AN ELECTION FOUGHT OUT ON REAL IMPORTANT ISSUE

The People of Canada Evincing More Interest in the Present Campaign than in Any Ever Waged Since the Time of Confederation.

(Special Correspondence of the St. John Standard.) Ottawa, Sept. 2.—The skirmishing is all over. The scouts have returned to their respective camps. The last general of war has been held by each opposing general, and for the next three weeks the government and the opposition forces will be locked in a life-and-death encounter, the parallel of which Canada has never seen.

It is not so mysterious, after all, this unprecedented concern taken this time by the average elector. The man on the street and on the farm is talking politics nowadays because the leaders have commanded their attention. Mr. R. L. Borden have brought their best efforts to the task of bringing home to the bosoms and hearts of the common man the federal problems awaiting the people's decision.

Other campaigns have sought to stir up the voters on flimsy economic theories as to the wisdom of the folly of a protective tariff. Other elections have been called to settle the necessity of a new railway, or other public undertakings. More commonly still, the parties have lined up for the great quarrelsome battle with little to do but to quarrel.

A Real Issue. This is where one discovers the wide chasm separating this general election from all its predecessors, within the memory, at least of the middle-aged voters. And that is what Mr. Borden means when he rejoices that for the first time since he was called to the leadership of the Liberal Conservative party, the present federal election comes to us with a clear-cut issue. For once both parties consent to stand on common ground.

The cleavage in the Liberal ranks is one of the most remarkable features of this election, and one that holds happy auguries for the Conservative success. In all parts of the country the same story is being told far-wholedom desertions of life-long Liberals from the party. This is not to be wondered at. The greater wonder is how any elector could fail to see what such prominent Liberals as Sir George W. Ross and Sir Mortimer Clark point out, that when it comes to a matter of estimating alliances with the United States, or on the contrary a close and constant adherence to her honored place as a free and the workmen of the British Empire, how can any voter, be he as prejudiced as you please, fail to see that here is something more important than any party triumph.

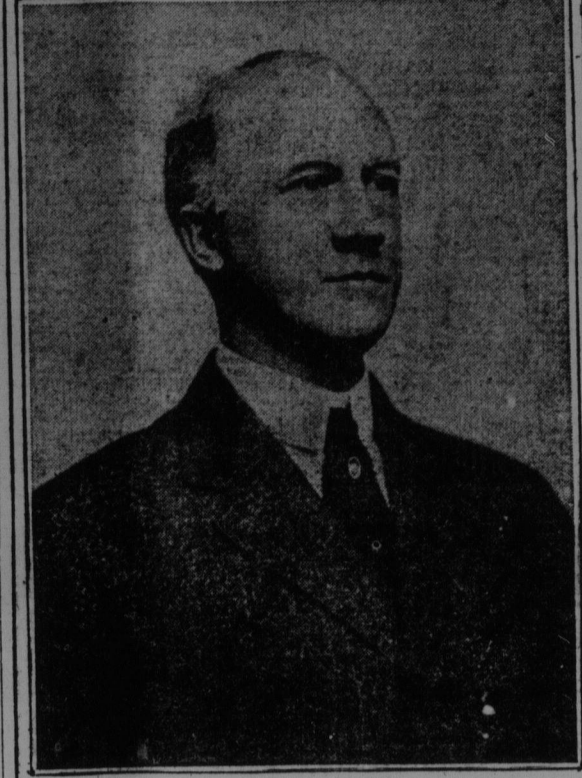

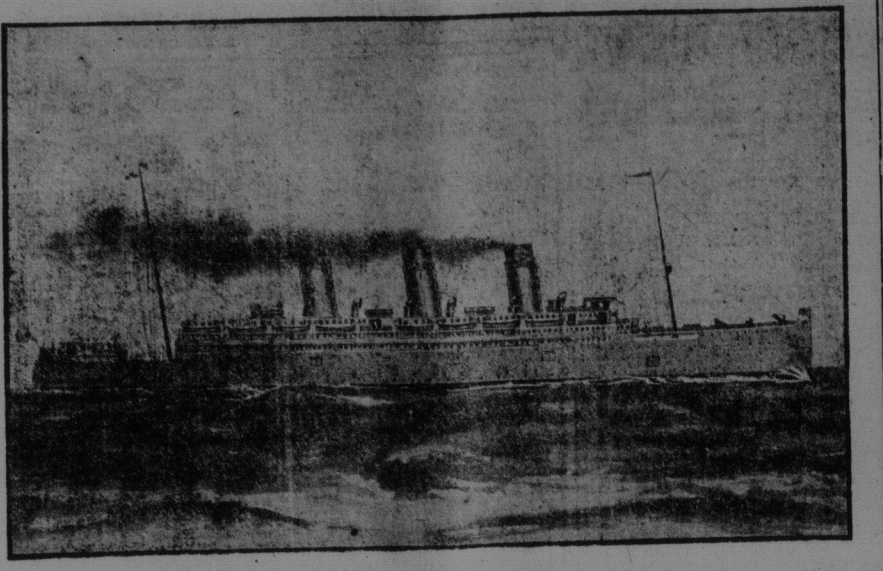
