The Newfoundland Agricultural Board has ascertained that certain plots of potatoes in the neighbourhood of St John's are affected by the drpaided

## "Potato Canker" Disease.

This is the same disease that was first detected at Red Island, in Placentia Bay, about a year ago, and is so fatal in its effects that if not immediately checked the absolute impossibility of growing potatoes in Newfonndland for years to come, is sure to result.

The Agricultural Board therefore requests that all potato growers who may observe indications of disease in their crop will at once notify the Secretary of the Agricul tural Board at the office of the Department of Agricultur and Mines.

The Agricultural Board recognizing the incalculable injury that must accrue to the country if this disease be not aid the efforts now about to be made to effect this.
