his jurisdiction as Caliph of Islam.

YOUTH FORGED CHECK FOR \$1860.

Cashed It, Too, After Risky Preliminaries, But is Soon Detected.

Cayuga, Aug. 22.—One of the coolest attempts at crime was perpetrated here on Monday. Frank Thornton, a boy 18 years of age, who was born in Dundas, was on a visit to friends here. His grandfather has a bank account in the Bank of Commerce.

An imperial ukase was issued Aug. 17 authorizing the issuance of a new internal loan of \$100,000,000 at 5 per cent.

DIED AS HE SPOKE.

Niagara Falls, Ont., Aug. 22.—Samuel Stevenson, a well-known Stamford Township farmer, died very suddenly of heart disease last night. He and his wife had retired for the night, but were talking. Suddenly his wife failed in the middle of a sentence. Mrs. Stevenson rose and procured a light, and on returning found her husband dead. He was 76 years of age.

WAS'NT PROVED A PICKPOCKET.

St. Catharines, Aug. 22.—This morning Judge Carman found Edward Bowers of Buffalo not guilty on the charge of attempting to pick the pocket of George H. Doherty of Toronto at the regatta here several weeks ago.

Doherty could not swear that Bowers actually had his hand in his pocket, but he put his hand down to his trouser pocket, and caught Bowers' hand, but could not be positive that he meant to pick his pocket.

Earth Trembled in Illinois.

Chicago, Aug. 22.—Illinois was shaken by an earthquake shortly after 11 o'clock last night, the most severe in recent years.

The shock at the southern part of the state, especially in the region surrounding East St. Louis, was severe enough to rattle dishes, and furniture. Houses cracked and in many instances their occupants rushed out in terror.

Fruit Land Must be of a Sandy Loam Soil.

BLACK LANDS ARE CONSIDERED BY EXPERTS TO BE SUGAR CANE LANDS, GIVING POOR NATURAL DRAINAGE AND IN DRY WEATHER BAKING INTO UNFRIABLE CLODS.

EXTRACTS FROM PROFESSOR C. F. AUSTIN'S REPORT.

Chief of Department of Horticulture, Cuban Experiment Station, Santiago de Las Vegas.

Three Distinct Types of Soil.

In the region to which I am confining this discussion there are three distinct types of soil—the red, the black and the sandy or loamy—with many intermediate grades. The distinct vegetable district is an example of what is known as "mulatto" land, an intermediate between the black and the sandy. This is

a deep soil, sticky in wet weather, but loose and mellow in the dry season. When properly handled it gives excellent results. The sandy and loamy soils which prevail in Pinar del Rio Province are also proving well adapted to vegetable growing, and seem to hold water better than either the black or the red lands, so that by thorough cultivation crops may be produced on them

with less water than on soils of any other type. As a rule, the black lands are considered to be better adapted to sugar cane than to truck gardening, being very heavy and having a poor natural drainage, yet suffering badly from dry weather on account of their tendency to bake into unfriable crusts and clods.

In a letter recently received is the following item: I visited a fruit farm and photographed an orange tree three years ago from setting. It was six inches in diameter at the base and about eighteen feet high, with branches five or six feet long and full of fruit. I also photographed a tree five years old which bore 5000 oranges last year, and another seven years old which bore 7000 oranges. Grapefruit attains perfection in Cuba.

Oranges.

It is claimed by the best authorities on citrus fruits that if all the available lands suited for the purpose in this part of the world were put into cultivation it would be more than twenty years before the market would be supplied to the same extent that it was previous to the freeze in Florida and California.

It must be remembered that an orange grove will mature here in one-third less time than in California or Florida.

Governor-General Charles H. Allen says: "A ten-acre orange grove, once in bearing, gives a comfortable income, sufficient to support a family in the best country style."

When an orange tree is in full bearing it is valued at \$100.—Florida Fruits and How to Grow Them.

Profits on Oranges and Other Citrus Fruits.

As an indication of the profits to be derived from raising oranges and other citrus fruits, I quote from an official work on Cuba, recently published: "The person owning an orange grove in a country free from frosts is the most independent and happiest person on earth. A full grown orange tree will yield from 1000 to 5000 oranges yearly, and, like the lemon tree, begins to bear the third year. Before Cuba got its independence during the war, orange lands were selling from \$150 to \$300 per acre, and a three-year-old grove was worth \$1000 per acre. The oldest trees in Cuba are some 100 years old, and each year the crop is greater than the previous year. 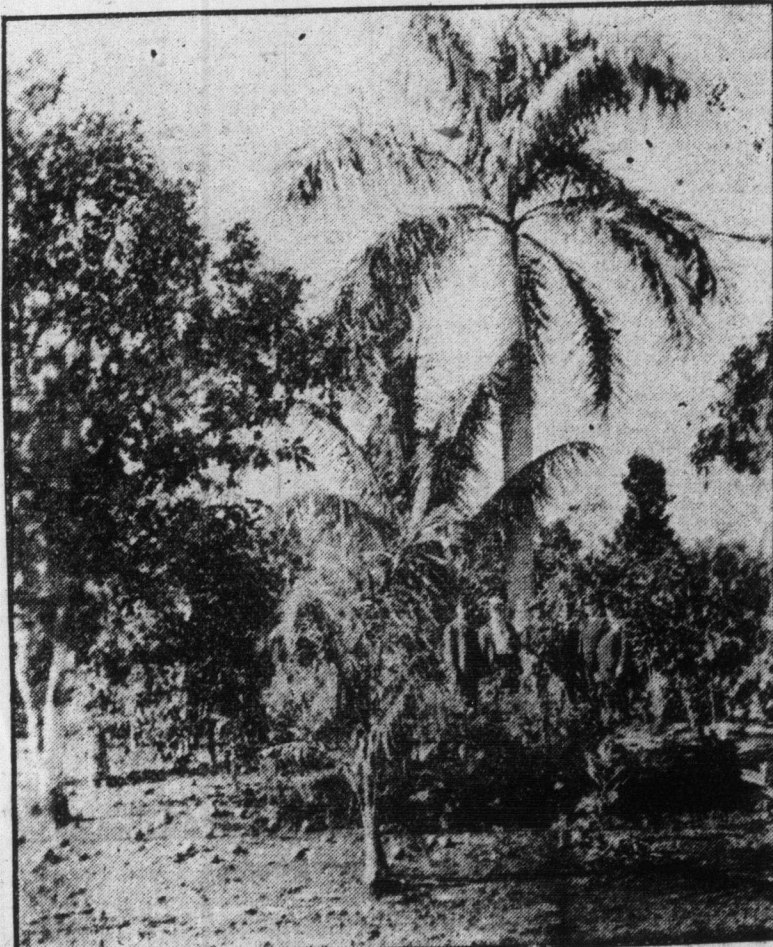

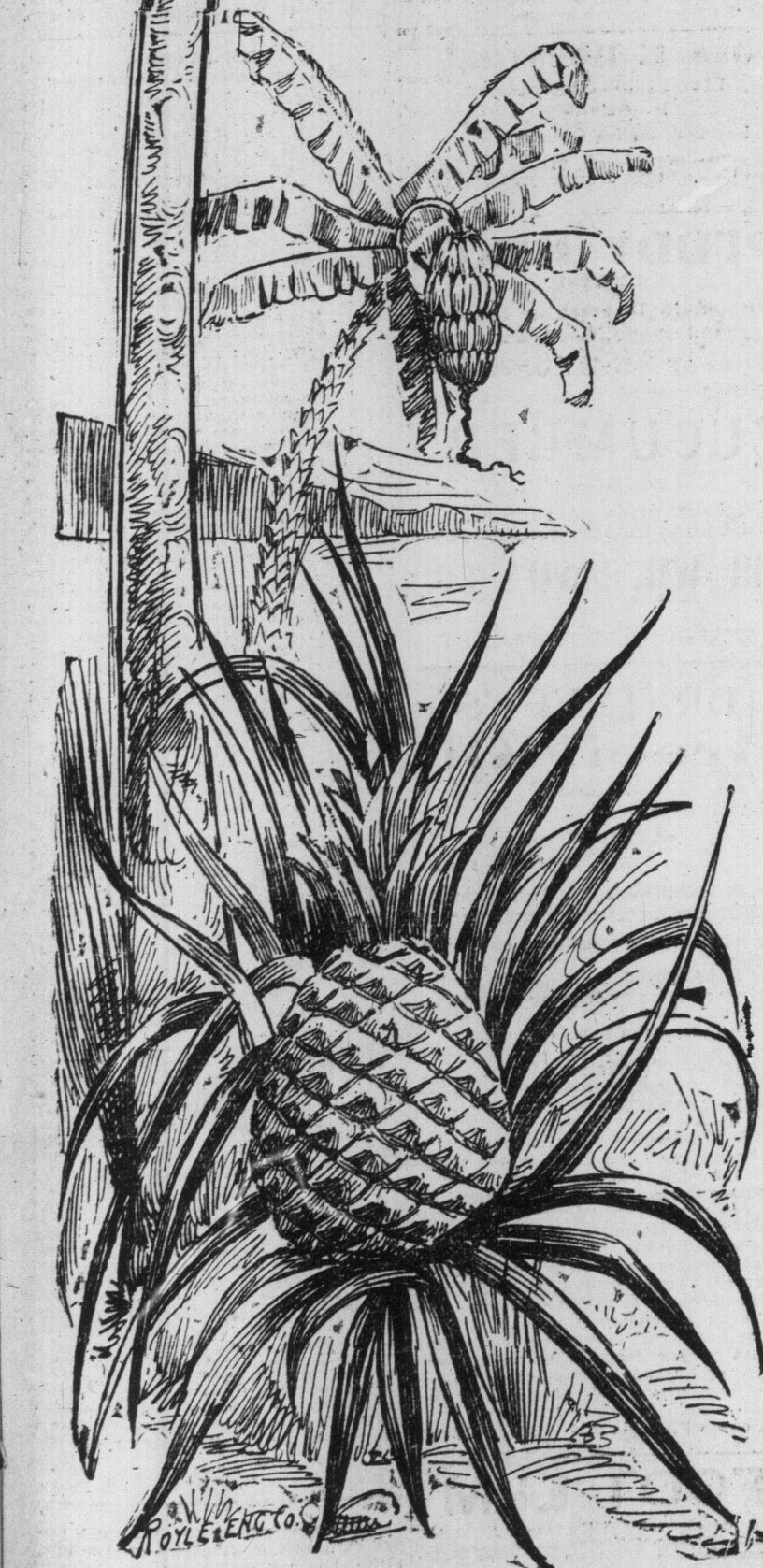
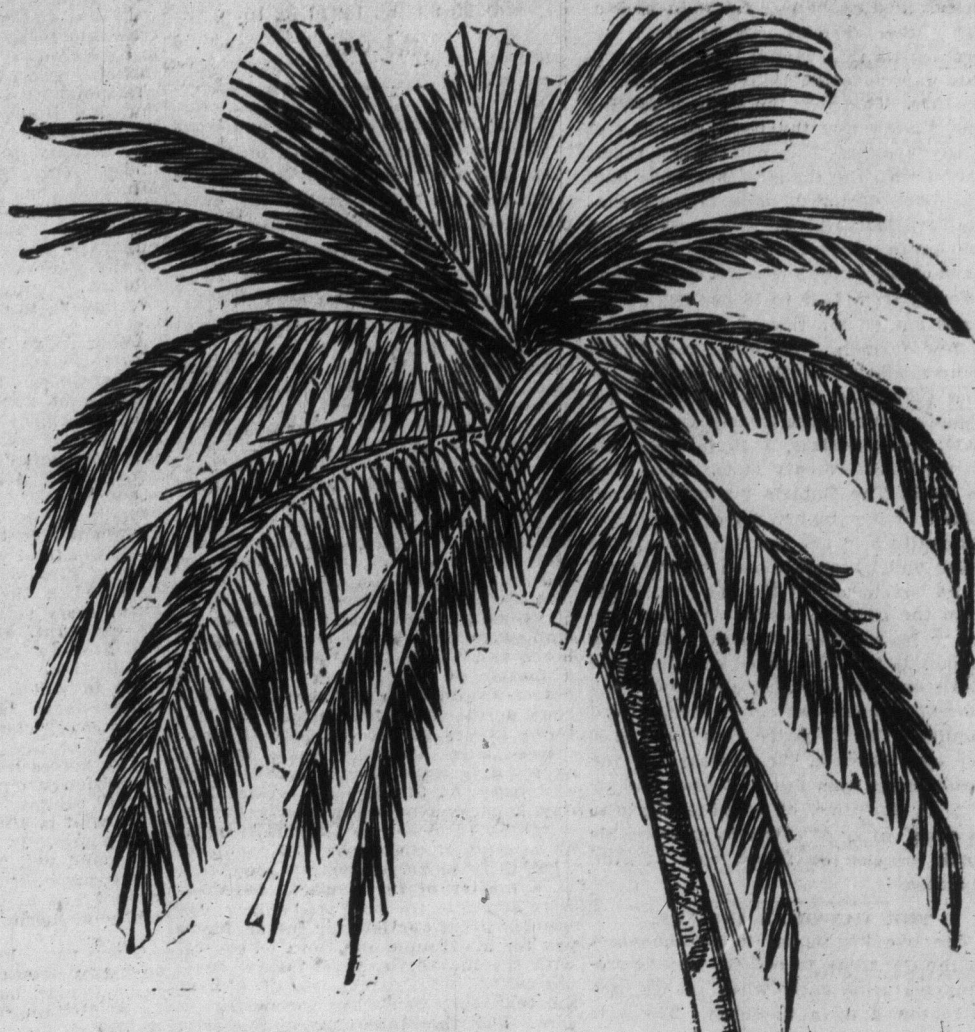
