KIRK-SESSION REPORT.

Since last Report the pastoral charge of the congregation has been left vacant in consequence of the translation of the Rev. Dr. Smith to St. Andrew's Church, St. Johns, N. B. Steps have since been taken with the view of securing the harmonious settlement of a successor, and the Session trust that this desirable result may soon be reached.

The number of baptisms during the past year is 31, and of deaths 12; the number of communicants on the roll is 315; the number of those added during the year is 41, of whom 25 have been received on profession of their faith, and 16 on certificate; dismissions and deaths 31.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS.

ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, 9TH APRIL, 1884.

The Managers beg respectfully to submit herewith the financial statement for the year ending 31st ult.

The Revenue from all sources is very much the same as the year previous, but owing to the expenses being less the "floating debt," after paying \$214.41 for improvements to property, has been reduced by \$514.84, and the indebtedness of the congregation, apart from the Bonded debt, is now \$312.05, against \$826.89 last year.

The total monies collected from all sources by the congregation for the period under consideration amount to \$2871.77, including \$151.29 for the Augmentation Fund. A reference to the Statement will show that only \$17.75 have been subscribed towards paying for the "Church Record," which costs \$30.00.

Your Committee again desire to refer to the fact that the church and manse property is absolutely in need of certain repairs which must be attended to this year. To meet this expenditure, which will be about \$600.00, your Committee would recommend that special collections be taken up on the following Sabbaths during the current year, viz.: on the first Sabbaths in May, August, November and February.

Mr. J. M. Strange having tendered his resignation as a member of the Board, Mr. Clark Hamilton was appointed to fill the unexpired portion of his term.

The retiring Managers are Messrs. R. Carrol, W. Irving, A. Ross and W. G. Craig, who are eligible for re-election.

The Teachers and Office-bearers take great pleasure in submitting the Annual Report of the Sabbath School.

The year ending March 31st, 1884, has been an eventful one in the history of our School. Many changes have taken place and valuable christian workers have gone from our midst, viz.: the Misses Fowler, Smith, Sutherland and G. Fraser, the latter having been a faithful and zealous teacher for a number of years. Also Dr. Smith and Mr. Rattray. Mr. Rattray was connected with our School only for a short time but we remember him with pleasure. Dr. Smith, as we anticipated in our last report, has since removed to St. John, N.B. We pray that God's blessing may rest upon and abide with all of them in their different circumstances and new fields of labor.

Notwithstanding the loss of these co-workers, together with its very efficient Superintendent, Dr. Smith, the School has very great reason to thank the Divine Teacher for the degree of success and marks of encouragement which have been experienced.

There are 259 scholars on the roll; the average for the year has been 232; average attendance Infant Class 36, Bible Class 8.

All have studied the International series of lessons together with the Shorter Catechism. The Infant Class only using the Mother's Catechism instead of the Shorter.

It will be seen by the financial statement submitted herewith that forty-five dollars and fifty cents have been paid to missions. The statement also shows a small balance at the credit of the School; but there are several accounts unpaid, amounting to about thirty-five dollars.

Also the presentation of handsome Reference Bibles to the following scholars for having answered correctly all the questions of the Shorter Catechism, viz.:—Dell McDonald, Sarah Allen, Emma Connors, Mary Campbell, Minnie Donnelly, Annie Fairbairn, Jane Glasgow, Alexander Fairbairn, Robt. Glasgow, Willie Glasgow, Agnes Kennedy, Jane Kennedy, Laura McLeod.

We beg to record another year of faithful service as Organist by Miss Irving, and also the assistance of Miss Greenwood at the same instrument.

During the year a piano has been introduced, which has been successfully used by Miss Chambers in improving the melody and heartiness of the singing.

A short prayer meeting is held every Sabbath, after the usual exercises, to ask a divine blessing on the labors of the day, and to examine the lesson for the following Sabbath.

It is with gratitude to God that we remember the many privileges and opportunities we have enjoyed throughout the year that has gone and recount the success that has attended the efforts put forth.
