

REV. DR. AKED'S VIEWS ON WOMAN SUFFRAGE

In a recent address in New York, Rev Dr. Aked, the eminent Englishman who has come to the United States to make his home, said of woman suffrage:
"That elementary sense of humor granted even to an Englishman," began Dr. Aked, "has hitherto led me to refrain from telling the American people how to run their affairs. But the desire to stand by my country-woman on this occasion now leads me to break my rule for the first time. It is now eighteen months since I took out my first papers of naturalization in a country which I have deliberately chosen to be my own. You see, you let people be citizens before they are Americans, while other people you won't let be citizens though they were born Americans.
