THE EMPLOYER NEEDS A STATESMAN. If Great Britain was ever in need of a statesman it is at the present moment. No one from Mr. Chamberlain down realizes that statesmanship has just now a brilliant opportunity to carry into effect the scheme of Imperial Federation. As it was their tariffs that created and built up the German Empire and the United States of America, so it is their tariff that is a practical foundation of the British Empire. The Imperial Federation of the British Empire may now be effected. And the present moment is the most opportune for carrying such a policy into effect. The South African war has established upon the Empire an enormous debt, but the loss will not be entirely regrettable if only advantage is taken of the conditions created by it. Great Britain is to-day face to face with an enormous deficit. The navy estimates for the coming twelve months will be \$35,500,000, and the estimates for the current year computed a short time ago, exceed \$201,000,000. These estimates were based on the supposition that the war was practically over, but the unpleasant news reaches us to-day that the soldiers' terms were declined to lay down their arms, so that the end of the war is by no means yet in sight. As now completed, the budget estimates stand at the enormous figure of \$103,000,000. Assuming that the revenue for the coming year should be the same as that anticipated for the current year, the deficit would be \$75,000,000. The appalling cost of the war will not be an unmitigated evil if British statesmanship take advantage of the opportunity that has been presented for the practical unification of the Empire. Among the taxes from which the British revenue is derived is one of 12 1/2 per cent on the value of goods at the point of exportation in excess of a pound per ton; 3s 4d per ton on unmanufactured tobacco; 11s 6d a gallon on spirits, and some others. The question that the Chancellor of the Exchequer is now trying to solve is how the money is to be raised to meet the deficit of \$75,000,000 which the expenditure will exceed the revenue. Enlightened statesmanship would recommend a drastic revision of the tariff, such a revision as would produce the needed revenue and at the same time increase the interchange of products with the Empire. The method pursued by Great Britain to raise her annual revenues is antiquated. It is time the British fiscal system was abandoned for the more enlightened method in vogue in Germany, Russia and the United States. TO FIGHT TRADING STAMPS

Legislation Committee Recommend City to Support Bill to Abolish the System.

MERCHANTS OUT IN FULL FORCE

At yesterday's meeting of the Reception and Legislation Committee the Retail Merchants' Association renewed the objections that they had previously made to Council to the trading stamp system.

The City Engineer reports that the car services on all routes except the Belt Line at times do not run on schedule.

MEMORIAL TO THE QUEEN.

Meeting Will Be Held to Discuss the Proposal to Build an Organ.

A meeting will be held on Monday afternoon in the Board of Trade Council chamber at 4:30 to discuss a proposal that the most appropriate memorial in loving remembrance of her late Majesty the Queen would be a public organ supporting a similar instrument on this side of the Atlantic. A feature of the organ would be a bronze statue of the late Queen. It is estimated that to provide the organ \$20,000 will be necessary, to be met by public subscription. Should the organ be built, the trustees of Massey Hall have consented to give it space in the hall, and further to give the free use of the building one week during the summer months, and one month during the winter, for the purpose of holding organ concerts or recitals, free to the public.
